Consultant Dr. Will Lewallen, Community College Search Services, stated that the Search Committee roster was set per previous Board decision methods. There was discussion on the inclusion of a Board member on the Search Committee. Dr. Lewallen stated that it is normal practice to have a member on the Search Committee. He further explained that one member of the Board does not complicate the Search Committee process and it was noted by Trustee Cole that it had been past WKCCD practice as well. The Board asked for a trustee to be added. Secretary Orrin nominated President White, who was seconded by Trustee Cole and unanimously approved. On a motion by Trustee Cole, seconded by Trustee Eveland and unanimously approved, the Search Committee roster with the addition of President White was approved.

# B. Request for Approval – Superintendent/President Position Profile/Announcement

Dr. Lewallen reported details from the survey and the townhall held on the development of the position profile/announcement. The draft as it is now includes changes from the feedback received. There was discussion to suggest the deadline for initial application review to be changed to "submit no later than January 5, 2024." This change will work with the application system to maintain deadline integrity. On a motion by Trustee Cole, seconded by Secretary Orrin and unanimously approved, the announcement was approved with the suggested edit.

# Background:

The goal is to prepare a new 10-Year Comprehensive Educational Master Plan in compliance with the requirements outlined in RFP 2324-111. The District reviewed proposals from qualified consultants through a competitive bidding process. Proposals were submitted from the firms listed below.

- 1. Collaborative Brain Trust RECOMMENDED
- 2. Gray Associates, Inc.
- 3. Kennedy & Company Education Strategies LLC

An evaluation committee reviewed the received proposals and selected two proposers for interview. The committee scored each one using RFP rubrics. 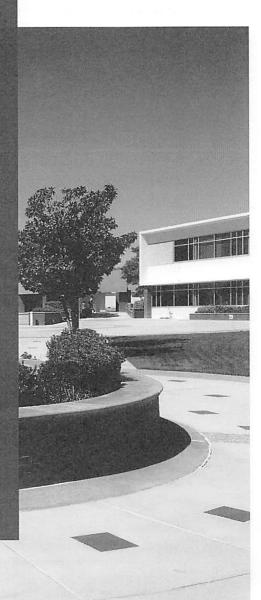

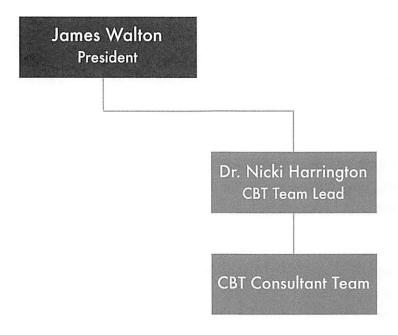

# Our Approach

CBT believes that meaningful, broad-based collaboration is essential to the success of any educational master plan. The following work plan has been designed with this in mind, providing avenues for input, insight, and guidance from many stakeholder groups, including students and external parties. The alignment of the plan with the mission, vision and core values of Taft College is imperative for the future validity of the plan. The project must synthesize and build upon any College planning efforts the last few years, rather than duplicating them, to avoid constituent "planning fatigue." Also critical is that the plan be designed in a manner that leads to the establishment of outcomes, metrics, and strategies for immediate implementation. The plan should incorporate initiatives in progress (Guided Pathways, Student Equity Plan, and more), and be synthesized in an integrated manner with transfer pathway efforts, including the great work already underway at the College's Transfer Center. This will ensure that multiple planning efforts do not remain in silos, but are merged for an integrated, holistic approach in advancing the College and its ongoing focus on student equity, utilizing a strong, collective representation of student voices on campus.

CBT recognizes that Taft College is in its 101st year of operation. In becoming the next version of Taft College, the College further strengthens its focus on equity, diversity and student success, with accountability across the organization. Concurrently, the College is experiencing additional transitions. These include not only the slow population growth in the region, changing socioeconomic factors, and the need for the College to meet these needs, but also the future of classroom format and hybrid work. During the project we will witness new ways of life and new needs arising from students, staff, and faculty. CBT is quite familiar and comfortable with colleges in transition, and will build strategies into project activities to support these transitions throughout the process.

Central to the EMP is its attention to the changing Taft area. Data analysis must occur at the macro level, but also be disaggregated to plan effectively for the various needs across the College's service area in both technology and facilities master planning for the future. The project will use existing program reviews, environmental scans, and foundational data sets, and planning priorities identified in the most recent 2021 ACCJC Review; it will also acquire updated data where needed. The analysis and synthesis of data will result in the plan representing a planned growth approach, and responsive educational services that are both high-quality and efficient in their operations to serve the diverse community within limited resources. The design of the work plan for this project incorporates these important facets for Taft College.

# Work Plan

CBT believes that stakeholder involvement throughout the project is imperative. We believe in integrated planning and this project provides an opportunity to integrate existing planning efforts at Taft College. While College leadership and the Steering Committee work closely with the CBT team on its development, input from the many Taft College constituents is encouraged for optimal inclusiveness during plan development. Throughout the project, drafts of individual sections of the plan will be produced and shared with the Steering Committee and College for review and refinement. This allows stakeholders an opportunity for feedback throughout each step in the planning process. CBT's goal is that students, faculty, staff and other constituents have multiple opportunities and venues through which to offer input and feedback for the plan. When the final draft of the plan is released, engaged stakeholders will have already seen much of the plan.

During the kick-off meetings at the beginning of Phase One, the work plan, and tasks to be accomplished, will be addressed in a consultative process with the College leadership to ensure that (a) the project scope is accomplished vis-à-vis the work plan, (b) the project is in alignment with Taft College's culture, mission, and the College leadership's vision and direction, (c) the CBT Team's approach and work plan is in alignment with the Board's strategic priorities and existing Taft College planning efforts, (d) work is not unnecessarily repeated that has already been conducted by the College, Lightcast (EMSI/Burning Glass) and others, and (e) collegial / participatory governance structures and appropriate stakeholders have been included in the work plan. This collaborative process during project kick-off is critical to the success of the project. Included in the kick-off dialogue sessions will be the following key areas:

- Efforts needed to ensure inclusion of all appropriate stakeholders (internal, external, and students),
   including those perhaps traditionally marginalized
- Factors important to the project's authenticity, legitimacy, and consistency across the College as the project progresses
- Information and Communication pathways and touchpoints to ensure project transparency and to maximize engagement and participation by all, including students
- Clarity on enrollment timeframe targets, data needed for enrollment projections, and an acceptable approach / model for such
- Processes for the assessment of current instructional programs and support services in collaboration with the College, utilizing existing program review and participatory governance structures
- Alignment of developing the EMP and enrollment forecasts with existing and future facilities and technology plans, and elements necessary in the plan to inform long-range planning of these and other infrastructure plans
- Exploratory approaches that provide equal attention to transfer and career-technical educational opportunities, and that connect students to each in an equitable fashion via existing and innovative pathways/programs
- Priorities for the plan content to result in a comprehensive and concise intentional, ten-year plan, integrating Strategic Directions and Goals, and providing a foundation for an actionable implementation plan with timelines, benchmarks, and performance measures
- Other areas and/or approaches needed during the project to maximize stakeholder endorsement and Board approval upon its conclusion

The project is expected to commence November 2023 and conclude June 2024, with planned review and consideration for adoption by the Board of Trustees at that time. This timeline includes 5-6 working months, while acknowledging that the Fall holiday breaks can be used by the CBT team to analyze data gathered while many faculty and employee groups are not on campus (in-person or remote). CBT is amenable to working out the most suitable timeline for this project at kick-off and adjusting as needed; the proposed timeline is provided later in this document. CBT will work with the College executive lead/ liaison and Steering Committee to ensure alignment with College review processes. An overview of the key steps in the work plan are described in the following sections and will be refined at the kick-off meetings.

# Phase 1: Discovery: Data Collection, Analysis, Synthesis

# Task A: Initial Kick-Off and Orientation Meetings

Pre-kick-off conversations will be held with the College President, President's Cabinet, the designated executive lead/liaison for the project, and the Vice President, Information and Institutional Effectiveness to clarify project vision, scope, and data needs. Additional conversations will be held as needed to ensure achievement of desired outcomes for the project.

Kick-off and orientation meetings will be held with College leadership (executive staff, Academic Senate leadership, etc.) and the Steering Committee to address the following items:

- 1. Discuss and articulate the educational philosophy of the College as it relates to the EMP and integrated planning
- 2. Provide an overview of the project, including project scope, phases, timeline, approach, and deliverables
- 3. Review organizational decision-making structures related to planning
- 4. Identify / confirm the following:
  - College executive lead/liaison for the project
  - Steering committee name, charge, participants who will serve on the committee, and the meeting schedule
  - Logistics person (usually the Executive lead/liaison's assistant) with whom the CBT Team Lead shall work for project logistics (scheduling meetings, room reservations and set-up, distributing materials, etc.)
- 5. Confirm the current mission, vision, and values of the College and any updates needed
- 6. Determine / clarify nomenclature for College Strategy, Strategic Directions, Goals, Objectives, actions, etc. to be used in the EMP
- 7. Review, revise, and approve the draft EMP Table of Contents
- 8. Establish the project timeline & schedule including remote and on-site campus meetings and forums

# Task A: Initial Kick-Off and Orientation Meetings (continued)

- 9. Identify student groups and internal and external stakeholders for interviews / listening sessions to promote engagement and minimize marginalization of any groups / constituents
- 10. Determine the institutional data and evidence needed for a "Data Portfolio" to be used to provide effective support for all the components of institutional planning, including program review; identify existing and additional data needed for the project
- 11. Identify existing staff and student survey data available for inclusion in the Data Portfolio
- 12. Establish communications protocols for the project including a College internal webpage (intranet) for posting monthly updates and draft documents for broad and transparent stakeholder access
- 13. For the Data Portfolio, define the College's service area, identify comparable colleges, and agree upon the time horizon for analysis, selecting which past semesters' data will be used for analysis
- 14. Confirm final deliverable:
  - Taft College Educational Master Plan 2025-2035, per the agreed-upon Table of Contents
  - Suggestions of format, graphics, and photos for the College's production process
  - Final Report and recommendations, including a recommended actionable Implementation Plan

# Task B: External and Internal Scans; Workforce and Economic Analysis

- 1. Consultant will collect and analyze necessary data, including institutional planning documents
- 2. College will receive a draft of the scans this can be circulated for feedback from stakeholders
- 3. Consultant will identify and discuss with the committee trends, themes, and conclusions from the data
- 4. Consultant will include such data as the following in the Data Portfolio:

#### External scan data and information:

- College service area resident statistics, including an analysis of the current and projected population; age, race/ethnicity, language spoken at home, income, proximity to the campus, economic conditions
- Local high school data and trends
- Regional educational institutions, including feeder K-12 schools, nearby community colleges, and prevalent transfer institutions for graduates
- Projected workforce needs and economic development potential

#### Internal scan data and information:

- Current students: status, educational goals, demographics, and achievements
- Student success data such as course completion, success, retention and persistence rates, program completion, transfer rates
- Historical and current student participation rates
- Disaggregated student data as available for analysis of achievement gaps
- Faculty and staff numbers and demographics
- Existing and/or additional survey data provided by the College (staff and /or student surveys)

# Task C: Stakeholder Input and Listening Sessions

- 1. Approximately 15 interviews and "listening sessions" will be held with the following individuals and groups:
  - Students
  - President's Cabinet and EMP Steering Committee
  - Internal stakeholders / constituents
  - External stakeholders (educational, business, industry, and community partners)
- 2. Robust engagement is an expectation of this task in the project in order to garner broad input and support an authentic process that reflects the College community. Steering committee members will be asked to assist in encouraging their constituents to attend listening sessions.
- 3. Key themes that emerge from the listening sessions will be summarized by the Consultant team and provided to the committee for review and discussion

- 1. Analyze the data portfolio created, which will serve as the basis of information that will be used to gain consensus for further tasks of the project

# Task E: Planning Assumptions & Growth Projections

- 1. Identify planning assumptions based on data collected
- 2. Utilize the external and internal scans and participation rate analysis, to develop an enrollment projection for the EMP (this enrollment forecast will be refined in consultation with the College)
- 3. Analyze program data on enrollment, completion, and transfer rates; make recommendations for optimizing College efficiency and self-sustainability
- 4. Provide a high-level SWOT analysis and identify challenges and opportunities for the ten-year plan

# Task F: Strategic Directions, Goals, and Recommendations

- 1. Conduct interactive goal-setting session. With the experience of dozens of planning projects, CBT has learned many different effective ways to develop goals and recommendations. Usually, it is a collaborative workshop in one long day, or spread over two days, which is highly engaging and productive. Feedback from CBT's client colleges has been very positive and has helped CBT hone this workshop. The CBT team will work with the College at the beginning stages and throughout the project to determine the best methods to achieve the desired outcome of an EMP with integrated Strategic Directions and Goals, and forward-thinking for the next ten years and beyond. Session participants will include the CBT Team and all Steering Committee members; students and/or others may be added as deemed appropriate in planning the session.
- 2. Provide relevant documents to session participants prior to the session to ensure equal positions of knowledge for the planning workshop. In addition, an agenda will be shared to set expectations, as well as give stakeholders as much time as possible to think about their contributions to the process.
- 3. Ensure interactive, engaging exercises utilizing Discovery Phase findings, including:
  - Trends and planning assumptions from internal and external data
  - Program review results and enrollment projections
  - Listening session themes and their implications for future planning
  - Challenges and opportunities for the College identified in the SWOT analysis
- 4. Develop Draft Strategic Directions and Goals to be shared with College stakeholders for comment and feedback to the Steering Committee for review and consideration for the final draft plan
- 5. Integrate the Strategic Directions and Goals into the final draft, including next steps and recommendations for plan implementation and monitoring



# Task G: Debriefing Meetings with Leadership Groups

- 1. Regular debriefing meetings will be held with the College executive lead/liaison, the Steering Committee Chair(s), and the President's Cabinet
- 2. CBT has a deep understanding of participatory governance; additional debriefing meetings can be held with other groups, as needed, during the project site visits (these will be coordinated with the College executive lead/liaison)

# Task H: Review/Revise/Delivery of Final Documents

- 1. CBT's planning philosophy is to deliver draft documents to the Steering Committee as sections of the plan are developed. These can then be posted on the College intranet for constituent review and feedback to the committee.
- 2. When the draft plan is completed, the Steering Committee and College stakeholder groups will have already had opportunities to review and comment on nearly all of the content.
- 3. A campus-wide open forum can be conducted by the Steering Committee if desired to review the draft plan and to ensure all remaining stakeholders have an opportunity to comment on the components of the final draft, make suggestions, and hear the vision for how the plan will be put into place.
- 4. An implementation plan will be recommended by the CBT team in order for Taft College to have a blueprint for actionable next steps after the final delivery and approval of the plan.
- 5. The final Draft Plan Document will be provided via the agreed-upon timeline to the College, which will then carry out formal participatory governance approval, production, and adoption processes by the College and Board of Trustees.

# College Provided Services & Information

Data is the seminal element in developing this plan. Both quantitative and qualitative data will serve to frame an objective, collaborative dialogue about new and existing academic and academic support programs and services. These data sets will include trends in the College's service area population and employment; enrollment trends and projections; facilities utilization and future space needs, and program reviews of academic and academic support programs and services. Any recent staff and student survey data, as well as additional data on workforce trends, community visions (cities and counties), and gap analyses will be included.

