GENERAL COMMUNICATIONS

Dr. Debra Daniels welcomed Vice President Severo Balason, Jr. to the District. After an introduction, Mr. Balason thanked Dr. Daniels and the Board for the opportunity to serve the College. He reported he has been attending meetings and has met much of the staff on campus. Mr. Balason looks forward to serving in his role.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Secretary Cole requested the minutes be amended on Item 9.A. on the Regular Board Agenda for December 14, 2016 that she regretfully declined the nomination to serve as Board President due to a recent family medical situation. On a motion by Trustee Campos, seconded by Secretary Cole and unanimously carried, the minutes of the Special Meeting held December 12, 2016 and the minutes of the Regular Meeting held December 14, 2016 as amended were approved.

PRESENTATION - Legislative Update Presented by the McCallum Group, Inc.

Mark MacDonald of the McCallum Group, Inc. provided a legislative update that included 2016 legislation and insight into possible 2017 trends, the Governor's proposed budget, and issues in 2017 through a PowerPoint presentation (copy attached to the official minutes). Discussion on legislative items included details on the following topics, to name a few:

- Veteran's Centers
- Mental Health Funding

- Promise Program
- Baccalaureate Programs

It was clarified that Veteran's Center funding is flexible and can be used for student recruiting purposes, if the District sees fit. There was discussion on the development of the Promise Program. The initial legislated funding was one-time financed and the current concern is whether the program will continue and if so where funding would come from. Board members questioned the community college Baccalaureate program and Mr. MacDonald described the program as to recent to expand due to the report of the programs progress not yet due to the state.

Mr. MacDonald gave a brief, first glimpse at the Governor's proposed budget, which will be revised and reviewed in May. This initial budget is conservative and includes a 1.48% Cost of Living Allowance (COLA), a base allocation increase of \$23.6 million for community colleges, and again no proposed student fee increase.

PRESENTATION - CCW Campus Forum Feedback Update

Primavera Arvizu, Dean of Student Success, reported feedback from the campus forum on Carry Concealed Weapon CCW through a PowerPoint presentation (copy attached to the official minutes).

PRESENTATION – CCW Campus Forum Feedback Update (Continued):

Ms. Arvizu thanked all staff involved in preparation of the forum for the work done on the project. The forum, which was recorded, was held on November 30, 2016. Feedback was collected at the forum and through email/electronic invitation; 36 employees responded. Of those who responded, 52 percent responded not in favor of an on campus concealed carry policy allowing CCW permit holders to carry on campus. Forty-seven percent responded in favor of a policy allowing CCW permit holders to carry on campus.

Trustee Michael Long spoke in favor of allowing the Superintendent/President the ability to allow CCW on campus, as the Superintendent/President sees fit. He stated he believes this is supported by the community.

President White was concerned with the low number of participants in the feedback. He encouraged the District to hold another vote to collect the voice of the campus. He also said he hoped more employees would participate in the vote.

Secretary Cole thanked staff for recording the forum, stating it made it easy for everyone to be informed. She spoke a concern with placing security responsibility burden on employees and administration if a policy allows CCW permit holders to carry on campus. She also said that there needs to be a look into overall security concerns by the Board, if there are specific concerns.

Dr. Daniels informed the Board that the information on the CCW policy, if adopted, would be open to the Freedom of Information Act. The names of approved CCW holders would be discoverable. Also, the District would be liable to track and keep training records current as well as the specific location of approved CCW holders on campus, each day.

NEW BUSINESS

Request for Approval - West Kern Community College District Annual Financial Report the Year Ended June 30, 2016 as Prepared by Vavrinek, Trine, Day & Co., LLP

Jim Nicholas, Director of Fiscal Services, presented the report from the 2015-16 audit. The audit is completed annually by a third party as required by the state of California. Vavrinek, Trine, Day & Co., Inc. gave the District an unmodified opinion, showing compliance in financial processes and procedures. It was noted by auditors that the District should work to clear short-term interfund obligations within the fiscal year. Mr. Nicholas and Mr. McMurray explained the program debts to the District and identified areas the District plans to make modifications to meet this suggestion. On a motion by Secretary Cole, seconded by Trustee Long and unanimously carried, the report as prepared by Vavrinek, Trine, Day & Co., LLP was approved (copy can be obtained in Administrative Services office).

Request for Approval – Proposition 39 Measure A General Obligation Bonds Audit Report for the Year Ended June 30, 2016 as Prepared by Vavrinek, Trine, Day & Co., LLP

Mr. Nicholas presented the audit report for the Proposition 39 Measure A General Obligation bonds. As required by California law, the District must have bond financial information audited by a third party to ensure the bond intent is upheld in its expenditures. The District received an unmodified opinion with no findings noted. President White commended staff for efforts. On a motion by Secretary Cole, seconded by Trustee Long and unanimously carried, the report on the Measure A General Obligation bonds were approved (copy can be obtained in Administrative Services office).

Request for Approval - Request to Increase Balance of WKCCD/TC Revolving Account #2

Dr. Daniels explained the intent of this revolving account was to correct payroll differences that occurred and could not be corrected in time due to the printing process with the County Office of Education. The account was created over 15 years ago. It is requested that the balance of the account be increased to meet the needs of a growing payroll in connection with wage increases and the number of staff on payroll. On a motion by Trustee Long, seconded by Trustee Orrin and unanimously carried, the request was approved.

Request for Approval – Request to Award the Gym Reroof Phase 2 Project to Lowest Bidder, Midstate Sheetmetal, Inc., \$96,544.00

Mr. McMurray said that this project would replace and/or repair the upper section and parts of the lower section of the gymnasium roof as needed. The project is funded by Deferred Maintenance funding. It is requested that the lowest bidder, Midstate Sheetmetal, Inc. be awarded the project. Mr. Jose Vargas, of AP Architects, stated the roof will have a 15 year warranty. On a motion by Trustee Campos, seconded by Secretary Cole and unanimously carried, the project was awarded to Midstate Sheetmetal, Inc. (copy attached to the official minutes).

Second Reading and Request for Approval – Updated Board Policy #7600 – Campus Security Officers

Dr. Daniels stated that Board Policy #7600 has been brought to the Board with updates as recommended by the Community College League of California. Language requires any officers that carry a firearm be trained as the law describes. On a motion by Trustee Long, seconded by Trustee Cole and unanimously carried, Board Policy #7600 as updated was approved (copy attached to the official minutes).

New legislation on Dual Enrollment requires College and Career Access Pathways (CCAP) agreements under AB 288 be presented to both the Taft College and TUHS Boards, first as informational items and in the subsequent month as an action item.

Background

Taft Union High School (TUHS) has previously partnered with West Kern Community College District (WKCCD) Concurrent Enrollment and Articulation opportunities. Recent legislation provides options for strategically restricting enrollment when appropriate and simplifying apportionment concerns. The initial Career Technical Educational pathway will be Welding courses, starting with WELD 1500-Welding Processes and INTC 1000 Career Readiness in Industrial Technology.

Recommended Action

It is recommended that the Board of Trustees for Taft College approve the CCAP agreement with TUHSD.

West Kern Community College District / Taft Union High School District College and Career Access Pathways (CCAP) Agreement

THIS AGREEMENT, made and entered into ________(enter date agreement signed), between the WEST KERN COMMUNITY COLLEGE DISTRICT hereinafter called "WKCCD" and TAFT UNION HIGH SCHOOL DISTRICT, hereinafter called the "TUHSD"; and supersedes all previous contracts and shall be valid for a period not to exceed one year, and supersedes all previous education Agreements. Specific agreement between Taft Union High School (TUHS) and Taft College (TC).

Whereas additional addendums are permits in this document as needed.

Taft College and Taft Union High School

WHEREAS TC and TUHS find it mutually beneficial to operate the courses indicated below within the TUHS boundaries to serve students identified by TUHS each party shall agree to take on the following duties and responsibilities:

- 1. TC shall be responsible for:
 - a. Providing mutually agreed upon college-level courses at Taft Union High School (TUHS).
 - i. Fall 2017 WELD 1500
 - ii. Spring 2018 INTC 1000
 - b. Selecting the faculty member to teach the course(s).
 - c. Evaluating the faculty member teaching the course(s), as per the faculty member's union master agreement.
 - d. Providing student support services to ensure proper testing, advisement, and enrollment.
 - e. Maintaining liability/property insurance coverage consistent with TC's existing coverage and limits existing throughout TC.
 - f. Holding TUHS students enrolled in the course(s) accountable to the standards for the policies and procedures of TC.

Instructional CCAP 2016

- g. Providing student performance information to the student and TUHS upon request.
- h. Collecting and submitting attendance information to TUHS in the form and manner the faculty would collect such data for submission of Full Time Equivalent Student (FTES) information to the California Community College State Chancellor's Office.
- i. Submitting FTES to California Community College Chancellor's Office as authorized by statute.
- 2. TUHS shall be responsible for:
 - a. Providing an appropriate location and instructional space for the course(s).
 - b. Maintaining liability/property insurance coverage consistent with TUHS's existing coverage and limits existing throughout TUHSD.
 - c. Supplying the faculty with the ability to properly utilize TUHSD's facilities (appropriate keys, copying, and other support which the faculty identifies to ensure student success).
 - d. Holding TUHS students enrolled in the course(s) accountable to the standards for the policies and procedures of TUHSD.
- 3. Protocols required for College and Career Access Pathways (CCAP) partnerships (California Code of Regulations, Title 5, section 76004 [AB288 Holden]):
 - a. Total number of students to be served: 20
 - Total Full-Time Equivalent Students (FTES) expected to be claimed by WKCCD: 4
 - c. Scope & nature of the courses, including applicable programs of study:
 - i. Welding courses applied as required core courses for successful completion of Associate of Science in Welding Technology, a nontransferrable degree,
 - d. Course(s), location, time, capacity

- WELD 1500, K Building, 3 unit, TUHS, 1 section, 8/14/2017 -12/22/2017, capacity 20.
- ii. INTC 1000, K Building, 3 unit, TUHS, 1 sections, 1/18/2018 5/30/2018, capacity 20.
- e. TC will require each high school student to complete the college's Concurrent High School Student Permission Form (special admit form).
- f. A part-time student participating in this CCAP Partnership Agreement may enroll in up to a maximum of 15 units per term if all of the following circumstances are satisfied:
 - i. The units constitute no more than four community college courses per term.
 - ii. The units are part of an academic program that is part of a CCAP partnership agreement.
 - iii. The units are part of an academic program that is designed to award students both a high school diploma and an associate degree or a certificate or credential.
- g. <u>Information sharing</u>: Upon signatory authorization by the high school administrator, parent/guardian, and student this form provides consent for information sharing between TC and the TUHS to include the following: Any and all admissions, registration, and grade information. Form signatories agree to notification of Family Educational Rights of Privacy Act (FERPA) regulations and limitations.
- h. <u>Parental consent:</u> Upon signatory authorization by the high school student's parent/guardian parental consent for registration and enrollment in the designated TC courses is provided.
- i. <u>Ability to benefit:</u> High school students are deemed able to benefit from TC courses as determined by the recommendation of the designated high Instructional CCAP 2016

- school administrator and/or standard TC instituted pre-requisite criteria.
- j. Facilities use: TUHS will provide adequate classroom space at its facilities, or other mutually agreed upon location to conduct the contemplated instruction and will do so without charge to TC or students. TUHS agrees to clean, maintain, and safeguard TUHS's premises. TUHS warrants that its facilities are safe and compliant with all applicable building, fire, and safety codes. Pursuant to the Williams Settlement, the TUHS Board of Trustees will pass a resolution before courses are held which exempts all campuses in the TUHS which will be used for courses under this agreement from the provisions of the Williams Settlement. The exemption form the Williams Settlement may be limited by the resolution to the time immediately before, immediately after and during the time courses are being held under the terms of this agreement.
- k. TUHS certifies that the direct education cost of the courses are not being fully funded through other sources.
- 1. TC certifies that it has not received full compensation for the direct education TC for the conduct of the course from other sources.
- m. TUHS agrees and acknowledges that all courses held under the terms of this CCAP Partnership Agreement may be restricted to students of TUHS and Buena Vista.
- n. TUHS agrees and acknowledges that WKCCD will claim apportionment for the students enrolled in courses under this agreement.
- o. TC certifies that no community college instructor teaching a course on a high school campus has been convicted of any sex offense as defined in Section 87010, or any controlled substance offense as defined in Section 87011.
- p. TC certifies that any community college instructor teaching a course at the partnering high school campus has not displaced or resulted in the termination of an existing high school teacher teaching the same course on that high school campus.