A list of required data items will be provided at the start of the project. The data will need to be delivered quickly in order to determine additional data to be acquired for the project. Following is a list of initial data-related items needed by the consulting team in the first few weeks of the project:

- Agreement on the most recent semester's data to be used (probably Fall 2022)
- Agreement on a past fall semester to commence trend analysis (could be Fall 2020 for a three-year trend, or a semester before the "great recession" for a longer view)
- Student enrollment by zip code (Fall 2023)
- Agreement on the definition of the College's service area, and areas to be disaggregated
- Delivery of internal scan data, and acknowledgement that the Consultant will use any data assets available on the State's website (if applicable)
- Student success, retention, persistence, completion, and transfer data
- Staff and student data disaggregated for equity and achievement gap analyses
- Program Review results for all academic, and non-academic programs and services (through the most recent full cycle of reviews)
- Definition of the regional labor market (e.g., Taft region and beyond)
- Internal and external stakeholder groups to be convened for interviews and listening sessions
- Results of recent surveys conducted (e.g., ACT, CCSSE, internal staff and student surveys, etc.)
- Consensus on any campus forums and/or student focus sessions to be conducted

# Additional Information

For CBT, innovation is at the core of institutional planning, since its purpose is to facilitate new ideas and new ways of doing things, so as to transform an institution over time. CBT team members, for example, when conducting meetings and interviews, may refer to them as "listening" sessions, to encourage a free flow of ideas. In forums and workshops facilitators will make it a point to encourage informality and to recognize the enjoyment, as well as the work, involved in developing ideas and creating solutions. CBT Team members have extensive experience in community colleges, are deeply committed to their mission, and are passionate advocates for the success of each student. This is at the heart of all institutional planning.

CBT team members, in framing a collaborative dialogue, will also build on the innovative approaches Taft College's leadership has already used to gather ideas and create solutions. The consultants will encourage participants to incorporate a futuristic mindset related to both existing programs and services and new educational opportunities related to transfer, career/technical, foundational skills, and lifelong learning. CBT will also encourage planning participants to think about future advances in technology and pedagogy, to think about the region as a whole and the unique needs of the communities served, and to engage in thought leadership for the future.

CBT team members will gather a wide range of quantitative and qualitative data to frame an objective, collaborative dialogue as a basis for the college community to develop ideas and plans. These data sets include not only trends in service area population, employment and enrollment trends, but other metrics related to regional, state, and national developments in employment and education which CBT researchers recognize as helpful in developing Taft College's plan. Participants will also be encouraged to reflect on planning efforts and community visions across the region, as well as changing demographics and societal changes that may affect the College in the future.



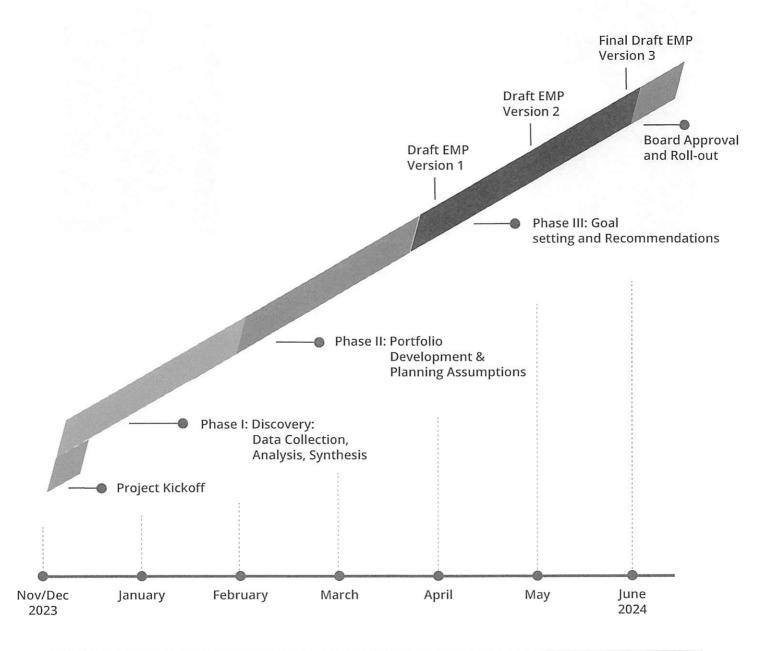
Given that old jobs disappear and new ones arise within a relatively short time span, and recognizing how difficult it is to predict which new jobs will emerge five to ten years out, CBT will encourage planning participants to think about new ways to strengthen students' skills that span the curriculum and transcend careers, including critical thinking, creativity, problem solving, and entrepreneurship. CBT will also encourage participants to consider how education can address future sustainability and survival, in terms, for example, of the wise use of resources.

CBT recognizes that community colleges are influenced and impacted by state, federal, and societal issues and demands. These external forces will be incorporated into collaborative, forward-thinking sessions to enhance the effectiveness of the resulting EMP in both maximizing resources and serving students and communities in the region in the best possible fashion.

To ensure maximum transparency and participation throughout the planning process, CBT, in addition to interviews and dialogue sessions, will encourage the development of an internal College webpage that will provide up-to-date information about progress of the plan, including drafts of plans as they are developed. This webpage will also encourage the college community to continuously provide feedback and suggestions to their representatives on the steering committee to keep the process vibrant and strengthen the results.

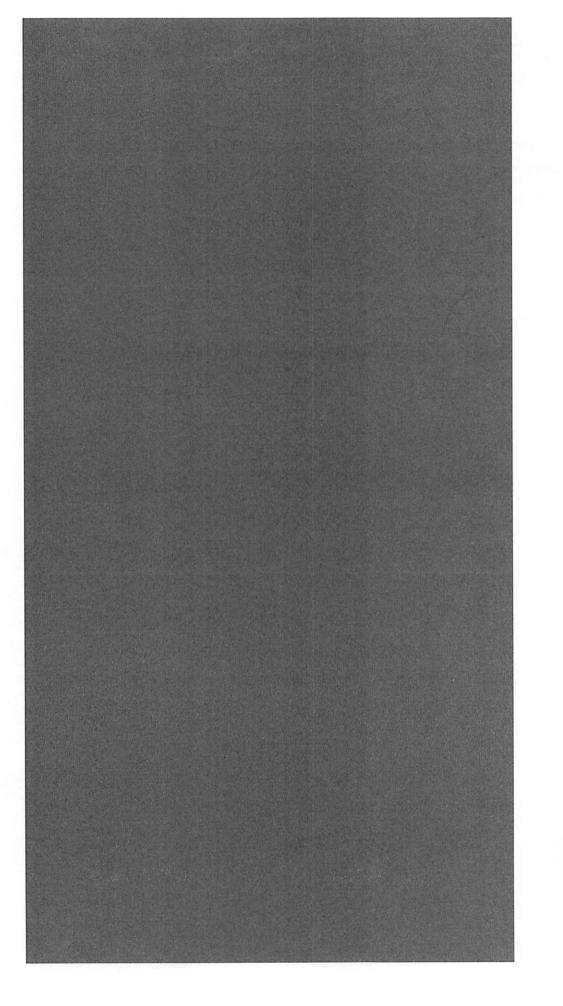

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# KERN HEALTH SYSTEMS HEALTHCARE WORKFORCE INITIATIVE AGREEMENT

This Healthcare Workforce Initiative Agreement ("Agreement") is made and entered into by and between Kern Health Systems, a county health authority (hereinafter "KHS"), and West Kern Community College District/Taft College (hereinafter "Organization"), each, a "Party" and, collectively, the "Parties," effective November 17, 2023.

# RECITALS

- A. WHEREAS, KHS desires to enter into an Agreement for the purpose of furthering its mission as a community health plan serving the vulnerable and underserved population in Kern County; and
- B. WHEREAS, KHS is administering the Healthcare Workforce Initiative and is intended to:
  - Increase the enrollment in applicants for nursing and residency programs;
  - Strengthen the diversity and network adequacy of providers;
  - Recruitment and retain nursing and residency faculty to allow for the increased enrollment:
  - Expansion of residency types (e.g. Family Medicine, Psychiatry, Surgery, Pediatrics, etc.);
  - Support students for successful completion of the programs.
- C. WHEREAS, KHS has approved the award of Initiative Funding to be disbursed to Organization in accordance with the terms of this Agreement,

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants and promises contained in this Agreement, it is hereby agreed as follows:

#### I. Definitions

- A. <u>Initiative Funds or Initiative Funding</u>. Monies distributed by KHS to Organization pursuant to this Agreement as part of the Healthcare Workforce Initiative program.
- B. <u>Milestones</u>. Key points of progress in each Project, as set forth in Exhibit B, Scope of Work, and Exhibit C, Milestones and Budget.
- C. <u>Project</u>. The work undertaken by Organization and KHS that is the subject of this Agreement and is fully set forth in Exhibit B, Scope of Work.

# II. Purpose of the Program

The purpose of the Healthcare Workforce Initiative program is to provide Organization with Funds to enable it to carry out the Project as detailed in the Exhibits to this Agreement.

# III. Term of Agreement

This Agreement shall become effective on November 17, 2023 and, unless earlier terminated pursuant to the terms of this Agreement, shall expire on November 17, 2025 (this period, the "Contract Term") and shall not automatically renew. Organization must submit final invoice no later than 120 days after the close of the Contract Term.

#### IV. Conditions and Terms

- A. As a condition of receiving Funding, Organization represents and warrants that the Organization and any of its Principals:
  - i. Are not presently debarred, suspended, proposed for debarment, or declared ineligible for the award of contracts by any federal agency or from participating in any state or federal healthcare programs;
  - ii. Have not, within a three (3) year period preceding the effective date of this Agreement, been convicted of or had a civil or criminal judgment rendered against them for: commission of fraud or a criminal offense in connection with obtaining, attempting to obtain, or performing a public (federal, state, or local) contract or subcontract; and
  - iii. Have no conflicts of interest, or received special treatment or consideration from, with, or by KHS, including those individuals associated with program-making activities.
- B. As a condition of receiving the Funding, Organization represents that it is: (1) a licensed free or community clinic, a public agency, or a tax-exempt 501(c)(3) entity; or (2) a KHS contracted provider; or (3) a provider to Medi-Cal or uninsured patients; or (4) an accredited school of nursing and (5) located in and primarily serving people in Kern County; and (6) in good standing or meets all KHS Credentialing Requirements, as defined in KHS Provider Manual.
- C. Organization shall submit reports to KHS in accordance with the terms outlined in Exhibit D, Reporting Requirements and Organization Responsibilities. The reports must document progress made during the reporting period in accordance with the attached Exhibit B, Project Scope of Work. Organization must report on activities carried out in compliance with Section VIII, Acknowledgment and Communication Requirements. Failure to submit timely and complete reports may impact receipt of Funds under this Agreement.
- D. Organization shall submit one (1) original copy of this Agreement signed by authorized representatives of the Organization and one copy of Organization's IRS W-9 Form, if not previously provided to KHS.

# V. Disbursement of Funding

This Funding will be disbursed to the Organization as indicated below.

- A. Organization will be eligible to receive Funds in an amount not to exceed \$300,000 over the term of the Agreement. Funding will be disbursed on a Milestone completion basis as set forth in Exhibits C and D to this Agreement.
- B. KHS shall make any qualifying disbursement of Funds within sixty (60) days following the receipt of completed Quarterly Reports and other reports as outlined in Exhibit D, Reporting Requirements and Organization Responsibilities.
- C. Expenditure of Funding must be consistent with the approved Milestone-based budget and used in a timely manner, and in accordance with Exhibit B, the Scope of Work, and as set forth in Exhibit C, Milestones and Budget.
- D. Notwithstanding the provisions of this Section IV, KHS will not make any disbursement of the Funds unless Organization is in compliance with all of the terms and conditions of this Agreement, and only as long as the disbursement of Funds: (1) will not violate any provision of law, regulation, guidance, order, state or federal policies, or administrative ruling to which KHS is subject; (2) will not subject KHS to any tax, penalty or fine; and (3) will not subject KHS to any liability of any kind, including but not limited to third party liability.

## VI. Corrective Action and Termination

- A. As necessary, KHS may modify this Agreement and/or implement a corrective action plan in order to facilitate Organization compliance. Organization shall be given a reasonable period of time to achieve compliance to the satisfaction of KHS.
- B. If Organization fails to achieve compliance with corrective action plan, KHS may terminate this Agreement by providing thirty (30) days advance written notice to the Organization. If this Agreement is terminated prior to the end of the Contract Term in Section II, Organization shall return funds received from KHS under this Agreement to KHS.
- C. Immediate Termination by KHS. This Agreement may be terminated immediately for cause by KHS. Cause for termination shall be:
  - i. Any act for which Organization's license, certification, controlled substance permit, medical staff membership or clinical privileges at a hospital is revoked, suspended or restricted in a manner that might materially affect Organization's ability to provide covered services pursuant to its services agreement with KHS or to perform its obligations under this Agreement.

- ii. A violation of any law or regulation that materially impairs the Organization's ability to perform this Agreement.
- iii. Conviction of a felony or any crime related to the practice of Organization's profession or operation of Organization's business.
- iv. Failure to maintain Organization's insurance as required by this Agreement or the Knox-Keene Act.
- v. The Organization falls short of the standards set by the accrediting body.

## VII. Monitoring

KHS reserves the right to monitor and conduct an evaluation of the Project operations funded under this Agreement. This monitoring may include, but is not limited to, the following: (1) a site visit by KHS personnel upon reasonable notice to review the progress, pertinent records, and/or subcontracts related to the Project; (2) review of materials related to the Project; and (3) review of any other activity related to this Agreement. KHS reserves the right to audit all financial records pertaining to this Agreement. Records shall be retained by Organization for at least five (5) years after the termination of the Contract Term.

#### VIII. Indemnification

Each Party shall defend, indemnify and hold harmless the other Party and each of their respective officers, directors, employees and agents (the "Indemnified Parties") for, from and against any and all claims, actions, suits, or proceedings, whether threatened or filed, to the extent resulting from or based upon a claim: (a) alleging that the negligence or wrongful acts or omissions of the indemnifying Party or any of its personnel (the "Indemnifying Party"); (b) that the Indemnifying Party infringed any intellectual property rights of another person or entity; (c) resulting from a material breach of this Agreement by the Indemnifying Party; or (d) resulting from a misrepresentation by the Indemnifying Party or the failure of the Indemnifying Party to comply with laws applicable to the performance of its obligations under this Agreement. The Indemnifying Party shall indemnify and hold harmless the Indemnified Parties for, from and against any and all liabilities, losses, damages, judgments, awards, fines, penalties, costs and expenses (including reasonable attorneys' fees and defense costs) incurred by or levied against any Indemnified Party as a result of any such claims. This indemnity shall not be limited by reason of any insurance coverage requirements or any other limitation on liability set forth in this Agreement. Nothing herein contained will be construed as prohibiting any of the Indemnified Parties from retaining their own legal counsel and defending any action or suits brought against them and, in such event, the Indemnified Parties will be liable for their respective costs and fees incurred in defense of any such claim, action or suit; provided, however, that the Indemnifying Party shall be responsible for such costs and fees in the event the Indemnified Party retains its own legal counsel as a result of either (i) the availability, as advised by counsel, of legal defenses which are different from or in addition to those available to the Indemnifying Party and which cannot be lawfully asserted by the Indemnifying Party pursuant to its indemnification obligations, or (ii) the Indemnifying Party, after receiving notice of the Indemnifying Party's indemnification obligation and within a period of time necessary to preserve any and all defenses to any

claim asserted, fails to assume the defense or to employ counsel for that purpose reasonably satisfactory to such Indemnified Party. The Parties agree that this provision will survive the expiration or termination of this Agreement.