- q. TC certifies that a qualified high school teacher teaching a course offered for college credit at a high school campus has not displaced or resulted in the termination of an existing community college faculty member teaching the same course at the partnering community college campus.
- r. TC certifies that the college course(s) noted within this agreement do not reduce access to the same course offered at the partnering community college campus.
- s. TC certifies that the college course(s) noted within this agreement are not over enrolled.
- t. TC certifies that the offering of college course(s) noted within this agreement is consistent with the core mission of the community college pursuant to Section 66010.4 and that pupils participating in a CCAP partnership will not lead to enrollment displacement of otherwise eligible adults in the community college.
- u. TC certifies the community college district complies with local collective bargaining agreements and all state and federal reporting requirements regarding the qualifications of the teacher or faculty member teaching a CCAP partnership course offered for high school credit.
- v. TUHS certifies the community college complies with local collective bargaining agreements and all state and federal reporting requirements regarding the qualifications of the teacher or faculty member teaching a CCAP partnership course offered for high school credit.
- w. TC will be the employer of record for purposes of assignment monitoring and reporting to the county office of education.
- x. TC will assume reporting responsibilities pursuant to applicable federal teacher quality mandates.

Amendment #5 for Year 6, the no cost extension period, of the Agreement with University of La Verne to facilitate the STEM Pathways V Cooperative Grant through the US Department of Education.

Background:

Taft College partners with the University of La Verne in our STEM Pathways Title V Cooperative Grant through the US Department of Education. The purpose of this partnership includes: (1) STEM outreach to K-12 within the service area of the University of La Verne, (2) the use of our STEM summer research projects to train students to be query-based problem solvers that can transition well into the job market and graduate programs, and (3) the incorporation of innovative curriculum using mobile technology to enhance STEM-related laboratory programs.

Terms (if applicable):

This agreement was originally executed on November 28, 2011 between Taft College and the University of La Verne. This agreement was subsequently amended in 2012, 2013, 2014, and 2015 to reflect this on-going partnership. This agreement will once again be amended to cover performance from October 1, 2016 through September 30, 2017.

In accordance with the PERIOD OF PERFORMANCE in **Article 3** of the Original AGREEMENT, the period shall be amended and extended to reflect a new end date of September 30, 2016, unless either party serves notice of termination, or unless amended by written mutual agreement.

In accordance with the PAYMENT OF COSTS in **Article 4**, of the Original AGREEMENT, the amount of the contract shall be revised to \$1,422,042 (one million, four-hundred twenty-two thousand, forty-two), to reflect TAFT'S agreement to reimburse the expenses La VERNE incurs conducting the Title V STEM Co-Op activities. 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Scope of Work for the STEM grant -

Three areas of this grant proposal bear strong creative qualities: our outreach strategy through the GE Core Service Learning course, the use of our STEM summer research projects to train students to be query-based problem solvers that can transition well into the job market and graduate programs, and the incorporation of innovative curriculum using mobile technology to enhance our science laboratory program.

1. Service Learning Outreach

Science Squads:

Within the La Verne GE Core, all students are required to take a service-learning course. In our science-themed GE core class, students are trained to go out into local, predominantly Hispanic, high school classrooms to present engaging science lessons. The goal of these lessons is to increase student interest in STEM fields and encourage them to pursue a degree. For the Science Squad project, undergraduate students teach innovative lessons in K-12 classes that they have developed or were developed by fellow undergraduates. The lessons tackle difficult science topics/concepts - natural selection, criminal science investigations, microbial diversity, and animal and plant biodiversity. Many of the lessons address K-12 science standards, but some focus on teaching science inquiry and process. In the teaching of these lessons, the undergraduate shares their passion about science and hopefully motivates K-12 students to pursue a degree in STEM. In addition, the lessons were all developed and taught by future science teachers, so it gives our students an opportunity to see the classroom and to engage K-12 students about STEM related topics. All students are given a pre and post survey to assess their knowledge content and thoughts about science. Some/majority of these surveys are further analyzed using statistical analyses to later be presented in senior talks and/or conferences.

In the first three years of the Title V STEM grant, our undergraduate Biology teaching track majors developed 19 lessons. Five teaching track students and 40 GE class students offered lessons on topics such as genetics, evolution, cell biology, and physiology. In the fourth year of this grant, we would like to continue to purchase consumables to support existing lessons and continue outreach into school in which we have developed a close partnership.

Career and Graduate Workshop:

Summary – Through the Title V grant, the NSD has begun to sponsor a Career and Graduate Workshop for La Verne Undergraduates as well as local community college and high school students. Our goal is to bring a group of alumni and La Verne supporters from various professions and graduate programs to campus. We feel that providing our students with knowledge about programs/jobs available as well as resources and networking opportunities is important.

We will continue Career and Graduate workshop in Year 6, October 2016. We have invited alumni and professionals from 20 career fields, including genetic counseling, medicine, physical therapy, dentistry, forestry, graduate studies, and nursing.

We anticipate, two hundred students from the University of La Verne, community colleges, and local high schools.

LEAD Conference:

Summary – Last year's LEAD conference brought 1200 students, parents, teachers, counselors, and community members to La Verne's campus. The purpose of the LEAD Conference is to provide Latino families in Southern California with the knowledge and resources to make college a reality. An area that requires dramatic development in education is increasing the number of Latino's gaining access to STEM majors.

Because first-generation Latino students are often unaware of the many career opportunities in the STEM fields, in year four of the grant, we will host two STEM panels: one that illustrates various career opportunities, including science communication, health care, chemical engineering, and pharmacy, and one that highlights what high school students need to do to prepare for success in college as a STEM major. Based on last year's numbers, we anticipate six hundred people to attend each of the workshops.

2. STEM summer science camp and Research Activities

Our summer activities will continue to incorporate individualized summer research projects (one on one with La Verne faculty) for La Verne and Taft students. We will continue to purchase supplies and consumables needed by project mentors and students to conduct these research projects. Sample projects include physiology and toxicology of endemic land snails, analyzing the protective and preventative effect of food-derived antioxidants on cells subjected to specific pathophysiological conditions, environmental physiology within local moths, and identification of modifiable events in kernel endosperm PCD that will delay death and provide more time for starch accumulation in maize. The research experience provides students with educational growth opportunities not available in the classroom. Employers and graduate schools place high value on faculty-evaluated internships and community-based learning experiences, in which students demonstrate their ability to apply their learning to realworld challenges. More than two-thirds of employers believe that a faculty supervisor's assessment of a student's internship or community-based project would be very or fairly useful to them in evaluating college graduates' potential for success (Liberal Education & America's Promise: AAC&U, 2008).

The La Verne Summer Science Camp for high school students will continue in Year 4. Last year we focused on a health theme and all lessons (biology, chemistry, physics, mathematics, and computer science) and debate topics were focused around the theme. We will continue our partnership with Speech Communications and will look at another theme important for future STEM majors again this year.

3. Mobile Technology

In years 1-3, La Verne faculty have developed e-texts and materials for Calculus 3, Genetics, General Biology, non-majors biology, Cell Biology, Human Physiology, and Research Methods and Biostatistics. In year 4, continue development of mobile materials

for non-majors biology, cell biology, and developmental biology and will implement ebooks and material already developed.

4. Miscellaneous

Conferences:

Summary - As part of the grant, faculty and students have given presentations at national conferences to disseminate research and share ideas/work from the grant. In October, Drs. Garcia and Weaver will also present our STEM camp activities at the national Coalition of Metropolitan University conference. In November, Drs. Weaver, Broussard, Tsui, and Pablo Weaver will attend a national AAC&U PKAL science education meeting and present a discussion/talk on scientific inquiry at La Verne, highlighting materials from our mobile technology work. In fall and spring, Drs. Garcia and Weaver will also present student/faculty research projects at two local science conferences with students, West Coast Biological Science Undergraduate Research Conference and Southern California Conference for Undergraduate Research.

Other travel summary - In addition to conferences, we will run another field course to the Montana Field Station in year 4. Our goal is to expose students to active research in the field in areas outside of Southern California. This allows students to gain new perspectives and see an area outside of the Los Angeles Basin. The field station in Montana comprises three properties and 170 acres of land. Monies from the grant provide a portion of the gas and food costs for students and faculty going to the station. In year 4, three faculty and several students will go to Montana and work on projects related to vertebrate biodiversity and invertebrate toxicology. We would like to expand this research in year 4 by inviting two Taft students to enroll in the course.

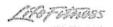

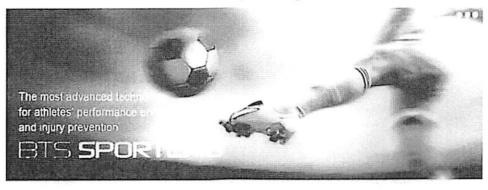

I might first mention that we requested quotes from 3 companies that work closely with the California Community College Athletic Directors Association (CCCADA). Opti-Fit is a distributor of equipment and Matrix and Hammer Strength are the manufacturers of equipment, in fact, Opti-Fit distributes Matrix equipment. As I continue my affiliation with the CCCADA, I have inquired about strength training equipment. It is the consensus of those folks that Hammer Strength is the highest quality equipment and has become the statewide standard. The quality is based upon the stability and strength of the equipment. There have been a couple of athletic directors who have expressed their disappointment with Matrix equipment breaking down. Although the breakdown was within the time of the warranty, they should not have had such issues. Also, two of the most important items of consideration when purchasing is that you are provided with very sturdy racks for the free weights and that they are rubber plated. Both of which will help in the prevention of injury.

There is an additional consideration. When comparing the equipment, we found the Opti-fit was the least ergonomically designed. The Hammer Strength equipment takes into account the interaction between the equipment and those that are using them, thus making them ergonomically designed. This helps the body to build strength and endurance while keeping the body in a state of comfort. State of comfort helps to prevent injury. They use a dual adjustable pulley system in the equipment that allows the user to define their path of motion. The dual pulley system also makes the machines more durable than other pulley systems.

Hammer Strength is a well-known brand in the fitness community. It is considered quite durable in its designs.

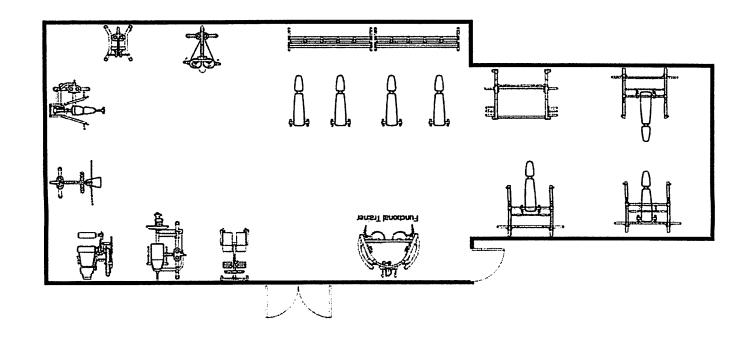

REDROCK SOFTWARE HOSTED SERVER AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT is made as of the date executed by the last party to execute this Agreement

BETWEEN:

Redrock Software Corp.

("Redrock")

AND:

Taft College

("TAFT COLLEGE")

WHEREAS:

- A. Redrock is the owner of TutorTrac, AdvisorTrac, FitnessTrac, and LabTrac (referred to as "Trac Product") which refers to scheduling and data management software developed by the Redrock;
- B. TAFT COLLEGE has already purchased a non-exclusive license to use the Trac Product and wishes to have the Redrock provide server hosting services for Trac Product; and
- C. Redrock has agreed to provide server hosting services to TAFT COLLEGE pursuant to the terms and conditions set forth in this Agreement.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises and covenants contained in this agreement, the Parties agree as follows:

1.0 DEFINITIONS

In this Agreement, the following terms shall have the following meanings:

- "Agreement" shall mean this agreement which may be amended from time to time in accordance with the provisions contained herein;
- "Confidential Information" shall mean all information disclosed by either party to the other party under this Agreement, including, without limitation, any trade secret, know-how, formula, design, prototype, compilation of information, data, program, code, method, technique or process, information relating to any product, device, customer information, financial information, marketing information, intellectual property, business opportunities or research and development, but shall not include any information that: (i) is at the time of











disclosure in the public domain, (ii) is in the possession of the receiving party prior to disclosure and was acquired from a third-party not directly or indirectly affiliated to the disclosing party, or (iii) is required to be disclosed by law;