## IX. Acknowledgement and Communication

- A. In all written materials for public distribution relating to the Project and other activities supported by Funding, Organization shall include the following statement:
  - "This project is funded in part by Kern Health Systems to increase capacity in the healthcare workforce throughout Kern County."
- B. During the term of this Agreement, Organization must name KHS as the MCP in all communications relating to the Project and must acknowledge KHS at all fundraising events as a sponsor of the Project.
- C. If applicable to this Agreement, permanent signage recognizing KHS will be posted in a conspicuous location at or near the entrance of any Organization for which Funds were utilized to improve its physical plant. This signage shall recognize KHS as a founding donor or language to that effect.
- D. Organization shall comply with KHS' branding policies when using KHS trademarks or logos.
- E. If mutually agreed in writing, KHS and Organization will prepare and issue joint press releases that recognize KHS' contribution and its importance in addressing community needs.
- F. KHS may include information regarding the Project undertaken pursuant to this Agreement on KHS's external website, which may be publicly available.

# X. No Right of Assignment or Delegation

Organization may not assign or otherwise transfer its rights or delegate any of its obligations under this Agreement without the approval of KHS. Subcontractors and Downstream Subcontractors shall agree to be bound by all applicable terms and conditions of this Agreement, including those contained in this Section. Any other attempted assignment shall be null and void *ab initio* and is considered a material breach of this Agreement.

#### XI. Amendment

This Agreement can be modified by an amendment written and authorized by KHS and Organization.

# XII. Compliance with Applicable Law

To the extent applicable to this Agreement and the duties, rights, and privileges hereunder. Organization agrees to comply with all applicable federal, State, county, and local statutes, rules, regulations, and ordinances, including, but not limited to, the Knox-Keene Act and its implementing regulations, Welfare and Institutions Code and its implementing regulations, the Social Security Act and its implementing regulations, the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act ("HIPAA") and its implementing regulations, the Health Information Technology for Economic and Clinical Health ("HITECH") Act, the Deficit Reduction Act of 2005 and its implementing regulations, the Federal Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act (Public Law 111-148) as amended by the Federal Health Care and Education Reconciliation Act of 2010 (Public Law 111-152) (collectively, "Affordable Care Act"), the California Consumer Privacy Act of 2018 and its implementing regulations, the California Confidentiality of Medical Information Act: H&S Code section 1340 et seq. (unless excluded under the Medi-Cal Contract): 28 CCR section 1300.43 et seq.; W&I Code sections 14000 and 14200 et seq.; and 22 CCR sections 53800 et seq., 22 CCR sections 53900 et seq., DHCS Medi-Cal Organization Manual; the Medi-Cal Contract between DHCS and KHS; all DHCS and other regulatory agency guidance, sub-regulatory guidance, executive orders, instructions, All Plan Letters ("APL(s)"), bulletins, and policies; and all standards, rules, and regulations of accreditation organizations.

# XIII. Entire Agreement

This Agreement, the Exhibits to this Agreement, and the Medi-Cal Contract are incorporated by reference herein and represent the complete, total and final understanding of the Parties, and no other understanding or representations, oral or written, regarding the subject matter of this Agreement, shall be deemed to exist or to bind the Parties hereto at the time of execution.

# XIV. Choice of Law and Dispute Resolution

- A. This Agreement shall be construed according to the laws of the State of California, without regard to its provisions regarding conflict of laws.
- B. The Parties shall attempt to resolve disputes informally and in good faith.
- C. Notwithstanding the above provisions, after exhaustion of all applicable KHS procedures, any controversy or claim arising out of or relating to this Agreement or the breach thereof shall be arbitrated pursuant to Chapter 3, Code of Civil Procedure section 1280 et seq. Such arbitration shall occur within the County of Kern, State of California, unless the Parties mutually agree to another location. The Parties shall share the cost of the arbitrator(s) equally and no Party shall be entitled to recover attorney's fees or costs from any other Party. This Paragraph shall not prevent either Party from seeking or obtaining injunctive relief in addition to other relief available in law or equity. Prior to initiating arbitration and notwithstanding the dispute resolution process stated herein, Organization shall comply with the requirements of the Government Claims Act, Government Code sections 810 et seq.

# XVI. Severability

If any provision of this Agreement is found to be illegal or unenforceable, the remaining provisions of the Agreement shall nevertheless remain in full force and effect and the illegal or unenforceable provision shall be stricken.

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- 9. Use of illness leave for personal necessity (Education Code Sections 87784 and 88207).

In addition to these policies and collective bargaining agreements, the Board retains the power to grant leaves with or without pay for other purposes or for other periods of time.

The Superintendent/President shall establish administrative procedures to ensure the safety of employees and students on District sites, including the following:

- Compliance with the United States Department of Transportation regulations implementing the Federal Omnibus Transportation Employee Testing Act of 1991. Specifically, the District shall comply with the regulations of the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) and, if applicable, the Federal Transit Administration (FTA). Compliance with these policies and procedures may be a condition of employment.
- Establishment of an Injury and Illness Prevention Program in compliance with applicable OSHA regulations and state law. These procedures shall promote an active and aggressive program to reduce and/or control safety and health risks.
- Establishment of a Hazardous Material Communications Program which shall include review of all chemicals or materials received by the District for hazardous properties, instruction for employees and students on the safe handling of such materials, and proper disposal methods for hazardous materials.
- 4. Prohibition of the use of tobacco in all public buildings.

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## BP 2430 Delegation of Authority to the Superintendent/President

#### Reference:

Education Code Sections 70902(d), & 72400; ACCJC Accreditation Standards IV.B5, IV.C.12, and IV.D.1 (formerly IV.B.1.j; IV.B.2)

The Board delegates to the Superintendent/President the executive responsibility for administering the policies adopted by the Board and executing all decisions of the Board requiring administrative action.

The Superintendent/President may delegate any powers and duties entrusted to him or her by the Board including the administration of colleges and centers, but will be specifically responsible to the Board for the execution of such delegated powers and duties.

The Superintendent/President is empowered to reasonably interpret Board In situations where there is no Board policy direction, the Superintendent/President shall have the power to act, but such decisions shall be subject to review by the Board. It is the duty of the Superintendent/President to inform the Board of such action and to recommend written board policy if one is required.

The Superintendent/President is expected to perform the duties contained in the Superintendent/President job description and fulfill other responsibilities as may be determined in annual goal-setting or evaluation sessions. The job description and goals and objectives for performance shall be developed by the Board in consultation with the Superintendent/President, Because of the hours and duties required of the Superintendent/President, the District shall provide, and the Superintendent/President shall accept, housing owned by the District in the City of Taft.

The Superintendent/President shall ensure that all relevant laws and regulations are complied with, and that required reports are submitted in a timely fashion.

The Superintendent/President shall make available any information or give any report requested by the Board as a whole. Individual trustee requests for

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information shall be met if, in the opinion of the Superintendent/President, they are not unduly burdensome or disruptive to District operations. Information provided to any trustee shall be available to all trustees.

#### **CLINICAL TRAINING PROGRAM AGREEMENT**

THIS CLINICAL TRAINING PROGRAM AGREEMENT ("Agreement") is made and entered into the 1st day of October 2023 ("Effective Date"), by and between **Pro Safety and Rescue, Inc.**, and **Taft College** (aka West Kern Community College District), Emergency Medical Technician (EMT) / Paramedic Programs, an accredited training institution.

#### **RECITALS:**

- A. Taft College desires to provide its students who are currently participating in the EMT and/or Paramedic courses with the benefit of educational opportunities and facilities for clinical experience in emergency medical response (EMS).
- B. Taft College wishes to provide such experience for its students by requesting that Pro Safety and Rescue provide students with clinical experience by means of placement with Pro Safety and Rescue for purposes of clinical rotation.
- C. Pro Safety and Rescue has agreed to contribute to Taft College by providing certain clinical education opportunities for experience for students at Taft College, at no cost to Taft College or the students.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing recitals and the mutual covenants and promises hereinafter to set forth, and other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, the parties agree as follows:

1. <u>Engagement</u>. Taft College hereby engages Pro Safety and Rescue, and Pro Safety and Rescue accepts such engagement pursuant to the terms and provisions of this Agreement, to provide Taft College students with certain clinical education opportunities by providing the vehicular field experience in the area of clinical training.

#### 2. Parties Responsibilities.

#### 2.1 Pro Safety and Rescue shall:

- 2.1.1 provide practical clinical training opportunities for experience in EMS at no cost to Taft College or students.
- 2.1.2 make available certain Pro Safety and Rescue facilities and ambulances for the EMT and/or Paramedic students.
- 2.1.3 permit the students to observe and participate in the provision of certain clinic training provided by Pro Safety and Rescue at their sole discretion.

#### 2.2 Taft College shall:

- 2.2.1 after consultation with Pro Safety and Rescue, plan, coordinate and implement the EMT and/or Paramedic courses providing for the assignment of students to Pro Safety and Rescue. Taft College shall include a student orientation, which shall be a mandatory prerequisite for each student before such student is placed with Pro Safety and Rescue. Such orientation may consist of instruction regarding specific Pro Safety and Rescue protocols, policies, and procedures as mutually agreed upon by the parties.
- 2.2.2after consultation with Pro Safety and Rescue, select suitable clinical experience opportunities and situations in patient care to be experienced by the students to help the student to meet the objectives of Taft College's prescribed educational curriculum in the EMT and/or Paramedic course.
- 2.2.3 perform all administrative and screening functions relating to Taft College, including, without limitation: verification that all students meet all state eligibility requirements; confirmation of the students' credentials and background, including a full criminal background record check; admission of the students; scheduling of the course and teaching the course; and maintenance of attendance and achievement records.
- 2.2.4 as soon as such information is available to Taft College, notify Pro Safety and Rescue, in writing, of the planning schedule of the student assignments to the Pro Safety and Rescue, specifically the number of students to be placed with Pro Safety and Rescue, and the dates of such placement. The schedule, student assignments and number of students will be subject to written approval by Pro Safety and Rescue, such approval to be at the sole discretion of Pro Safety and Rescue.
- 2.2.5 keep Pro Safety and Rescue informed of changes in Taft College policy, the students' eligibility, participation and/or any other information related to the course.
- 2.2.6 obtain from each student, prior to his/her participation in clinical training activities with Pro Safety and Rescue, a signed Waiver attached hereto as Exhibit A. A signed copy of such Waiver for each student shall be delivered by Taft College to Pro Safety and Rescue prior to the scheduled assignment of a student with Pro Safety and Rescue. Taft College shall be solely responsible for obtaining and maintaining each original student's Waiver.
- 2.2.7 provide adequate supervision of students placed with Pro Safety and Rescue. Pro Safety and Rescue shall have the right, exercisable in its sole discretion, to refuse all or any number of scheduled assignments, if, in Pro Safety and Rescue's sole discretion, if Pro Safety and Rescue determines that the supervision of any scheduled assignment is not adequate.
- 2.2.8 instruct students regarding the need for confidentiality of all patient information and records in accordance with all applicable law, including but not limited to the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996, as codified as 42 U.S.C. § 1320d through d-8 ("HIPAA"), and the regulations promulgated thereunder, including without limitation the federal privacy regulations as contained in 45 CFR Part 164 (the "Federal Privacy Standards") and the federal security regulations as contained in 45 CFR Part 142 (the "Federal Security Standards"), all as amended. In the event a student discusses Protected Health Information in a Taft College course, Taft College shall comply with the

requirements of a Business Associate as outlined in Exhibit 8. Upon request, Taft College shall provide Pro Safety and Rescue with a copy of all related training materials.

- 2.2.9 instruct students that they must comply with all policies and procedures of Pro Safety and Rescue while participating in activities of the EMT and/or Paramedic course that interacts with Pro Safety and Safety.
- 2.2.10 provide Pro Safety and Rescue with documentation indicating that students have:
  - (i) completed training in all applicable Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) Regulations, or state program, whichever is applicable.
  - (ii) been immunized against Hepatitis B or have signed the OSHA declination.
  - (iii) received an annual Tuberculosis skin test, chest X-ray or other appropriate health test or survey.
  - (iv) been immunized against Measles and Rubella.
  - (v) complied with all applicable Law requirements to the students' eligibility and participation in the EMT and/or Paramedic course.
  - (vi) provided sufficient training of HIPAA regarding patient confidentiality requirements and/or Protected Health Information.

Taft College shall ensure that prior to any student beginning participation in clinical training activities with Pro Safety and Rescue that all the above requirements have been completed or satisfied. Taft College shall be solely responsible for obtaining, maintaining, and ensuring such requirements and their verification of such documentation for each student is completed.

- 2.2.11 ensure, in as much as reasonably possible, that students are free of communicable diseases by requiring each student to undergo health screenings prior to placement with RA. Taft College shall ensure that prior to any student beginning participation in clinical training activities with Pro Safety and Rescue that all the above requirements have been completed or satisfied. Taft College shall be solely responsible for obtaining, maintaining, and ensuring this requirement and their verification for each student is completed.
- 2.2.12 Subject to the anti-discrimination provisions of Paragraph 12 of this Agreement, upon Pro Safety and Rescue's oral or written request, which may be made in its sole discretion, Taft College shall immediately remove any student from assignment with Pro Safety and Rescue.
- 3. <u>Term and Termination</u>. The term of this Agreement shall be for a period of three (3) years commencing upon the Effective Date ("Initial Term"). Renewal of this agreement will require an addendum or new agreement. Notwithstanding the above, this Agreement may be terminated by either party upon thirty (30) days written notice to the other.
- 4. <u>No Financial Consideration</u>. Aside from the provisions expressly stated herein, neither party shall have any monetary obligation to the other, to EMT and/or Paramedic students or to instructors.
- 5. <u>Exclusion of Certain Damages</u>. In no event shall either party, its affiliates or any of their respective directors, officers, members, shareholders, employees, agents, or subcontractors be liable to the other and/or to the students for lost profits, special, consequential, incidental, or punitive damages, regardless of the basis of the claim, whether in contract, tort, strict liability, negligence or other legal or

equitable theory, whether or not the party has been advised of the Pro Safety and Rescue and West Kern Community College District Clinic Training Program Agreement possibility of such damages.

- 6. Indemnification. Each party, its respective officers, directors, affiliates, employees and students ("Indemnitor") shall indemnify, hold harmless and defend the other party, its respective officers, directors, affiliates, employees and students ("Indemnitee") for, from and against all costs, claims, losses, liabilities, penalties, fines, citations, expenses, forfeitures or other damages, including but not limited to settlements, defense costs, judgments, court costs, expert(s) fees and reasonable fees of attorneys, incident to, and which it may incur, become responsible for, or pay out as a result of death or bodily injury to any person, and destruction or damage to any property, contamination of or adverse effects on the environment, or any violation of applicable law, to the extent that such damage was caused by, in whole or in part, incident to or arose out of this Agreement and the Indemnitor's:
  - (i) breach of this Agreement,
  - (ii) its negligent or willful act(s) or omission(s), or
  - (iii) its violation of any applicable law, or
  - (iv) any employment, workers' compensation, or other related claim by indemnitor's employees, agents, or subcontractors.

Nothing in this section shall limit any right to contribution or other allocation of fault between the parties as determined by a court of competent jurisdiction and as permitted by applicable law.