- "Critical Problem" shall mean a problem or malfunction of Trac Product which causes the Hosted Server to crash; stops TAFT COLLEGE's processing or use of data; results in lost, destroyed or corrupted data; renders Trac Product or the Hosted Server inoperable; causes a software feature failure that cannot be avoided by alternate methods or which otherwise causes a slowdown or shutdown of the Hosted Server's essential operations;
- "Data" shall mean information, whether in oral or written (including electronic) form, created, obtained, transmitted, used, maintained, processed, and disposed of by TAFT COLLEGE and Redrock in the course of using and providing, respectively, the Hosted Server under this Agreement, and includes TAFT COLLEGE Data and Student Data;
- "Data Compromise" shall mean a security-relevant event in which the security policy of a system used to create, transmit, maintain, use, process, or store data is disobeyed or otherwise breached, and in which data is exposed to unauthorized disclosure, access, alteration, or use;
- "Date Data" shall mean computer data or input that includes an indication of date;
- "Enhancements" shall mean all present and future corrections, major modifications, additions, upgrades, variations, revisions, refinements, improvements, derivatives and enhancements to Trac Product;
- "Hosted Server" shall mean the Redrock's server:
- "Major Problem" shall mean a Critical Problem that can be avoided by alternate methods:
- "Minor Problem" shall mean a problem or malfunction of Trac Product that causes only minor inconvenience to TAFT COLLEGE including, but not limited to, report misalignments, misspelled error messages and documentation errors;
- "TAFT COLLEGE Data" shall mean credentials issued to TAFT COLLEGE by Redrock and all records related to TAFT COLLEGE's use of Redrock's Hosted Server.
- "Parties" shall mean the Redrock and TAFT COLLEGE and their respective successors or personal representatives;
- "Student Data" shall mean personal identifiers; Protected Health Information (PHI) as that term is defined in the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act, 45 CFR Part 106.103; personally identifiable information contained in student education records as that term is defined in the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA), 20 USC 1232g; non-public











personal information as that term is defined in the Gramm-Leach-Billey Financial Modernization Act of 1999, 15 USC 6809. Notwithstanding any other provision of this Agreement, service provider will be responsible for all damages, fines and corrective action arising from disclosure of such information caused by such party's breach of its data security or confidentiality provisions hereunder.

2.0 SERVICE HOSTING PROVISIONS

- 2.1 Service Hosting. Subject to the terms and conditions of this Agreement, Redrock hereby grants to TAFT COLLEGE a non-exclusive, non-transferable, limited right to electronically access the Hosted Service solely in connection with TAFT COLLEGE's use of Trac Product.
- 2.2 Non-exclusivity. The rights granted to TAFT COLLEGE under this Agreement are non-exclusive. Nothing in this Agreement shall be deemed or construed to limit, in any way, Redrock's rights to use or license the Hosted Server to others, in any manner or for any purposes during the term of this Agreement. The Hosted Server is a shared server that is also used by other customers of Redrock.
- 2.3 Access. In order to access and use the Hosted Server, TAFT COLLEGE must obtain access to the internet and pay any service fees associated with such access. In addition, TAFT COLLEGE must provide all equipment necessary to make such connection to the internet, including a computer and modem or other access device.

3.0 SUPPORT AND MAINTENANCE

- 3.1 Included Services. Redrock shall provide to TAFT COLLEGE the following support and maintenance services:
 - (a) emergency telephone assistance to respond to Critical Problems, Major Problems and Minor Problems during Standard Support Hours. The level of response will be determined by the severity level, as follows:
 - a. Critical Problems. Within two (2) hours of notification to Redrock during Standard Support Hours, Redrock will, upon verification of the Critical severity, commence resolution and make every reasonable effort to resolve Critical Problems same day.
 - b. Major Problems. Within four (4) hours of notification to Redrock during Standard Support Hours, Redrock will, upon verification of the severity level, commence resolution and make every reasonable effort to resolve Major Problems within 24 hours.
 - c. Minor Problems. Redrock will, upon verification of the severity level, log the problem and use reasonable efforts to correct Minor Problems, but does not guarantee any particular response time to initiate











resolution

(b) installation of Enhancement to the Software on a continuing basis during the term of this Agreement.

4.0 REPRESENTATIONS AND WARRANTIES

- 4.1 Redrock's Representations and Warranties. Redrock represents and warrants that:
 - (a) it is the owner of the Hosted Server and Trac Product, and has all rights and entitlement to the Hosted Service and Trac Product, and all corporate power and authority, necessary to enter into and perform its obligations under this Agreement, and will not enter into any agreements or arrangements which are in conflict with any provisions of this Agreement;
 - (b) there is no pending or threatened litigation or any other proceeding that may affect the Redrock's ability to fully perform its obligations under this Agreement;
 - (c) the Hosted Server shall have appropriate functionality for Trac Product, provided that the Hosted Server and Trac Product have been properly operated by TAFT COLLEGE;
 - the Hosted Server will function in a manner consistent with industry standards reasonably applicable to such service. Redrock further warrants that the Hosted Service, except for routine maintenance, will be operational at least 99.99% of the time in any given month during the term of this Agreement, meaning that the outage or down time percentage will not be more than .01%. In the event of a Hosted Service outage, Redrock will (i) promptly and at Redrock's expense use commercial best efforts to restore the Hosted Service as soon as possible, and (ii) unless the outage was caused by a Force Majeure event, may refund or credit TAFT COLLEGE the prorated amount of fees corresponding to the time the Hosted Service was unavailable. Neither party will be liable to the other for any failure or delay in performance under this Agreement to the extent said failures or delays are proximately caused by forces beyond that party's reasonable control, provided that the party resumes performance as soon as it is reasonably able to do so; and
 - the Hosted Server does not infringe any third-party intellectual property rights. If a third-party claim is made that the Hosted Service, in whole or in part, infringes a third-party's intellectual property rights, then in addition to any other remedies TAFT COLLEGE may have under this Agreement or the law, Redrock will, at no cost to TAFT COLLEGE, either (i) secure all necessary rights for TAFT COLLEGE to continue using the Hosted Service, (ii) modify the Hosted Server to eliminate the alleged infringement without adversely affecting the scope and level of the Hosted Server provided to











TAFT COLLEGE; or (iii) replace the Hosted Server with a non-infringing Hosted Server that otherwise meets all the requirements of this Agreement.