- 7. <u>Duty/Failure to Defend</u>. Upon the written request of Pro Safety and Rescue, Taft College shall be called upon to assume the settlement, compromise and/or defense of any claim made, or suit brought or proceeding instituted against Pro Safety and Rescue arising out of this Agreement. If, in the sole opinion of Pro Safety and Rescue, Taft College fails to diligently defend such claim, suit or proceeding, Pro Safety and Rescue may retain counsel of its own choice and settle, compromise, or defend such claim, suit or proceeding, with resulting costs of settlement, compromise or defense, including attorneys' and experts' fees, to be borne by Taft College.
- 8. <u>Insurance</u>. Taft College shall maintain at all applicable times, at its own expense, comprehensive general liability, and professional liability insurance in amounts equal to at least \$1,000,000 per occurrence and an umbrella equal to at least \$5,000,000 annual in the aggregate. At least ten (10) days prior to the first student placement and the commencement of the Pro Safety and Rescue clinical training activities, Taft College shall furnish to Pro Safety and Rescue satisfactory evidence such insurance in the form of an insurance certificate from the insurance carriers (or risk management office if issued by a governmental unit) evidencing such coverage, naming Pro Safety and Rescue an additional insured on its policy, waiving its right of subrogation against Pro Safety and Rescue, and stating that the insurance carriers/risk management office will not cancel the policies or change insurance limits or fail to renew the policies without giving Pro Safety and Rescue at least thirty (30) days advance written notice. Such insurance shall be considered the primary insurance policy covering any act or omission occurring in the performance of this Agreement.

#### 9. Representations and Warranties.

- 9.1 Each party represents and warrants to the other that:
  - (i) it has the right to enter into this Agreement.
  - (ii) to grant the rights granted in this Agreement and to perform fully all the services and obligations contemplated by this Agreement.
  - (iii) the person entering into this Agreement is authorized to sign this Agreement on behalf of the party.

(iv) the parties have reviewed this Agreement with legal counsel to the party's satisfaction or voluntarily waived their right to do so.

#### 9.2 Taft College warrants that:

- (i) all information, documentation and verifications supplied to, and all representations made to Pro Safety and Rescue shall be true, accurate and complete and in the event such information, documentation, verifications, or representation(s) made herein become inaccurate or incomplete, Taft College will promptly notify Pro Safety and Rescue in writing of such occurrence.
- (ii) it shall perform all its obligations under this Agreement incompliance with all applicable law.
- (iii) the students' placed with Pro Safety and Rescue meet all state eligibility requirements including all credential, background, and criminal record admission criteria.
- 10. <u>Independent Contractor</u>. Nothing in this Agreement shall be construed as creating anything other than an independent contractor relationship among Taft College, students, faculty, other employees and agents of Taft College and Pro Safety and Rescue (and any of their employees, contractors, or affiliate entities), nor shall anything be construed as creating an employment relationship, agency, partnership, or joint venture among the parties. Neither among Taft College, its students, faculty, other employees, and agents of Taft College nor Pro Safety and Rescue shall have any obligation, responsibility, or authority to act on behalf of or in the nature of the other, or to bind the other in any manner whatsoever, or to control or direct the methods by which either party performs its responsibilities.
- 11. Confidential Information. In addition to Protected Health Information as defined by HIPAA, during the course of performing this agreement, each party may from time to time receive confidential information about the other including but not limited to information about the party's customers, patients, practices, procedures, strategies, organization, financial and other related information. Neither party shall use or disclose any such confidential information for any purpose other than the limited purpose of performing its obligations under this Agreement, without the prior express written permission of the supplying party. Pro Safety and Rescue's copyrighted materials, confidential information and procedures shall be and remain the sole property of Pro Safety and Rescue. Subject to Taft College's duty to comply with California's Public Records Act, if a party is served with a subpoena or other legal process concerning confidential information of the other party, that party shall immediately (not more than 48 hours after the receipt) notify the supplying party and shall cooperate with it in any lawful effort to contest the legal validity of such process the supplying party may wish to pursue. Pro Safety and Rescue may, from time to time, gain incidental access to confidential information and records including student record information as defined by 20 USC section 1232g. The parties agree that such incidental access is not a provision or conveyance or disclosure to Pro Safety and Rescue of student record information in violation of section 1232(g) or of any similar state law. Pro Safety and Rescue agrees that if in the performance of its duties it does obtain such access it shall refrain from any removal, use or disclosure to any third person of such information and records and shall take all necessary affirmative steps to maintain the confidentiality, and avoid such removal, use or disclosure, whether intentional or inadvertent, of such records and information.
- 12. <u>Anti-Discrimination</u>. In connection with its activities hereunder, neither party shall violate those federal and State laws which prohibit discrimination, harassment and retaliation based upon race, nationality, ethnicity, gender, sexual orientation, disability, or any other protected classification. Each party shall hold harmless, indemnify, and defend the other against any claim or suit alleging that the

indemnitor has unlawfully discriminated or harassed or retaliated against the claimant in violation of federal or State anti-discrimination laws.

13. <u>Notices</u>. Any notice required or permitted to be given pursuant to any provisions of this Agreement shall be given in writing, and deposited with the United States Postal Service, postage pre-paid, registered, or certified mail, return receipt requested, or by a nationally recognized overnight courier service, addressed as follows:

Either party may change the listed addresses with proper written notification.

- 14. <u>Force Majeure</u>. Either party shall be excused for failures and delays in performance of its respective obligations under this Agreement due to any cause beyond its control and without fault, including without limitation, any act of God, war, riot or insurrection, law or regulation, strike, flood, fire, terrorism, explosion, or inability due to any of the aforementioned causes to obtain labor, materials, roadways, or facilities. Nevertheless, each party shall use its best efforts to avoid or remove such causes and to continue performance whenever such causes are removed and shall notify the other party of the problem.
- 15. <u>Legal Fees</u>. In the event either party brings any action for any relief, declaratory or otherwise, arising out of this Agreement, or on account of any breach or default hereof, the prevailing party shall be entitled to receive from the other party reasonable attorneys' fees, costs, and expenses.
- 16. <u>Publicity & IP Provision</u>. Taft College shall not use any trademarks, service marks, visual product representations, trade names, logos or other commercial or product designations of Pro Safety and Rescue or disclose without Pro Safety and Rescue's express prior written consent. Taft College shall not identify or make reference to Pro Safety and Rescue in any communication, advertising, or other promotional modality regardless of its form without explicit prior written consent from Pro Safety and Rescue.
- 17. <u>Assignment</u>. Neither party may assign its rights or obligations under this Agreement to a third party without the prior written consent of the other party, which shall not be unreasonably withheld, and any attempted assignment without such consent shall be null and void. Notwithstanding the above, with reasonable notice to Taft College, Pro Safety and Rescue may assign or subcontract its obligations under

this Agreement. This Agreement shall be binding upon and for the sole benefit of the parties hereto and their respective successors and permitted assigns.

- 18. <u>Amendments</u>. Any amendments to this Agreement shall be effective only if in writing and signed by authorized representatives of both parties.
- 19. <u>Severability</u>. If any portion or portions of this Agreement shall be for any reason invalid or unenforceable, the remaining portion(s) shall be valid and enforceable and carried into effect unless to do so would clearly violate the present legal and valid intention of the parties hereto.
- 20. <u>Survival</u>. Any provisions of this Agreement creating obligations extending beyond the term of this Agreement shall survive the expiration or termination of this Agreement, regardless of the reason for such termination.
- 21. <u>Headings</u>. The headings used in this Agreement are for convenience only and do not limit the contents of this Agreement.
- 22. <u>Variations of Pronouns</u>. All pronouns and variations thereof will be deemed to refer to the masculine, feminine, or neuter, singular or plural, as the identity of a person, persons, or entity may require.
- 23. <u>Exhibits</u>. All Exhibits referenced herein are incorporated into this Agreement in their entity. Agreement when used throughout this Agreement shall include all referenced Exhibits.
- 24. <u>Governing Law</u>. This Agreement shall be subject to and governed according to laws of the State of California, regardless of whether either party is or may become a resident of another state. The Parties agree that the venue and jurisdiction shall be exclusively in the state and federal courts located in the County of Kern in the State of California.
- 25. <u>Entire Agreement</u>. This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement and understanding between the parties with respect to the subject matter hereof and supersedes any previous agreements or understandings, whether oral or written.
- 26. <u>Counterparts</u>. This Agreement may be executed in several counterparts, each of which shall be an original, but all of which shall constitute one and the same instrument.

### Appendix A

Pro Safety and Rescue Ride-a-Long Waiver

## **Ride-Along Observer Policy**

The observer participating in a ride-along with an ambulance operated by Pro Safety Rescue, Inc. ("PS&R") must read and initial each safety rule below to formally acknowledge his or her understanding of the requirements, and to signify his or her willingness to comply.

INITIALS	#	MANDATORY SAFETY RULES
	1	Observers shall follow the instructions of the hosting PS&R field crew, unless such instruction contradicts any element of the mandatory safety rules of this section.
	2	Observers shall not participate in the delivery of medical care to any patient at any time, regardless of current or past certifications/licenses or skills to do so.
	3	Observers shall not assist in the raising, lowering, loading, unloading, positioning, or adjusting the gurney at any time. Similarly, observers may not participate in the lifting, movement, or repositioning of any patient.
	4	Whenever the PS&R vehicle is in operation, observers shall wear a properly adjusted seatbelt.
	5	Given the risk of infectious exposure, observers are strongly encouraged to seek the advice of their private physician <u>prior to participating</u> in a ride-along experience. In doing so, observers can make an informed decision about obtaining appropriate vaccinations and receive other key information regarding how to reduce their risk of infectious exposure.
	6	If a patient has been identified as a potential carrier of an airborne or droplet pathogen, the observer shall limit his/her exposure on scene. Early identification of such patients prior to significant exposure is not always possible.
	7	Observers shall not store, transport or consume any food or liquid in the patient compartment of the ambulance. Similarly, observers may not apply lip balm, makeup, contact lenses or other items while in the patient compartment.
	8	All patient effects and environmental surfaces in the back of the ambulance, on the gurney and medical equipment should be considered infectious. Accordingly, observers should cover areas of chapped, abraded or lacerated skin and wash their hands regularly and/or use waterless hand cleaners in the field setting.
	9	While on scene or within a five foot (5') radius of any patient, observer shall continuously wear PS&R-issued eye protection regardless of the nature of the call, the hosting crew's failure to do so, or the observer's individual perception of the relative risk of eye injury or infectious exposure.
	10	During potentially hazardous scenes or patient extrications, observers must remain at a safe distance even if they are unable to observe the extrication and/or treatment being provided. Observers must also seek a safe vantage point at scenes that present a moving vehicle hazard, such as busy streets, highways, etc.
	11	For their safety or due to operational circumstances, observers acknowledge that they may be left by the PS&R crew in a safe location or at a scene during a ride—along. Observers may also be required to remain with the PS&R crew until completion of a long transport or the end of the scheduled shift.
	12	Observers are required to report any injury, illness, or exposure they perceive may have occurred during the ride-along experience to the hosting crew and the on-duty field supervisor. This notification must be made immediately or as soon as possible thereafter.

Along Observer Agreeme	ent, Waiver and Release (the "Agreement"):

#### A. Waiver of Liability:

- 1. I acknowledge that the Operations are inherently dangerous and that I may be subjected to the risk of personal injury, death, and loss of property damage by accompanying PS&R personnel during the performance of the Operations. I freely, voluntarily and with such knowledge assume these risks associated with the Operations.
- 2. I hereby release, waive and discharge PS&R and its officers, directors, shareholders, agents, employees, representatives, successors, assigns and subsidiaries from responsibility or liability for any an all loss, claim or action that my arise due to personal injury, death, loss or property damage which may result in the course of the Operations in which I am voluntarily participating and which loss, claim, or action may result from any negligent act or omission on the part of myself, any third person, or any employee or representative of PS&R.
- 3. I, my heirs, executors, administrators, and assigns agree to defend, indemnify and hold harmless PS&R and its officers, directors, shareholders, agents, employees, representatives, successors, assigns and subsidiaries ("Indemnified Parties") against all manners of actions, suits, debts, claims, demands, damages, liability, or expense which result from my participation in the Operations and which arise from my own negligent or wrongful act or omission, the negligent or wrongful act or omission of Indemnified Parties during the course of the Operations.
- 4. I understand the risk of danger of physical harm inherent Operations. I am aware of the risk of grievous bodily or psychological harm, property loss and the risk of death as a result of many factors including, without limitation, toxic or biological hazards, infection or disease, musculoskeletal injury, vehicular accidents, fire, gunshot, physical violence, crime, social insurrection, man-made or natural disaster.
- 5. I voluntarily wish to face the danger of the Operations. In doing so, I will assume all risk of personal injury, illness, and death. I acknowledge that I have executed this Agreement voluntarily, without duress, and in exchange for the opportunity to observe PS&R employees and agents perform their duties.
- 6. I UNDERSTAND THAT THIS AGREEMENT, IS INTENDED, TO THE EXTENT PREMITTED BY LAW, TO RELEASE AND DISCHARGE IN ADVANCE PS&R AND INDEMNIFIED PARTIES FROM ANY AND ALL LIABILITY RELATING TO MY VOLUNTARY RIDE-ALONG DURING THE PERFORMANCE OF PS&R OPERATIONS. BY SIGNING THIS AGREEMENT, I AM KNOWINGLY GIVING UP ANY RIGHT THAT I MAY HAVE TO SUE PS&R FOR INJURY, ILLNESS OR DEATH AS A RESULT OF AN ACT, OMISSION OR THE NEGLIGENT CONDUCT OF ANY PERSON, INCLUDING EMPLOYEES AND AGENTS OF PS&R. THIS AGREEMENT IS SIGNED FREELY WITH FULL KNOWLEDGE OF THE RISKS AND DANGERS INCIDENT THERETO.

#### B. <u>Patient Confidentiality</u>:

- 1. I will strictly adhere to PS&R's policies and procedures relating to the Health Insurance Portability & Accountability Act of 1996 ("HIPPA"). In summary, PS&R's HIPPA policy is that:
  - a. All information (medical or personnel) received on any patient by any means will not be discussed with any third person that is not directly associated with the call. This information includes the name, address, or identity of any patient and the condition, treatment or medical history of any patient. I will not divulge or discuss any aspect associated with a patient's identity or condition that I discover or observe through my participation in the ride-along in the course of the Operations.
  - b. No documentation of a patient's name, address, or identity connected with their condition, treatment, or medical history is allowed. I acknowledge and agree that I am prohibited from carrying or using cameras or any other recording device of any kind during the Operations.
    - c. I am not authorized to copy any portion of the Patient Care Report.
- 2. I acknowledge and agree that I will be immediately dismissed from the ride-along and will be ineligible from any future ride-along if I breach any HIPPA policy outlined above or otherwise conveyed to me by PC&R employees or agents, and will be subject to any resulting claims arising from my breach.

#### C. <u>Trade Secrets and Non-Disclosure Agreement</u>

- 1. I acknowledge that during the course of a ride-along, I may have access to or become acquainted with information concerning the operation and processes of deployment planning, design and use of computer software, proprietary technical designs and methods, operational theories, secret processes, and other proprietary or confidential information and strategies (collectively, "Confidential Information") owned by PS&R and its subsidiaries and used by PS&R as operational methods and business strategies.
- 2. I will not record, misuse, misappropriate, or disclose any Confidential Information, directly or indirectly, to any person or use the Confidential Information in any respect. All Confidential Information including all files, records, documents, drawings, specifications, and equipment are the exclusive property of PS&R.
- 3. I acknowledge and agree that the sale, unauthorized use or disclosure of any Confidential Information obtained during my ride-along(s), including information concerning PS&R's current business or future work, services, or products under consideration or in production will constitute a breach of this Agreement for which I may be found liable and subject to monetary damages.

#### CLINICAL TRAINING PROGRAM AGREEMENT

THIS CLINICAL TRAINING PROGRAM AGREEMENT ("Agreement") is made and entered into the 1st day of October 2023 ("Effective Date"), by and between **West Side Health Care District**, and **Taft College** (aka West Kern Community College District), Emergency Medical Technician (EMT) / Paramedic Programs, an accredited training institution.

#### **RECITALS:**

- A. Taft College desires to provide its students who are currently participating in EMT and/or Paramedic courses with the benefit of educational opportunities and facilities for clinical experience.
- B. Taft College wishes to provide such experience for its students by requesting that West Side Health Care District provide students with clinical experience by means of placement with West Side Health Care District for purposes of clinical rotation.
- C. West Side Health Care District has agreed to contribute to Taft College by providing certain clinical education opportunities for experience for students at Taft College, at no cost to Taft College or the students.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing recitals and the mutual covenants and promises hereinafter to set forth, and other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, the parties agree as follows:

1. <u>Engagement</u>. Taft College hereby engages West Side Health Care District, and West Side Health Care District accepts such engagement pursuant to the terms and provisions of this Agreement, to provide Taft College students with certain clinical education opportunities by providing clinical training.

#### 2. Parties Responsibilities.

#### 2.1 West Side Health Care District shall:

- 2.1.1 provide practical clinical training opportunities at no cost to Taft College or students.
- 2.1.2 make available certain West Side Health Care District facilities for the EMT and/or Paramedic students.
- 2.1.3 permit the students to observe and participate in the provision of certain clinic training provided by West Side Health Care District at their sole discretion.

#### 2.2 Taft College shall:

2.2.1 after consultation with West Side Health Care District, plan, coordinate and implement the EMT and/or Paramedic courses providing for the assignment of students

to West Side Health Care District. Taft College shall include a student orientation, which shall be a mandatory prerequisite for each student before such a student is placed with West Side Health Care District. Such orientation may consist of instruction regarding specific West Side Health Care District protocols, policies, and procedures as mutually agreed upon by the parties.

- 2.2.2after consultation with West Side Health Care District, select suitable clinical experience opportunities and situations in patient care to be experienced by the students to help the student to meet the objectives of Taft College's prescribed educational curriculum in the EMT and/or Paramedic course.
- 2.2.3 perform all administrative and screening functions relating to Taft College, including, without limitation: verification that all students meet all state eligibility requirements; confirmation of the students' credentials and background, including a full criminal background record check; admission of the students; scheduling of the course and teaching the course; and maintenance of attendance and achievement records.
- 2.2.4 as soon as such information is available to Taft College, notify West Side Health Care District, in writing, of the planning schedule of the student assignments to the West Side Health Care District, specifically the number of students to be placed with West Side Health Care District, and the dates of such placement. The schedule, student assignments and number of students will be subject to written approval by West Side Health Care District, such approval to be at the sole discretion of West Side Health Care District.
- 2.2.5 keep West Side Health Care District informed of changes in Taft College policy, the students' eligibility, participation and/or any other information related to the course.
- 2.2.6 provide adequate supervision of students placed with West Side Health Care District. West Side Health Care District shall have the right, exercisable in its sole discretion, to refuse all or any number of scheduled assignments, if, in West Side Health Care District's sole discretion, if West Side Health Care District determines that the supervision of any scheduled assignment is not adequate.
- 2.2.7 instruct students regarding the need for confidentiality of all patient information and records in accordance with all applicable law, including but not limited to the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996, as codified as 42 U.S.C. § 1320d through d-8 ("HIPAA"), and the regulations promulgated thereunder, including without limitation the federal privacy regulations as contained in 45 CFR Part 164 (the "Federal Privacy Standards") and the federal security regulations as contained in 45 CFR Part 142 (the "Federal Security Standards"), all as amended. In the event a student discusses Protected Health Information in a Taft College course, Taft College shall comply with the requirements of a Business Associate as outlined in Exhibit 8. Upon request, Taft College shall provide West Side Health Care District with a copy of all related training materials.
- 2.2.8 instruct students that they must comply with all policies and procedures of West Side Health Care District while participating in activities of the EMT and/or Paramedic course that interacts with Pro Safety and Safety.

- 2.2.9 provide West Side Health Care District with documentation indicating that students have:
  - (i) completed training in all applicable Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) Regulations, or state program, whichever is applicable.
  - (ii) been immunized against Hepatitis B or have signed the OSHA declination.
  - (iii) received an annual Tuberculosis skin test, chest X-ray or other appropriate health test or survey.
  - (iv) been immunized against Measles and Rubella.
  - (v) complied with all applicable Law requirements to the students' eligibility and participation in the EMT and/or Paramedic course.
  - (vi) provided sufficient training of HIPAA regarding patient confidentiality requirements and/or Protected Health Information.

Taft College shall ensure that prior to any student beginning participation in clinical training activities with West Side Health Care District that all the above requirements have been completed or satisfied. Taft College shall be solely responsible for obtaining, maintaining, and ensuring such requirements and their verification of such documentation for each student is completed.

- 2.2.10 ensure, in as much as reasonably possible, that students are free of communicable diseases by requiring each student to undergo health screenings prior to placement with RA. Taft College shall ensure that prior to any student beginning participation in clinical training activities with West Side Health Care District that all the above requirements have been completed or satisfied. Taft College shall be solely responsible for obtaining, maintaining, and ensuring this requirement and their verification for each student is completed.
- 2.2.11 Subject to the anti-discrimination provisions of Paragraph 12 of this Agreement, upon West Side Health Care District's oral ·or written request, which may be made in its sole discretion, Taft College shall immediately remove any student from assignment with West Side Health Care District.
- 3. <u>Term and Termination</u>. The term of this Agreement shall be for a period of three (3) years commencing upon the Effective Date ("Initial Term"). Renewal of this agreement will require an addendum or new agreement. Notwithstanding the above, this Agreement may be terminated by either party upon thirty (30) days written notice to the other.
- 4. <u>No Financial Consideration</u>. Aside from the provisions expressly stated herein, neither party shall have any monetary obligation to the other, to EMT and/or Paramedic students or to instructors.
- 5. Exclusion of Certain Damages. In no event shall either party, its affiliates or any of their respective directors, officers, members, shareholders, employees, agents, or subcontractors be liable to the other and/or to the students for lost profits, special, consequential, incidental, or punitive damages, regardless of the basis of the claim, whether in contract, tort, strict liability, negligence or other legal or equitable theory, whether or not the party has been advised of the West Side Health Care District and West Kern Community College District Clinic Training Program Agreement possibility of such damages.
- 6. <u>Indemnification</u>. Each party, its respective officers, directors, affiliates, employees and students ("Indemnitor") shall indemnify, hold harmless and defend the other party, its respective officers, directors, affiliates, employees and students ("Indemnitee") for, from and against all costs, claims, losses, liabilities, penalties, fines, citations, expenses, forfeitures or other damages, including but not

limited to settlements, defense costs, judgments, court costs, expert(s) fees and reasonable fees of attorneys, incident to, and which it may incur, become responsible for, or pay out as a result of death or bodily injury to any person, and destruction or damage to any property, contamination of or adverse effects on the environment, or any violation of applicable law, to the extent that such damage was caused by, in whole or in part, incident to or arose out of this Agreement and the Indemnitor's:

- (i) breach of this Agreement,
- (ii) its negligent or willful act(s) or omission(s), or
- (iii) its violation of any applicable law, or
- (iv) any employment, workers' compensation, or other related claim by indemnitor's employees, agents, or subcontractors.

Nothing in this section shall limit any right to contribution or other allocation of fault between the parties as determined by a court of competent jurisdiction and as permitted by applicable law.

- 7. <u>Duty/Failure to Defend</u>. Upon the written request of West Side Health Care District, Taft College shall be called upon to assume the settlement, compromise and/or defense of any claim made, or suit brought or proceeding instituted against West Side Health Care District arising out of this Agreement. If, in the sole opinion of West Side Health Care District, Taft College fails to diligently defend such claim, suit or proceeding, West Side Health Care District may retain counsel of its own choice and settle, compromise, or defend such claim, suit or proceeding, with resulting costs of settlement, compromise or defense, including attorneys' and experts' fees, to be borne by Taft College.
- 8. Insurance. Taft College shall maintain at all applicable times, at its own expense, comprehensive general liability, and professional liability insurance in amounts equal to at least \$1,000,000 per occurrence and an umbrella equal to at least \$5,000,000 annual in the aggregate. At least ten (10) days prior to the first student placement and the commencement of the West Side Health Care District clinical training activities, Taft College shall furnish to West Side Health Care District satisfactory evidence such insurance in the form of an insurance certificate from the insurance carriers (or risk management office if issued by a governmental unit) evidencing such coverage, naming West Side Health Care District an additional insured on its policy, waiving its right of subrogation against West Side Health Care District, and stating that the insurance carriers/risk management office will not cancel the policies or change insurance limits or fail to renew the policies without giving West Side Health Care District at least thirty (30) days advance written notice. Such insurance shall be considered the primary insurance policy covering any act or omission occurring in the performance of this Agreement.

#### 9. Representations and Warranties.

- 9.1 Each party represents and warrants to the other that:
  - (i) it has the right to enter into this Agreement.
  - (ii) to grant the rights granted in this Agreement and to perform fully all the services and obligations contemplated by this Agreement.
  - (iii) the person entering into this Agreement is authorized to sign this Agreement on behalf of the party.
  - (iv) the parties have reviewed this Agreement with legal counsel to the party's satisfaction or voluntarily waived their right to do so.

#### 9.2 Taft College warrants that:

(i) all information, documentation and verifications supplied to, and all representations made to West Side Health Care District shall be true, accurate and complete and in the event such information, documentation, verifications, or representation(s) made herein

become inaccurate or incomplete, Taft College will promptly notify West Side Health Care District in writing of such occurrence.

- (ii) it shall perform all its obligations under this Agreement incompliance with all applicable law.
- (iii) the students' placed with West Side Health Care District meet all state eligibility requirements including all credential, background, and criminal record admission criteria.
- 10. <u>Independent Contractor</u>. Nothing in this Agreement shall be construed as creating anything other than an independent contractor relationship among Taft College, students, faculty, other employees and agents of Taft College and West Side Health Care District (and any of their employees, contractors, or affiliate entities), nor shall anything be construed as creating an employment relationship, agency, partnership, or joint venture among the parties. Neither among Taft College, its students, faculty, other employees, and agents of Taft College nor West Side Health Care District shall have any obligation, responsibility, or authority to act on behalf of or in the nature of the other, or to bind the other in any manner whatsoever, or to control or direct the methods by which either party performs its responsibilities.
- 11. Confidential Information. In addition to Protected Health Information as defined by HIPAA, during the course of performing this agreement, each party may from time to time receive confidential information about the other including but not limited to information about the party's customers, patients, practices, procedures, strategies, organization, financial and other related information. Neither party shall use or disclose any such confidential information for any purpose other than the limited purpose of performing its obligations under this Agreement, without the prior express written permission of the supplying party. West Side Health Care District's copyrighted materials, confidential information and procedures shall be and remain the sole property of West Side Health Care District. Subject to Taft College's duty to comply with California's Public Records Act, if a party is served with a subpoena or other legal process concerning confidential information of the other party, that party shall immediately (not more than 48 hours after the receipt) notify the supplying party and shall cooperate with it in any lawful effort to contest the legal validity of such process the supplying party may wish to pursue. West Side Health Care District may, from time to time, gain incidental access to confidential information and

records including student record information as defined by 20 USC section 1232g. The parties agree that such incidental access is not a provision or conveyance or disclosure to West Side Health Care District of student record information in violation of section 1232(g) or of any similar state law. West Side Health Care District agrees that if in the performance of its duties it does obtain such access it shall refrain from any removal, use or disclosure to any third person of such information and records and shall take all necessary affirmative steps to maintain the confidentiality, and avoid such removal, use or disclosure, whether intentional or inadvertent, of such records and information.

- 12. <u>Anti-Discrimination</u>. In connection with its activities hereunder, neither party shall violate those federal and State laws which prohibit discrimination, harassment and retaliation based upon race, nationality, ethnicity, gender, sexual orientation, disability, or any other protected classification. Each party shall hold harmless, indemnify, and defend the other against any claim or suit alleging that the indemnitor has unlawfully discriminated or harassed or retaliated against the claimant in violation of federal or State anti-discrimination laws.
- 13. <u>Notices</u>. Any notice required or permitted to be given pursuant to any provisions of this Agreement shall be given in writing, and deposited with the United States Postal Service, postage pre-paid,

registered, or certified mail, return receipt requested, or by a nationally recognized overnight courier service, addressed as follows:

Either party may change the listed addresses with proper written notification.

- 14. <u>Force Majeure</u>. Either party shall be excused for failures and delays in performance of its respective obligations under this Agreement due to any cause beyond its control and without fault, including without limitation, any act of God, war, riot or insurrection, law or regulation, strike, flood, fire, terrorism, explosion, or inability due to any of the aforementioned causes to obtain labor, materials, roadways, or facilities. Nevertheless, each party shall use its best efforts to avoid or remove such causes and to continue performance whenever such causes are removed and shall notify the other party of the problem.
- 15. <u>Legal Fees</u>. In the event either party brings any action for any relief, declaratory or otherwise, arising out of this Agreement, or on account of any breach or default hereof, the prevailing party shall be entitled to receive from the other party reasonable attorneys' fees, costs, and expenses.
- 16. <u>Publicity & IP Provision</u>. Taft College shall not use any trademarks, service marks, visual product representations, trade names, logos or other commercial or product designations of West Side Health Care District or disclose without West Side Health Care District's express prior written consent. Taft College shall not identify or make reference to West Side Health Care District in any communication, advertising, or other promotional modality regardless of its form without explicit prior written consent from West Side Health Care District.
- 17. <u>Assignment</u>. Neither party may assign its rights or obligations under this Agreement to a third party without the prior written consent of the other party, which shall not be unreasonably withheld, and any attempted assignment without such consent shall be null and void. Notwithstanding the above, with reasonable notice to Taft College, West Side Health Care District may assign or subcontract its obligations under this Agreement. This Agreement shall be binding upon and for the sole benefit of the parties hereto and their respective successors and permitted assigns.
- 18. <u>Amendments</u>. Any amendments to this Agreement shall be effective only if in writing and signed by authorized representatives of both parties.

- 19. <u>Severability</u>. If any portion or portions of this Agreement shall be for any reason invalid or unenforceable, the remaining portion(s) shall be valid and enforceable and carried into effect unless to do so would clearly violate the present legal and valid intention of the parties hereto.
- 20. <u>Survival</u>. Any provisions of this Agreement creating obligations extending beyond the term of this Agreement shall survive the expiration or termination of this Agreement, regardless of the reason for such termination.
- 21. <u>Headings</u>. The headings used in this Agreement are for convenience only and do not limit the contents of this Agreement.
- 22. <u>Variations of Pronouns</u>. All pronouns and variations thereof will be deemed to refer to the masculine, feminine, or neuter, singular or plural, as the identity of a person, persons, or entity may require.
- 23. <u>Exhibits</u>. All Exhibits referenced herein are incorporated into this Agreement in their entity. Agreement when used throughout this Agreement shall include all referenced Exhibits.
- 24. <u>Governing Law</u>. This Agreement shall be subject to and governed according to laws of the State of California, regardless of whether either party is or may become a resident of another state. The Parties agree that the venue and jurisdiction shall be exclusively in the state and federal courts located in the County of Kern in the State of California.
- 25. <u>Entire Agreement</u>. This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement and understanding between the parties with respect to the subject matter hereof and supersedes any previous agreements or understandings, whether oral or written.
- 26. <u>Counterparts</u>. This Agreement may be executed in several counterparts, each of which shall be an original, but all of which shall constitute one and the same instrument.

# MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING BETWEEN THE GREENFIELD UNION SCHOOL DISTRICT AND WEST KERN COMMUNITY COLLEGE DISTRICT

## (Early Care, Education and Family Studies Program Field Training Opportunity)

This Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) is made by and between the Greenfield Union School District (GFUSD) and West Kern Community College District (WKCCD). The purpose of this MOU is to support the Taft College (TC) Early Care, Education, and Family Studies Program (TC ECEFS Program). GFUSD will support the TC ECEFS Program by providing to TC ECEFS Program students (Students) a field training opportunity, subject to the availability of qualified GFUSD teachers to mentor Students. The effective date of this MOU is November 8, 2023. GFUSD and WKCCD are the only parties to this MOU.

#### WITNESSETH

#### WHEREAS:

- A. WKCCD operates an approved Child Development program in the Education Pathway at TC, hereinafter referred to as the "TC ECEFS Program."
- B. The TC ECEFS Program offers associate degrees and certificates of achievement in Early Care, Education and Family Studies and its Students become eligible to apply for permits issued by the State of California Commission on Teacher Credentialing that are necessary to work in the early childhood development field. Field training is a required and integral component of the TC ECEFS Program and TC desires to arrange for sites so its Students may complete the field training phase of the TC ECEFS Program.
- C. Field training in the context of the TC ECEFS Program and this MOU means the opportunity to: (i) observe professionals directly engaged in various areas of discipline in public school context; and (ii) directly provide such services in a supervised setting. Field training will provide Students with: (i) opportunities for the development, integration, and reinforcement of required competencies through performance in actual service situations; and (ii) an opportunity to understand and delineate concerns which may arise during the course of the clinical experience for follow up research or training.
- D. GFUSD is a K-8 public school district which offers licensed Early Education Programs at its Greenfield Children's Center and the Prosperity Preschools, as well as Transitional Kindergarten and Kindergarten programs at various school sites.

E. GFUSD staff members, who may mentor Students, are qualified as they possess one or more of the following: (1) Bachelor of Science or Master of Education degree in Early Childhood Education and/or Early Childhood Special Education; (2) Specialist Instruction Credential in Early Childhood Education; (3) Specialist Instruction Credential in Early Childhood Special Education; and/or (4) Child Development Teacher/Master Teacher/Site Supervisor/ Program Director Permit.

- F. The Transitional Kindergarten and Kindergarten program is staffed by individuals who are qualified to mentor Students as they hold one or more of the following: (1) Multiple Subject Credentials; (2) General Kindergarten-Primary credential; (3) General Elementary credential; (4) Standard Early Childhood; or (4) Elementary credential.
- G. GFUSD recognizes that field training is important in the development of school social workers and is authorized to provide such field training pursuant to Education Code section 35160.
- H. GFUSD is willing to accept Students so that they may complete the field training portion of the TC ECEFS Program, subject to the terms and conditions of this MOU.

#### **TERMS**

**NOW THEREFORE**, based on these Recitals, GFUSD agrees to provide WKCCD Students field training in exchange for and in consideration of the promises made and obligations incurred by WKCCD and any other terms or conditions which are set forth below:

#### I. RESPONSIBILITIES OF Greenfield Union School District (GFUSD)

GFUSD teachers will provide Students a classroom setting to observe and/or participate in a way that aligns with the goals and objectives established by the TC ECEFS Program. It is understood that this Agreement is in compliance with the regulations of WKCCD. It is understood that in no circumstance shall Students replace regular GFUSD staff. Students will be assigned to GFUSD early childhood education programs/classrooms (including Preschool/TK/K) as approved by the ECEFS instructor with the approval of the GFUSD Administration. Each assignment requires the advance approval of GFUSD.

A. GFUSD will designate a qualified individual to be physically present and responsible for the classroom setting during each Student's learning experience in the TC ECEFS Program. That person hereinafter will be referred to as the Mentor Teacher. The experience and training of the Mentor Teacher must be mutually agreed upon between the parties.

#### The Mentor Teacher will:

- Communicate a schedule of classroom setting availability to the Students, which is mutually agreeable between GFUSD and the TC ECEFS Program. It is intended for the Students to complete 50 hours of fieldwork per course, per semester as detailed in the TC ECEFS course syllabi.
- 2. Monitor and verify the Students' hours using the Fieldwork Lab Hours Documentation form provided by the TC ECEFS Program.
- 3. Ensure Students are provided with policies regarding pupil records confidentiality.
  - 4. Inform the TC ECEFS course professor of any concerns regarding the behavior, performance, or attendance of the Student(s).
  - B. GFUSD reserves the right to exclude any Student from its premises when in the sole judgment of GFUSD cause exists for doing so.
  - C. GFUSD shall inform the TC ECEFS course professor within three working days if a Student has been excluded from GFUSD site premises.
  - D. GFUSD shall notify the TC ECEFS course professor of the number of available Student placements before the placement begins. The number of available placements shall be that determined by GFUSD in its sole judgment. That number may be zero.

#### II. RESPONSIBILITIES OF WKCCD TC ECEFS PROGRAM

- A. The TC ECEFS Program will withdraw a Student from GFUSD programs or sites if, after consultation with a GFUSD administrator, it is determined that such action is warranted.
- B. The TC ECEFS Program will provide each Student assigned to GFUSD with information about the field training component of the curriculum and the responsibilities of each student participating in field training.
- C. The TC ECEFS Program will provide GFUSD with a description of the TC ECEFS Program requirements, curriculum, and objectives to be achieved by GFUSD.
- D. TC ECEFS Program will require all Students to abide by the TC ECEFS Program and/or GFUSD safety-related requests while completing field training. Students

- shall be expected to conduct themselves in a professional manner, and their attire and appearance shall conform to the accepted standards as set forth in the GFUSD policies.
- E. WKCCD/TC will ensure that each Student is covered by health and professional liability (malpractice) insurance in accordance with the terms listed below.
- F. WKCCD/TC will require each TC ECEFS Student to comply with screening requirements including required immunizations, and tuberculosis testing at the Student's expense.
- G. The TC ECEFS Program shall advise GFUSD administrators of the name of each prospective TC ECEFS Student, his/her level of academic preparation, contact information, and length and dates of proposed field experience/observation.
- H. The TC ECEFS Program shall notify each TC ECEFS Student that they are responsible for:
  - 1. Complying with GFUSD's administrative policies, procedures, rules, and regulations;
  - 2. Arranging their own transportation;
  - 3. Assuming responsibility for their personal illnesses, necessary immunizations, tuberculin tests, and annual health examinations;
- 4. Maintaining the confidentiality of the GFUSD pupil information. Pupil information is strictly confidential and the TC ECEFS Students shall not disclose it to others unless directed to do so by the GFUSD;
- 5. Complying with GFUSD dress/grooming code and wearing name badges identifying themselves as Students;
  - 6. Attending any orientations that may be offered;
  - 7. Notifying the GFUSD site administrator immediately of any violation of state or federal laws;
- 8. Providing services to GFUSD pupils only while under the direct supervision of GFUSD's professional staff; and

- 9. That they are not employees of the GFUSD and are not entitled to be paid by GFUSD nor are they entitled to any benefits typically available to GFUSD employees.
- I. <u>Fingerprinting/DOJ/FBI Clearance</u>. WKCCD shall ensure that each TC ECEFS Student placed with GFUSD shall provide fingerprint impressions for submission to the Department of Justice and the Federal Bureau of Investigation, at the Student's expense, and to obtain clearance before beginning any field training related activity on any GFUSD campus or facility.

#### III. TERMINATION OF INDIVIDUAL TC ECEFS STUDENT PLACEMENTS

- A. GFUSD has the right to immediately terminate the activities of any TC ECEFS Student convicted of any offense for which GFUSD is prohibited from hiring or contracting to employ a person under the California Education Code.
- B. GFUSD has the right to immediately terminate the activities of any TC ECEFS Student who, as a matter of hiring policies or practice, GFUSD would generally not hire due to their criminal background or character flaws.
- C. GFUSD has the right to immediately terminate the activities of any TC ECEFS Student whom GFUSD determines is not performing satisfactorily, refuses to follow GFUSD administrative policies, procedures, rules, and regulations, or violates any federal or state laws.
- D. GFUSD has the right to immediately terminate the activities of any TC ECEFS Student if their professional liability coverage has lapsed.

#### IV. EARLY TERMINATION

Either party may terminate the underlying Agreement for the material breach of any covenant, term, or condition by the other party, its officers, agents, or employees, provided that the breach is not cured within ten (10) business days after written notice thereof is presented to the non-terminating party.

Either party may terminate the underlying Agreement, at any time, without cause after thirty (30) calendar days' notice to the other party.

#### V. INSURANCE

Each party shall maintain in effect during the life of this Agreement for the following policies of insurance:

- A. Professional Liability coverage with limits of One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000) per occurrence and an aggregate of Three Million Dollars (\$3,000,000) from an insurance carrier listed in the current "Best's Key Rating Guide" publication with a "A-VII" rating or better and admitted to do business in California. Coverage shall include Sexual Abuse or Molestation Liability.
- B. General Liability coverage with limits of One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000) per occurrence and an aggregate of Three Million Dollars (\$3,000,000) from an insurance carrier listed in the current "Best's Key Rating Guide" publication with a "A-VII" rating or better and admitted to do business in California.
- C. It should be expressly understood, however, that the coverage required under this Section shall not in any way limit the liability of WKCCD or GFUSD under the indemnity provision of this MOU.
- D. WKCCD AND GFUSD upon execution of this Agreement, each party shall furnish the other with certificates evidencing compliance with these insurance requirements. Certificates shall further provide for thirty (30) days advance written notice to GFUSD or WKCCD, as the case may be, of any cancellation of the above coverage.
- E. Each party's policy(ies) shall contain an endorsement naming the other party (including that party's respective board members, officials, officers, agents, and employees) as an additional insured insofar as this MOU is concerned. The insurance afforded by GFUSD shall be primary in matters alleged to have resulted primarily from actions of GFUSD personnel. The insurance afforded by WKCCD shall be primary in matters alleged to have resulted primarily from actions of WKCCD personnel. In such circumstances, the insurance of the other party shall be secondary and non-contributing.
- F. WKCCD acknowledges that GFUSD is self-insured under California law and that coverage is equivalent to the insurance coverage required above. Agency is a member of a self-insurance pool titled Self-Insured Schools of California (SISC). The Memorandum of Coverage is a matter of public record and accessible through the SISC web site.

#### VI. STUDENT PROCURRED INSURANCE

A. <u>Professional Liability Insurance</u>. WKCCD shall ensure that each Student procures and maintains in force during the term of this MOU, at Student's sole cost and expense, Professional Liability (Errors and Omissions) Insurance for liability arising out of, or in connection with, the field training. Coverage shall include Sexual Abuse or Molestation Liability. Coverage shall be no less than

One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000) per claim and Three Million Dollars (\$3,000,000) aggregate.

Such coverage is to be obtained from a carrier admitted to do insurance business in California and listed in the current "Best's Key Rating Guide" publication with a minimum of an "A-VII" rating and admitted to do business in California. Each party must approve any exception to these requirements.

WKCCD shall require each Student to present evidence of professional liability coverage to GFUSD.

Each Student's professional liability policy shall include both GFUSD and WKCCD as additional insureds.

- B. <u>Health/Medical Coverage</u>. WKCCD shall ensure that each Student procures and maintains in force during the term of this MOU, at Student's sole cost and expense, a health coverage plan and medical coverage for accidental injury.
- C. <u>Automotive Liability</u>. WKCCD shall ensure that each Student who anticipates driving to GFUSD facilities and/or parking their vehicle on school grounds, procures and maintains in force during the term of this MOU, at the Student's sole cost and expense, an insurance policy providing automotive liability coverage.

#### VII. INDEMNIFICATION

Each party hereby agrees to indemnify, defend and hold harmless the other party and the other party's agents, officers, employees, volunteers and authorized representatives from any and all losses, liabilities, costs, expenses, charges, damages, claims, liens, and causes of action, of whatsoever kind or nature (including, but not limited to, reasonable attorneys' fees) which are in any manner directly or indirectly caused, occasioned, or contributed to in whole or in part, through any act, omission, fault, or negligence of the indemnifying party or the indemnifying party's officers, agents, employees, or authorized representatives, which relates in any manner to this Agreement, any work to be performed by the indemnifying party under this Agreement, or any authority delegated to the indemnifying party under this Agreement, unless the same is caused by the sole negligence or willful misconduct of the party indemnified or held harmless. Without limiting the generality of the foregoing, the same shall include injury or death to any person or persons and damage to any property, regardless of where located, including the property of GFUSD.

#### VIII.SURVIVAL OF TERMS

All indemnification and insurance provisions shall survive termination of this Agreement.

#### IX. COMPENSATION

Neither party to this Agreement shall be obligated to pay any monetary compensation to the other. TC ECEFS students will not be compensated for field training hours. WKCCD may provide mentors an incentive to participate.

#### X. TERM

The term of this Agreement shall commence on November 8, 2023, and shall terminate on June 30, 2026, unless sooner terminated in accordance with the terms of this Agreement.

#### XI. NONDISCRIMINATION

GFUSD and the WKCCD agree that neither will discriminate against a beneficiary of services provided by GFUSD in the performance of this Agreement or against any individual on the basis of age, sex, race, color, religious belief, immigration status, national origin, or disability.

#### XII. DRUG-FREE WORKPLACE CERTIFICATION

GFUSD certifies that GFUSD will comply with the requirements of the Drug-Free Workplace Act of 1990 (Government Code, Section 8355 et. seq.) and will provide a drug-free workplace by doing all that Section 8355 et seq. require.

#### XIII. INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR STATUS

The parties hereby acknowledge that they are independent contractors. In no event shall this Agreement be construed as establishing a partnership, joint venture, or similar relationship between the parties hereto, and nothing herein contained shall be construed to authorize either party to act as agent for the other. The GFUSD and the WKCCD shall be liable for their own debts, obligations, acts, and omissions, including the payment of all required withholding, social security, and other taxes or benefits. No TC ECEFS Student shall look to GFUSD for any salaries, insurance, or other benefits.

#### XIV. CONFIDENTIALITY

WKCCD will require Students to maintain the confidentiality of pupil and GFUSD information obtained during the TC ECEFS Program field experience at GFUSD.

#### XV. NON-ASSIGNMENT AND SUB-CONTRACTING

This Agreement shall not be assigned or transferred without the written mutual approval of the parties. This Agreement shall constitute the entire understanding between the parties with respect to the subject matter hereof and supersedes any and all prior understandings and agreements, oral and written relating hereto.

#### XVI. STATUS OF WKCCD/TC ECEFS AND GFUSD

The parties expressly understand and agree that Students are completing field training for educational purposes only and are not considered employees of either GFUSD or WKCCD for any purpose including, but not limited to, compensation for services, welfare, and pension benefits. The activities performed by Students are not performed as employees of GFUSD, but rather in fulfillment of the academic requirements of WKCCD/TC ECEFS Program.

Nothing contained in the underlying Agreement shall be construed to imply a joint venture, partnership, employer-employee, or principal-agent relationship between the parties, and neither party shall have the authority to bind or make any commitment on behalf of the other.