- 4.2 TAFT COLLEGE's Representations. TAFT COLLEGE represents and warrants that:
 - (a) it has full power and authority to enter this Agreement, can fulfill all its
 obligations under this Agreement, and has not entered, and will not enter
 into any agreements or arrangements which are in conflict with any
 provisions of this Agreement; and
 - (b) there is no pending or threatened litigation or any other proceeding that may affect TAFT COLLEGE's ability to fully perform its obligations under this Agreement.

5.0 PAYMENT

In consideration hosting service provided by Redrock to TAFT COLLEGE in this Agreement, TAFT COLLEGE shall pay to Redrock for the server hosting fee to cover March 1, 2016 to February 28, 2017. Payment shall be made in full on the date that this Agreement has been executed by both Parties and on each anniversary of this execution date thereafter for the duration of the Agreement. This is in addition to the cost of the support agreement fees.

6.0 CONFIDENTIALITY

- 6.1 Confidential Information. Each party agrees that it shall not use, disclose, or make available to third-parties any Confidential Information disclosed to it by the other party without the written authorization of the disclosing party, and further agrees that it will take all reasonable steps necessary to ensure that the Confidential Information is not disclosed to any third-parties.
- 6.2 Disclosure Required by Law. In the event that TAFT COLLEGE is required by law to disclose any portion of the Confidential Information, TAFT COLLEGE shall not be in breach of Section 6.1 provided that TAFT COLLEGE shall provide Redrock with prompt written notice of such required disclosure and shall reasonably cooperate with the Redrock, at Redrock's expense, so that Redrock may seek an appropriate court order for protection of its Confidential Information.
- 6.3 Redrock acknowledges that Student Data is protected from disclosure by federal law and agrees to keep all such data to which it has access in the performance of this agreement in a secure manner and to disclose only upon direction by TAFT COLLEGE.

7.0 COMPLIANCE WITH OPEN RECORDS LAW

Redrock understands that TAFT COLLEGE must disclose to the public upon request any records it receives from Redrock, except to the extent such

disclosures are exempted from Taft College Open Records Laws. Redrock further understands that any records obtained or generated by Redrock under this Agreement, may, under certain circumstances, be open to the public upon request under the Taft College Open Records Law. Redrock agrees to contact TAFT COLLEGE immediately upon receiving a request for information under the Open Records Law and to comply with TAFT COLLEGE's instructions on how to respond to the request. Disclosures prohibited in this agreement will be withheld to the greater extent that the law allows.

8.0 **OWNERSHIP**

It is understood and agreed that Trac Product is the sole and exclusive property of Redrock, that nothing in this agreement shall be construed so as to confer any ownership rights, title or interest in or to the Software upon TAFT COLLEGE, and that all copies of the Software in any form are and shall remain the exclusive property of Redrock.

TERM AND TERMINATION 9.0

Term. This Agreement commences on the date of installation and continues for 9.1 one year unless sooner terminated in accordance with this Agreement. TAFT COLLEGE has the option to renew for successive one-year terms (each, a "Renewal Term") for a period of 1 year upon thirty (30) days written notice of renewal prior to the end of the Initial Term or Renewal Term, as the case may be.

9.2 General Termination.

- (a) Each party shall have the right to terminate this Agreement at any time upon the provision of three months' written notice to the other party.
- Each party shall have the right to terminate this Agreement, with immediate effect upon written notice to the other party, if the other party breaches any of the provisions in this Agreement and fails to cure such breach within thirty days after receipt of notice by the party not in breach;
- TAFT COLLEGE may terminate this Agreement effective on delivery of written notice to Redrock, or on any later date stated in the notice, if funding from federal, state, or other sources is not obtained and continued at levels sufficient to allow for the purchase of the commodities or services provided for in this Agreement, if federal or state laws or rules are modified or interpreted in a way that the services or commodities are no longer allowable or appropriate for purchase under this Agreement or no longer eligible for the funding proposed for payment of this Agreement, or if any license, permit, or certificate required by law or rule, or the terms of this Agreement, is for any reason denied, revoked, suspended, or not renewed.
- Automatic Termination. This Agreement shall automatically terminate upon 9.3 the occurrence of Redrock's ceasing to carry on business, insolvency,











bankruptcy, dissolutions, liquidations, winding up, or upon the commencement of any steps or passing of any resolution which, in the opinion of TAFT COLLEGE acting reasonably, is intended to accomplish such ends.

- 9.4 Surviving Provisions. Notwithstanding the termination of this Agreement, the Parties agree that the provisions contained in Section 4.0 and Sections 6.0 through 19.0 of this Agreement shall survive and remain in force.
- 10.0 GENERAL
- 10.1 Choice of Law and Venue. This Agreement shall be governed and interpreted in accordance with the laws of the State of California. Any action to enforce this Agreement must be adjudicated exclusively in the State District Court. TAFT COLLEGE does not agree to any form of binding arbitration, mediation, or other forms of mandatory alternative dispute resolution. The Parties have the right to enforce their rights and remedies in judicial proceedings. TAFT COLLEGE does not waive any right to a jury trial.
- 10.2 Relationship of Parties. No agency, partnership, joint venture, employeeemployer or franchiser-franchisee relationship is intended or created by this Agreement.
- 10.3 Entire Agreement. This Agreement sets forth the entire understanding and agreement between the Parties with respect to the subject matter hereof, and the Parties agree that they have not relied on any representations, warranties, promises or other inducements in entering into this Agreement.
- 10.4 Waiver. The failure of either party to act with respect to any breach of this Agreement by the other party thereof shall in no way operate as a waiver to the right to act with respect to any subsequent or similar breaches.
- 10.5 Notice. Any notice to Redrock may be given by personal delivery, registered mail or facsimile to its offices located at:

Any notice to TAFT COLLEGE may be given by personal delivery, registered mail, facsimile, or electronic mail to its offices located at:

Each party shall provide notice of any change in their contact information prior to such change taking effect. All notices shall be deemed to be received upon the earlier of the party's actual receipt or two days after dispatch.