#### XVII.WORKERS' COMPENSATION INSURANCE

Students are not to be considered employees of GFUSD and, therefore, WKCCD shall maintain workers' compensation insurance for Student coverage

#### **XVIII. GOVERNING LAW/VENUE**

The validity, interpretation, and performance of the underlying Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of California. Venue shall be Kern County.

#### XIX. NO THIRD-PARTY BENEFICIARIES

It is expressly understood and agreed that the enforcement of these terms and conditions and all rights of action relating to such enforcement shall be strictly reserved to WKCCD and GFUSD. Nothing contained in the underlying Agreement shall give or allow any claim or right of action whatsoever by any third person including, but not limited to, the individual TC ECEFS Students. It is the express intention of WKCCD and GFUSD that any person or entity, other than WKCCD or GFUSD receiving services or benefits under the Agreement shall be deemed an incidental beneficiary only.

#### XX. SOLE AGREEMENT

The underlying MOU contains the entire agreement between the parties relating to the TC ECEFS. No inducements, representations, or promises have been made, other than those recited in the underlying agreement. No oral promise, modification, change, or inducement shall be effective or given any force or effect.

#### XXI. COUNTERPARTES; FACSIMILE

This MOU may be executed and delivered by facsimile signature and in two or more counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original, but all of which together shall constitute one and the same instrument and, each of which shall be enforceable against the parties actually executing such counterparts, and all of which together shall constitute one instrument.

#### XXII. NOTICES

Any notices required or permitted to be given under this MOU shall be in writing and shall be provided by personal delivery, deposited in the US Mail, or sent by certified or registered mail to the addresses specified below.

#### AGREEMENT FOR LEGAL SERVICES

THIS AGREEMENT is effective July 1, 2023, between the WEST KERN COMMUNITY COLLEGE DISTRICT ("Client") and the law firm of LOZANO SMITH, LLP ("Attorney") (each a "Party" and collectively the "Parties"). Attorney shall provide legal services as requested by Client on the following terms and conditions:

- 1. ENGAGEMENT. Client hires Attorney on an as-requested basis as its legal counsel with respect to matters the Client refers to Attorney. When Client refers a matter to Attorney, Attorney shall confirm availability and ability to perform legal services regarding the matter. After Attorney has completed services for the specific matter referred by Client, then no continuing attorney-client relationship exists until Client requests further services and Attorney accepts a new engagement. If Attorney undertakes to provide legal services to represent Client in such matters, Attorney shall keep Client informed of significant developments and respond to Client's inquiries regarding those matters. Client understands that Attorney cannot guarantee any particular results, including the costs and expenses of representation. Client agrees to be forthcoming with Attorney, to cooperate with Attorney in protecting Client's interests, to keep Attorney fully informed of developments material to Attorney's representation of client, and to abide by this Agreement. Client is hereby advised of the right to seek independent legal advice regarding this Agreement.
- 2. RATES TO BE CHARGED. Client agrees to pay Attorney for services rendered based on the attached rate schedule. Agreements for legal fees on other-than-an-hourly basis may be made by mutual agreement for special projects (including as set forth in future addenda to this Agreement).
- 3. REIMBURSEMENT. Client agrees to reimburse Attorney for actual and necessary expenses and costs incurred in the course of providing legal services to Client, including but not limited to expert, consultant, mediation, arbitration fees and e-discovery service fees. Attorney shall not be required to advance costs on behalf of Client over the amount of \$1,000 unless otherwise agreed to in writing by Attorney. Typical expenses advanced for Client, without prior authorization, include messenger fees, witness fees, expedited delivery charges, travel expenses, court reporter fees and transcript fees. Client authorizes Attorney to retain experts or consultants to perform services.
- 4. MONTHLY INVOICES. Attorney shall send Client a statement for fees and costs incurred every calendar month (the "Statement"). Statements shall set forth the amount, rate and description of services provided. Client shall pay Attorney's Statements within thirty (30) calendar days after receipt. An interest charge of one percent (1%) per month shall be assessed on balances that are more than thirty (30) calendar days past due, not to exceed 10% per annum.
- 5. COMMUNICATIONS BETWEEN ATTORNEY AND CLIENT. The Parties recognize that all legal advice provided by Attorney is protected by the Attorney-Client and Work Product

Privileges. In addition to regular telephone, mail and other common business communication methods, Client hereby authorizes Attorney to use facsimile transmissions, cellular telephone calls and text, unencrypted email, and other electronic transmissions in communicating with Client. Unless otherwise instructed by Client, any such communications may include confidential information.

- 6. POTENTIAL AND ACTUAL CONFLICTS OF INTEREST. If Attorney becomes aware of any potential or actual conflict of interest between Client and one or more other clients represented by Attorney, Attorney will comply with applicable laws and rules of professional conduct.
- 7. INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR. Attorney is an independent contractor and not an employee of Client.

#### 8. TERMINATION.

- a. <u>Termination by Client</u>. Client may discharge Attorney at any time, with or without cause, by written notice to Attorney.
- b. Termination by Mutual Consent or by Attorney. Attorney may terminate its services at any time with Client's consent or for good cause. Good cause exists if (a) Client fails to pay Attorney's Statement within sixty (60) calendar days of its date, (b) Client fails to comply with other terms of this Agreement, including Client's duty to cooperate with Attorney in protecting Client's interests, (c) Client has failed to disclose material facts to Attorney or (d) any other circumstance exists that requires termination of this engagement under the ethical rules applicable to Attorney. Additionally, to the extent allowed by law, Attorney may decline to provide services on new matters or may terminate the Agreement without cause upon written notice to Client if Attorney is not then providing any legal services to Client. Even if this Agreement is not terminated, under paragraph 1 an attorney-client relationship exists only when Attorney is providing legal services to Client.
- c. Following Termination. Upon termination by either Party: (i) Client shall promptly pay all unpaid fees and costs for services provided or costs incurred pursuant to this Agreement up to the date of termination; (ii) unless otherwise required by law or agreed to by the Parties, Attorney will provide no legal services following notice of termination; (iii) Client will cooperate with Attorney in facilitating the orderly transfer of any outstanding matters to new counsel, including promptly signing a substitution of counsel form at Attorney's request; and (iv) Client shall, upon request, be provided the Client's file maintained for the Client by Attorney and shall sign acknowledgment of receipt upon delivery of that file. For all Statements received by Client from Attorney prior to the date of termination, Client's failure to notify Attorney in writing of any disagreement with either the services performed or the charges for those services as shown in the Statement within thirty (30) calendar days of the date of termination shall be deemed Client's acceptance of and agreement with the Statement. For any billing appearing for the first time on a Statement received by Client from Attorney after the date

of termination, failure to notify Attorney in writing of any disagreement with either the services performed or the charges for those services within thirty (30) calendar days from receipt of the Statement shall be deemed to signify Client's acceptance of and agreement with the Statement.

- 9. MAINTENANCE OF INSURANCE. Attorney agrees that, during the term of this Agreement, Attorney shall maintain liability and errors and omissions insurance.
- 10. CONSULTANT SERVICES. Attorney works with professional consultants that provide services, including but not limited to, investigations, public relations, educational consulting, leadership mentoring and development, financial, budgeting, management auditing, board/superintendent/chancellor relations, administrator evaluation and best practices, and intergovernmental relations. Attorney does not share its legal fees with such consultants. Attorney may offer these services to Client upon request.

#### 11. DISPUTE RESOLUTION.

- Mediation. Except as otherwise set forth in this section, Client and Attorney agree to make a good faith effort to settle any dispute or claim that arises under this Agreement through discussions and negotiations and in compliance with applicable law. In the event of a claim or dispute, either Party may request, in writing to the other Party, to refer the dispute to mediation. This request shall be made within thirty (30) calendar days of the action giving rise to the dispute. Upon receipt of a request for mediation, both Parties shall make a good faith effort to select a mediator and complete the mediation process within sixty (60) calendar days. The mediator's fee shall be shared equally between Client and Attorney. Each Party shall bear its own attorney fees and costs. Whenever possible, any mediator selected shall have expertise in the area of the dispute and any selected mediator must be knowledgeable regarding the mediation process. No person shall serve as mediator in any dispute in which that person has any financial or personal interest in the outcome of the mediation. The mediator's recommendation for settlement, if any, is non-binding on the Parties. Mediation pursuant to this provision shall be private and confidential. Only the Parties and their representatives may attend any mediation session. Other persons may attend only with the written permission of both Parties. All persons who attend any mediation session shall be bound by the confidentiality requirements of California Evidence Code section 1115, et seq., and shall sign an agreement to that effect. Completion of mediation shall be a condition precedent to arbitration, unless the other Party refuses to cooperate in the setting of mediation.
- b. <u>Dispute Regarding Fees</u>. Any dispute as to attorney fees and/or costs charged under this Agreement shall to the extent required by law be resolved under the California Mandatory Fee Arbitration Act (Bus. & Prof. Code §§ 6200, et seq.).

The arbitrator's qualifications must meet the criteria set forth above for a mediator, except, in addition, the arbitrator shall be an attorney unless otherwise agreed by the Parties. The arbitrator's fee shall be shared equally by both Parties. Each Party shall bear its own attorney fees and other costs. The arbitrator shall render a written decision and provide it to both Parties. The arbitrator may award any remedy or relief otherwise available in court and the decision shall set forth the reasons for the award. The arbitrator shall not have any authority to amend or modify this agreement. Any arbitration conducted pursuant to this paragraph shall be governed by California Code of Civil Procedure sections 1281, et seq. By signing this Agreement, Client acknowledges that this agreement to arbitrate results in a waiver of Client's right to a court or jury trial for any fee dispute or malpractice claim. This also means that Client is giving up Client's right to discovery and appeal. If Client later refuses to submit to arbitration after agreeing to do so, Client maybe ordered to arbitrate pursuant to the provisions of California law. Client acknowledges that before signing this Agreement and agreeing to binding arbitration, Client is entitled, and has been given a reasonable opportunity, to seek the advice of independent counsel.

- d. <u>Effect of Termination</u>. The terms of this section shall survive the termination of the Agreement.

Should any provision of this Agreement be held by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, void or unenforceable, but the remainder of the Agreement can be enforced without failure of material consideration to any Party, then this Agreement shall not be affected and it shall remain in full force and effect, unless amended or modified by mutual consent of the Parties; provided, however, that if the invalidity or unenforceability of any provision of this Agreement results in a material failure of consideration, then, to the extent allowed by law, the Party adversely affected thereby shall have the right in its sole discretion to terminate this Agreement upon providing written notice of such termination to the other Party.
- 14. NON-WAIVER. None of the provisions of this Agreement shall be considered waived by either Party unless such waiver is specified in writing.

- 15. NO THIRD PARTY RIGHTS. This Agreement shall not create any rights in, or inure to the benefit of, any third party.
- 16. ASSIGNMENT. The terms of this Agreement may not be assigned to any third party. Neither Party may assign any right of recovery under or related to the Agreement to any third party.

Taft Calif. 93268, consisting of [two buildings one is 4800 sq ft in size the other is 900 sq ft in size], in addition to a noncontiguous parcel of land located 809 Blackgold Ct Taft CA 93268 and consisting of [one lot at 15317.61 sq ft] (collectively, the "Premises"). The Premises is depicted on the map attached and incorporated as Exhibit "A."

- 1. This lease agreement ("Lease") shall be for a term of three (2) years beginning on October 31<sup>st</sup> 2023 and ending on October 31, 2025 at the annual rent of \$45600.00 to be paid monthly at \$3,800.00.
- 2. Tenant may use the Premises for any lawful purposes related to its educational programs.
- 3. Landlord may not unreasonably withhold its consent to Tenant subleasing or assigning this Lease.
- 4. Tenant shall pay rent on the first day of each month at Landlord's mailing address. The security deposit is to be paid when the Tenant signs this Lease.
- 5. Tenant agrees: To obey all applicable Federal, State, County and Municipal laws, regulations, rules and ordinances in regards to its occupancy and use of the Premises, and to maintain the Premises in accordance with same as of the date of this Lease. Tenant shall save the Landlord and hold it harmless from any expense, loss or damage to the Premises by reason of Tenant's violation of such laws, regulations, rules and ordinances as of the date of this Lease, or by reason of any damage to the Premises that is sustained by reason of the Tenant's negligence.
- 6. Tenant shall take care that no damage occurs to the buildings or any fixtures upon the Premises as a result of Tenant's use of the Premises, and Tenant shall be liable for all damages to the Premises caused by Tenant or its agents. Tenant agrees to observe all valid rules and regulations of the utility companies and the sewer authority supplying the Premises with electricity, gas, water and use of sewer, and Tenant shall promptly pay bills for the same during the Lease term.
- 7. Tenant shall return the Premises to Landlord upon the termination of this Lease in the same condition as when taken, reasonable wear and tear excepted, and except for improvements remaining with the Premises as described herein.
- 8. Landlord represents and warrants that as of the date of this Lease the Premises is fully compliant with all applicable Federal, State, County and Municipal laws, regulations, rules and ordinances, and that the lease of the Premises to Tenant does not violate the same. Landlord further represents and warrants that as of the date of this Lease the Premises is being used and maintained in accordance with all valid rules and regulations of the utility companies and the sewer authority supplying the Premises

- with electricity, gas, water and use of sewer. Landlord shall be responsible for the transfer of all bills for electricity, gas, water and sewer into Tenant's name as of the date this Lease commences, at which time Tenant's obligation to pay the same shall begin.
- 9. Landlord shall be responsible for capital improvements, repairs, landscaping and maintenance for the Premises including, but not limited to, maintenance, repairs, and replacement as necessary of the HVAC system, electrical wiring, roof, parking area, exterior walls and structural foundation, and plumbing with the exception of plugged drains and toilets.
- 10. If Tenant fails to pay rent when due, or to perform any term of this Lease, after not less than thirty (30) days' written notice of default given to Tenant in the manner set forth in this Lease, Landlord, at Landlord's option, may terminate all rights of Tenant under this Lease, unless Tenant, within the time specified, cures the default. Either Landlord or Tenant may terminate this Lease for any reason after not less than six (6) months' written notice to the other in the manner set forth in this Lease.
- 11. If Tenant defaults, Landlord may elect to: (a) continue the lease in effect, and enforce all Landlord's rights and remedies under this Lease, including the right to recover the rent as it becomes due; or (b) at any time, terminate all of Tenant's rights under this Lease, and recover from Tenant all damages Landlord may incur by reason of the breach of the Lease, including the cost of recovering the Premises and including the worth at the time of the termination or at the time of an award if suit is instituted to enforce this provision, of the amount by which the unpaid rent for the balance of the term exceeds the amount of the rental loss that Tenant proves could be reasonably voided.
- 12. In the event of a partial destruction of the Premises during the Lease term, Landlord shall forthwith repair the same, provided that such repairs are being made within sixty (60) days under existing governmental laws and regulations, but such partial destruction shall not terminate this Lease, except that Tenant shall be entitled to a proportionate reduction of rent while such repairs are being made, based upon the extent to which the making of such repairs shall interfere with the business of Tenant on the Premises. If such repairs of partial destruction cannot be made within said sixty (60) days, or in the event that Landlord fails to make such repairs within sixty (60) days, this Lease may be terminated immediately at the option of either party by written notice. In the event of the total destruction of the Premises, or so much damage as to render the Premises untenable for Tenant's business on the Premises, either party hereto may serve personally, or by registered mail, upon the other party within ten (10) days after such destruction, a thirty (30) day written notice of the intention of such party to terminate this Lease and the term therein provided for and at the end of such thirty days the Tenant shall pay all rent to the date of said destruction and surrender up to the Landlord the Premises and this Lease shall terminate.
- 13. All express covenants made by the Landlord to Tenant in connection with the Premises are contained in this Lease.
- 14. All improvements made by the Tenant to or upon the Premises shall remain on the Premises of the Landlord at the expiration of the Lease if not removed by Tenant. Tenant is expressly allowed to install a ventilation system on the Premises, and agrees

to remove the ventilation system and associated infrastructure upon the termination of this Lease and return the Premises to a condition reasonably similar to its condition prior to the installation of the ventilation system. Other improvements made by Tenant beyond the ventilation system shall remain in place at the end of the lease, unless mutually agreed otherwise.