- 10.6 Severability. If any provision of this Agreement is invalid or otherwise incapable of being enforced, that provision shall be deemed to be severable from this Agreement, and all other provisions of this Agreement shall remain in full force and effect.
- 10.7 Assignment, Amendment, Currency. TAFT COLLEGE shall not assign this Agreement without the prior written approval of Redrock, which consent may be withheld by Redrock in its sole discretion. Redrock shall not assign this Agreement without the prior written approval of TAFT COLLEGE, which consent may be withheld by TAFT COLLEGE in its sole discretion. This Agreement may be amended only by a written document duly executed by authorized signatories of the parties hereto. All references to currency will be in American dollars (\$USD).
- 10.8 State Audit. All records, regardless of physical form, and the accounting practices and procedures of Redrock relevant to this Agreement are subject to examination by the Taft College State Auditor or the Auditor's designee. Redrock shall maintain all of these records for at least three (3) years following completion of this Agreement.

11.0 RIGHTS IN AND TO STUDENT DATA AND TAFT COLLEGE DATA

The Parties agree that as between them, all rights in and to Student Data and TAFT COLLEGE Data shall remain the exclusive property of TAFT COLLEGE. This Agreement does not give a party any rights, implied or otherwise, to the other party's data, content or intellectual property, except as expressly stated in this Agreement.

12.0 DATA PRIVACY

Redrock will use Student Data and TAFT COLLEGE Data only for the purpose of fulfilling its duties under this Agreement and for TAFT COLLEGÉ's sole











benefit, and will not share such data with or disclose it to any third-party without the prior written consent of TAFT COLLEGE or as otherwise required by law. By way of illustration and not of limitation, Redrock will not use such data for Redrock's own benefit and, in particular, will not engage unauthorized access to or disclosure or use of Student Data or TAFT COLLEGE Data, whether through automated or human means, except as specifically and expressly required by law or authorized in writing by TAFT COLLEGE.

- B. All Student Data and TAFT COLLEGE Data will be stored on servers ocated solely within the Continental United States.
- C. Redrock will provide access to Student Data and TAFT COLLEGE Data to only those Redrock employees and subcontractors who need to access the data to fulfill Redrock's obligations under this Agreement. Redrock will ensure that employees who perform work under this Agreement have read, understood, and received appropriate instruction as to how to comply with the data protection provisions of this Agreement, and have undergone all background screening and possess all qualifications appropriate to the nature of the employees' duties and the sensitivity of the data they will be handling, prior to being granted access to the Data.

13.0 DATA SECURITY

- A. All facilities used to store and process Student Data and TAFT COLLEGE Data will employ commercial best practices, including appropriate administrative, physical, and technical safeguards, to secure such data from unauthorized access, disclosure, alteration, and use. Such measures will be no less protective than those used to secure Redrock's own data of a similar type, and in no event less than reasonable in view of the type and nature of the data involved. Without limiting the foregoing, Redrock warrants that all Student Data and TAFT COLLEGE Data will be encrypted in transmission (including via web interface) at no less than 128-bit level encryption.
- B. Redrock will use industry-standard and up-to-date security tools and technologies such as anti-virus protections and intrusion detection methods in providing the Hosted Service under this Agreement.
 - C. Redrock represents and warrants that:
 - (i) Unless requested and paid for by TAFT COLLEGE, it may, within its discretion, and at its own expense, conduct or have conducted at least annually, an assessment from an established, accredited vendor; a letter attesting as to the security infrastructure should be provided to TAFT COLLEGE
 - (ii) It will, at its own expense, conduct regularly, internal reviews of systems to maintain the highest levels of security and integrity that are used in any way to deliver the Hosted Server under this Agreement; and
 - (iii) It may, at its own expense, conduct or have conducted at least











annually, a formal penetration test of its systems and facilities that are used in any way to deliver the Hosted Server under this Agreement.

- D. Redrock will provide TAFT COLLEGE upon request the results of the above, scans and tests, and will promptly modify its security measures as needed based on those results in order to meet its obligations under this Agreement.
- E. Redrock will comply with all applicable laws, Taft College policies and TAFT COLLEGE policies regarding electronic devices, services, and storage and manipulation of confidential data.

14.0 DATA INTEGRITY

Redrock will take commercially reasonable measures, including regular data integrity audits, to protect Student Data and TAFT COLLEGE Data against deterioration or degradation of data quality and authenticity.

15.0 RESPONSE TO LEGAL ORDERS, DEMANDS OR REQUESTS FOR DATA

- A. Except as otherwise expressly prohibited by law, Redrock will:
- (i) Immediately notify TAFT COLLEGE of any subpoenas, warrants, or other legal orders, demands or requests received by Redrock seeking Student Data and/or TAFT COLLEGE Data;
 - (ii) consult with TAFT COLLEGE regarding its response;
- (iii) cooperate with TAFT COLLEGE's reasonable requests in connection with efforts by TAFT COLLEGE to intervene and quash or modify the legal order, demand or request; and
- (iv) upon TAFT COLLEGE's request, provide TAFT COLLEGE with a copy of its response.
- B. If TAFT COLLEGE receives a subpoena, warrant, or other legal order, demand or request seeking Student Data and/or TAFT COLLEGE Data maintained by Redrock, TAFT COLLEGE will promptly provide a copy to Redrock. Redrock will promptly supply TAFT COLLEGE with copies of data required for TAFT COLLEGE to respond, and will cooperate with TAFT COLLEGE's reasonable requests in connection with its response.

16.0 DATA COMPROMISE RESPONSE

A. Immediately upon becoming aware of a Data Compromise, or of circumstances that could have resulted in unauthorized access to or disclosure or use of Student Data or TAFT COLLEGE Data, Redrock will notify TAFT COLLEGE, fully nvestigate the incident, and cooperate fully with TAFT COLLEGE's investigation of and response to the incident. Except as otherwise required by law, Redrock will not provide notice of the incident directly to the persons whose data were involved, regulatory











agencies, or other entities, without prior written permission from TAFT COLLEGE.

- B. Notwithstanding any other provision of this Agreement, and in addition to any other remedies available to TAFT COLLEGE under law or equity, Redrock will reimburse TAFT COLLEGE in full for all reasonable costs incurred by TAFT COLLEGE in investigation and remediation of such Data Compromise, including but not limited to providing notification to third-parties whose data was compromised and to regulatory agencies or other entities as required by law or contract; the offering of 12 months' credit monitoring to each person whose data were compromised; and the payment of legal fees, audit costs, fines, and other fees imposed by regulatory agencies or contracting partners as a result of the Data Compromise.
- C. Unauthorized Disclosure. Redrock shall report, either orally or in writing, to TAFT COLLEGE of any use or disclosure of data not authorized by this Agreement or in writing by TAFT COLLEGE, including any reasonable belief that an unauthorized individual has accessed the data. Redrock shall make the report to TAFT COLLEGE immediately upon discovery of the unauthorized disclosure, but in no event more than two (2) business days after the service provider reasonably believes there has been such unauthorized use or disclosure. Redrock's report shall identify: (i) the nature of the unauthorized use or disclosure, (ii) TAFT COLLEGE data used or disclosed, (iii) who made the unauthorized use or received the unauthorized disclosure, (iv) what Redrock has done or shall do to mitigate any deleterious effect of the unauthorized use or disclosure, and (v) what corrective action service provider has taken or shall take to prevent future similar unauthorized use or disclosure. Service provider shall provide such other information, including a written report, as reasonably requested by TAFT COLLEGE.

17.0 DATA RETENTION AND DISPOSAL

- A. Redrock will use commercially reasonable efforts to retain Data for a minimum of three years.
- B. Using appropriate and reliable storage media, Redrock will regularly back up Student Data and TAFT COLLEGE Data and retain such backup copies for a minimum of three years. At the end of that time period and at TAFT COLLEGE's election, Redrock will either securely destroy or transmit to TAFT COLLEGE's repository the backup copies. Upon TAFT COLLEGE's request, Redrock will supply TAFT COLLEGE with a certificate indicating the records destroyed, the date destroyed, and the method of destruction used.
- C. Redrock will immediately place a "hold" on the destruction under its usual records retention policies of records that include Student Data and TAFT COLLEGE Data, in response to an oral or written request from TAFT COLLEGE indicating that those records may be relevant to litigation that TAFT COLLEGE reasonable anticipates. Oral requests by TAFT COLLEGE for a hold on record destruction will be reduced to writing and supplied to Redrock for its records as soon as reasonably practicable under the circumstances. TAFT COLLEGE will promptly coordinate with Redrock regarding the preservation and disposition of these records. Redrock shall continue to preserve











the records until further notice by TAFT COLLEGE.

18.0 DATA TRANSFER UPON TERMINATION OR EXPIRATION

- A. Upon termination or expiration of this Agreement, Redrock will ensure that all Student Data and TAFT COLLEGE Data is securely transferred to TAFT COLLEGE or a third-party designated by TAFT COLLEGE, within a reasonable period of time, and without significant interruption in service. Redrock will ensure that such migration uses facilities and methods that are compatible with the relevant systems of the transferee, and to the extent technologically feasible, that TAFT COLLEGE will have reasonable access to Student Data and TAFT COLLEGE Data during the transition.
- B. Redrock will notify TAFT COLLEGE of impending cessation of its business and any contingency plans in the event of notice of such cessation. This includes immediate transfer of any Data. Redrock shall implement its exit plan take all necessary actions to ensure a smooth transition of service with minimal disruption to TAFT COLLEGE.
- C. The parties agree that on the termination of services, Redrock shall, at the choice of TAFT COLLEGE, return all the personal data transferred and the copies thereof to TAFT COLLEGE or shall destroy all the personal data and certify to TAFT COLLEGE that it has done so. Redrock will also provide copies of all data generated related to TAFT COLLEGE annually.

19.0 NO DRAFTING PRESUMPTION

The Parties agree that the terms of this Agreement were mutually negotiated and shall not be construed either in favor or against either of them by virtue of the extent of their involvement in preparing this Agreement.

- 6. <u>Customer's Right to Provide Information</u>. Customer represents and warrants to Consultant that it has the right to provide the information that will be given by Customer to Consultant, or which will be acquired by Consultant pursuant to paragraphs 4 and 5 above.
- 7. <u>Limitation on Services</u>. Customer understands that Customer retains sole authority and responsibility for the operation and design of all Customer's employee benefit plans.
- 8. Ownership of Systems and Materials. All systems, programs, operating instructions, forms and other documentation prepared by or for Consultant shall be and remain the property of Consultant. All data source documents provided by Customer shall remain the property of Customer.

10. General.

If Consultant receives a non-refundable deposit from Customer of \$2,790 by March 31, 2017, all amounts shown above shall be reduced by 10%.

These investments are not included in the District's Investment Portfolio, which is managed by Wells Fargo Investments and Morgan Stanley Smith Barney. Attached is a summary of the investments held at <u>U.S. Bank Global Corporate Trust Services and The Bank of New York Mellon</u>. This represents a summary of activity for the period of July 1, 2016 through December 31, 2016. Investments were held at these two institutions as part of the Districts General Obligation Bonds and/or Certificate of Participation (COP) Notes Program. This provided an investment vehicle for WKCCD to be used in conjunction with its construction programs and building on campus. This information is being submitted for informational purposes only.

Terms (if applicable): July 1, 2016 - December 31, 2016

Expense (if applicable): Not Applicable

Fiscal Impact Including Source of Funds (if applicable):

The <u>U.S. Bank Global Corporate Trust Services</u> accounts had a beginning balance of \$28,893,514 at July 1, 2016, and an ending balance of \$1,896,603 for its Certificates of Participation accounts, reflecting a decrease of (\$26,996,911) for the period just ended. The use of these funds represents the prepaying of the 2008 certificates in full. The \$1,896,603 remaining represents the required insurance policy value tied to the 2015 certificates of participation issued.

At July 1, 2016, the <u>Bank of New York Mellon</u> had a beginning balance of \$18,520,409 in the accounts tied to the District's general obligation bonds. At December 31, the accounts had a total balance of \$0.02. This use of these funds represents payments made per the terms of the 2015 refunding of the District's general obligation bonds.