- 1. District desires to obtain the services of a grant writer especially trained and experienced in rendering the following services: writing government and private grants for the Transition to Independent Living Program. (and as may be more particularly described in paragraph 3 of terms below).
- 2. Independent Contractor is an Independent Contractor especially trained and experienced in providing the services described in recital #1 above.
- 3. The parties have agreed that the Independent Contractor will provide the personal professional services as specified in this Agreement as an Independent Contractor, as available, and not as an employee of the District.

#### **Terms**

NOW, THEREFORE, THE PARTIES AGREE AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. Recitals Approved. The above recitals are true and correct.
- 2. Length of Agreement. Independent Contractor shall provide the services .January 1, 2024-December 31, 2024.
- 3. Services to be Provided. The services to be provided to the District by the Independent Contractor for grant proposals under \$250,000 include but are not necessarily limited to the following:
- a. Complete all documentation required by funding source in time to compete for funds.
- b. Obtain approval for all documentation from the TIL Program Director prior to submission.
- c. Submit all documentation as prescribed by RFP at least one day prior to the due date.
- d. Other tasks as assigned by the District that are needed in order to submit a complete grant application.
  - Grants written in the amount over \$250,000 will be negotiated separately of this agreement.

- 4. **Compensation.** Independent Contractor shall be paid \$95/per hour not to exceed a total of 100 hours.
- 5. Hold Harmless Agreement. Any amounts paid under this Agreement constitute the total compensation for all services rendered by Independent Contractor. The Independent Contractor agrees to pay all Social Security and other income taxes which may accrue by reason of this Agreement, and to indemnify, defend, and hold the District, its officers, agents, and employees harmless from all claims, penalties, damages, liabilities, costs, and expenses including attorney fees, related to Independent Contractor's failure to pay these and similar obligations. Further, since Independent Contractor is acting solely in an Independent Contractor capacity, the Independent Contractor and its staff will not be entitled to and shall not by reason of this Independent Contractor arrangement receive any employee benefits from the District.
- 6. **Monthly Service Report**. Upon request, Independent Contractor shall submit a monthly service report in writing to the District which shall include a diary showing days and service rendered.
- 7. Travel Expenses/Mileage Reimbursement. The District shall not reimburse Independent Contractor for travel expenses/mileage.
- 8. Standards of Ethical Conduct and Confidentiality. Standards of ethical conduct and confidentiality shall be maintained, and Independent Contractor will not engage in inappropriate contacts or professional conflicts of interest.
- 9. **Earlier Termination**. Either Party may terminate this Agreement upon providing 15 days prior written notice of such termination.

# We understand and agree that:

- 1. Survey results for each member college will be posted on the password-protected *CCSSE* online reporting system. The data posted for each member college will include a) institutional characteristics; b) benchmark scores; c) survey means; and d) survey frequencies.
- 2. Membership fees and sampling numbers are based on enrollment data reported through the Integrated Postsecondary Education Data System (IPEDS). In addition, CCCSE uses IPEDS data on certain variables describing college student populations, including student age, race/ethnicity, full-time & part-time enrollment, and the like.
- 3. Neither CCCSE nor any member college or system/state/consortium may make public use of or reference to survey results from any other member college without written permission from the named institution's president/CEO and CCCSE.
- 4. Any member college, system, state, or consortium may use its own survey data for internal and external institutional purposes as deemed responsible and appropriate. CCCSE does not support the use of student engagement survey results for the purpose of ranking community and technical colleges. Such uses would obscure complex dimensions of institutional performance and student behavior.
- 5. The data and resulting institutional reports that are produced from CCCSE surveys are owned by each participating college, and said colleges allow CCCSE to analyze and report the data in aggregate form. CCCSE staff will use survey data in the aggregate for national and sector reporting purposes, for supplemental research of interest to community colleges, and for other undergraduate improvement initiatives.
- 6. Each member college will designate an institutional contact (usually the institutional research officer) who will be responsible for survey operations at the college and will provide assistance with survey administration.
- 7. Membership will not be confirmed by CCCSE until the signed membership form is received.
- 8. CANCELLATION/REFUND POLICY: If the college withdraws at any time after CCCSE ships CCSSE surveys for an in-class administration or the college distributes the online survey access codes for an online administration, there will be a cancellation fee equivalent to 25% of the total base membership fee. If payment has already been made, the college may elect to have the appropriate amount refunded or to have the remaining balance applied as a credit toward future services. If payment has not yet been made at the time of withdrawal, the college will receive an invoice for the appropriate amount, as stipulated in this policy.
- 9. The deadline for completed surveys to be returned to CCCSE is provided on the Survey Administration Timeline. Surveys received after the published deadline will not be included in the national data set or in the college's institutional report of results.
- 10. Fee payment must be received by CCCSE prior to delivery of survey results.

#### **Acknowledgement**

The use of School District facilities shall be determined, in part, based upon availability and priority order. The priority order for usage is as follows:

- 1. School District activities
- 2. Student Body activities
- 3. Other Public Entity activities
- 4. Non-Profit Organization activities
- 5. Community activities
- 6. For-Profit Business activities

Pursuant to the Civic Center Act, the use of school buildings, grounds and equipment shall be granted, when an alternative location is not available, to non-profit organization and clubs or associations organized to promote youth and school activities, including but not limited to: Girl/Boy Scouts, Campfire Girls, Parent-Teacher Associations and School Community Advisory Councils. Such permissive use shall not apply to any group that uses school facilities or grounds for fundraising activities that are not beneficial to youth or public school activities, as determined by the governing board. All other users may be granted use of the facility if the purpose is for public, literary, scientific, recreational, educational or public agency meetings.

FACILITY USERS holding functions or meetings where admission fees are charged or contributions are solicited and the net receipts are not expended for the welfare of the pupils of the School District or for charitable purposes shall be charged by the School District an amount equal to fair rental value of the property.

School facilities, grounds, or equipment shall not be used for any of the following activities:

- 1) Any use by an individual or group for the commission of any crime or any act prohibited by law,
- 2) Any use which is inconsistent with the use of the school facilities for school purposes or which interferes with the regular conduct of school or school work;
- 3) Any use which involves the possession, consumption, or sale of alcoholic beverages or any restricted substances, including tobacco (cf. 3513.3 Tobacco Free Schools). The district may exclude certain school facilities from non-school use for safety or security reasons. The district reserves the right to restrict and/or disallow any and all non-school-sponosred events for any reason allowed by law, statute, or applicable code. Unless otherwise noted, the use of alcohol, tobacco (smoked or smokeless), or any other drug and/or intoxicant not prescribed by a medical doctor to the user is expressly prohibited.

#### Damage and Liability

Groups, organizations, or persons using school facilities, grounds, or equipment shall be solely liable for any property damage caused by the activity. The district may charge the amount necessary to repair the damages and may deny the group further use of school facilities or grounds (Education Code 38134). Any group or organization using school facilities or grounds shall be liable for any injuries resulting from its negligence during the use of district facilities or grounds. The group shall bear the cost of insuring against this risk and defending itself against claims arising from this risk. (Education Code 38134). Groups or organizations shall provide the district with evidence of insurance against claims arising out of the group's own negligence when using school facilities. (Education Code 38134). The applicant organization shall be responsible for the proper surveillance and supervision of all attendees. Adequate adult supervision is required and the adequacy thereof is at the sole discretion of the District.

#### Fire and Safety Regulations

- 1. At no time shall there be more people admitted to the facility or any room thereof, or aboard the equipment utilized, than the legal seating capacity allows.
- 2. No Flammable decorations shall be used unless flame resistant or flame proof in accordance with the State Health and Safety Codes.
- 3. No device that produces flame, spark, smoke or explosion (including fireworks) shall be used on the premises without prior written approval.

#### **Transferability**

Any approved facilities use granted by the District is not transferrable to any other organization, entity or otherwise.

#### **COVID-19 Notice & Requirements**

Consideration and approval for facilities & equipment use requests are contingent upon the submission of a written COVID-19 Safety & Mitigation Plan to the District, as well as upon the California Department of Public Health/CalOSHA guidelines permitting such activities.

# PROGRAM SERVICES AGREEMENT 2023-2024 Mini-Grants Program

The Commission: Kern County Children and Families Commission

Grant Recipient: Taft College Childrens Center

Contract Number: 2023MG.22

#### **RECITALS**

#### **WHEREAS**

- a. The voters of the State of California have enacted the California Children and Families Act of 1998 (hereinafter "The Act"), codified in Health and Safety Code Section 130100 et seg., also known as Proposition 10; and
- b. The Board of Supervisors of Kern County has established, pursuant to The Act and Kern County Ordinance Code 2.100, the Kern County Children and Families Commission; and
- c. Commission desires to retain Grant Recipient to provide the Program services described in this agreement.
- d. Commission is authorized to enter into agreements with third parties for the performance of Program services to The Act and the Kern County Ordinance Code; and
- e. Grant Recipient is able, qualified, and willing to perform services for Commission.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the recitals, which are incorporated into this Agreement by reference, intending to be legally bound, the Parties mutually agree as follows:

#### 1. TERM

This Agreement shall be deemed in force as of December 6, 2023 (the "Effective Date") and shall remain in effect until May 31, 2024, unless sooner terminated as hereinafter provided.

#### 2. PERFORMANCE

Grant Recipient shall provide, to the satisfaction of the Commission, the services described in Attachment A, Application. Grant Recipient agrees to comply with all requirements of the Commission, including policies and procedures now in effect, or yet to be established, for monitoring, reporting, and evaluating Grant Recipient's performance and for payment of Grant Recipient's actual cost of providing the service.

# 3. RESPONSIBILITIES OF COMMISSION

Commission shall have and exercise responsibility for establishing and providing policies and procedures for monitoring, reporting, and evaluating Grant Recipient's performance

and for payment of the Grant Recipient's compensation.

Authorized Commission representatives shall have the right to monitor, assess, and evaluate Grant Recipient's performance pursuant to this Agreement. Said monitoring, assessment, and evaluation may include, but is not limited to, audits, inspections of awardees premises, interviews of staff and participants, and review of all records and documents as the Commission representatives deem appropriate, at any time. Grant Recipient shall cooperate with Commission in the monitoring, assessment, and evaluation process, which includes making any program or administrative staff available during any scheduled process. The monitoring activities will be either announced or unannounced.

### 4. COMPENSATION

Compensation to Grant Recipient shall be based upon actual costs as described in **Attachment A, Application** for providing the services on behalf of Commission in an aggregate amount not to exceed \$2,000.00.

## 5. FUNDING DISBURSEMENT POLICY AND BILLING REQUIREMENTS

The Grant Recipient shall receive funding in accordance with the proposed budget outlined in their grant application. Funding disbursements will be made in advance of the project's end date, subject to the following disbursement schedule:

**Disbursement:** A disbursement of \$2,000.00 shall be provided to the Grant Recipient upon the execution of this contract and the approval of the grant application. Commission will make payment to Grant Recipient within forty-five (45) days of receipt and approval of each execution of the contract.

The grant recipient shall ensure that all expenditures align with the approved budget. Any significant deviations or changes to the budget must be discussed with and approved by the Commission in writing.

Electronic Fund Transfer. All payments by the Commission to the Grant Recipient during the term of this Agreement shall be made via electronic funds transfer ('EFT"). The Grant Recipient shall be required to submit all forms necessary to facilitate EFT, including, but not limited to, the EFT authorization form.

If Commission overpays Grant Recipient for any reason, Grant Recipient agrees to return the amount of such overpayment to Commission, or at Commission's option, permit Commission to offset the amount of such overpayment against future payments owed to Grant Recipient under this Agreement or any other agreement.

#### 6. REPRESENTATIONS

Grant Recipient makes the following representations, which are agreed to be material to and form a part of the inducement for this Agreement:

- a. Grant Recipient has the expertise, support staff and facilities necessary to provide the services described in this Agreement; and
- b. Grant Recipient does not have any actual or potential interests adverse to Commission, nor does Grant Recipient represent a person or firm with an interest adverse to Commission with reference to the subject of this Agreement; and
- c. Grant Recipient shall diligently provide all required services in a timely and professional manner in accordance with the terms and conditions stated in this Agreement.

#### 7. SUPPLEMENTING EXISTING SERVICE LEVELS AND SUPPLANTING OTHER FUNDING

The Parties to this Agreement have read and understand the provisions of Section 30131.4 of the Revenue and Taxation Code relating to the use of the funds collected pursuant to the California Children and Families Act of 1998. Grant Recipient agrees that all funds shall be expended only for the purposes expressed in the California Children and Families Act and shall be used only to supplement existing levels of service and not to fund existing levels of service. Grant Recipient further agrees and guarantees that no funds provided by Commission shall be used to supplant state or local general fund money for any purpose. Any material act of omission or commission causing failure to fully comply with these requirements shall be cause for immediate termination of the Agreement.

# 8. PERFORMANCE STANDARDS

- a. Services to be provided by Grant Recipient shall be evaluated by the Commission. Grant Recipient shall provide to the Commission an annual report of progress. The Grant Recipient shall adhere to the report requirements and due dates set forth.
- b. Grant Recipient shall perform all work hereunder in a manner consistent with the level of competency and standard of care normally observed by a person practicing in the Grant Recipient's profession. Commission has relied upon the professional ability and training of Grant Recipient as a material inducement to enter into this Agreement. Grant Recipient hereby agrees that all its work will be performed and that its operations shall be conducted in accordance with generally accepted and applicable professional practices and standards as well as the requirements of applicable federal, state, and local laws, it is understood that acceptance of the Grant Recipient's work by Commission shall not operate as a waiver or release. During the Scope of Work Term, if Commission determines that any of Grant Recipient's work is not in accordance with such level of competency and standard of care, Commission, in its sole discretion, shall have the right to do any or all of the following: (a) require Grant Recipient to meet with Commission to review the quality of the work and resolve matters of concern; (b) require Grant Recipient to repeat the work at no additional charge until it is satisfactory; (c) terminate this Agreement pursuant to the provisions of contract; or (d) pursue any and all other remedies at law or in equity.
- Commission shall notify Grant Recipient of deficiencies in writing. Said written notification shall provide a detailed description of the deficiency and a procedure to respond or contest the deficiency. Grant Recipient shall have ten (10) working days from receipt of the

deficiency statement to respond in writing to the Commission. Commission or Commission's designee shall have sole discretion in determining whether Grant Recipient's response sufficiently explains any deficiency. Commission may accept Grant Recipient's explanation in full, in part, and/or direct Grant Recipient to take corrective action. Commission shall notify Grant Recipient in writing of Commission's final decision. Responses by Grant Recipients be in accordance with Section 15, Notices. Nothing in this section shall limit or preclude Commission's right to terminate the contract as provided for in Section 9, Termination. Nothing in this Agreement prevents Grant Recipient from seeking judicial review of such a final administrative decision.

#### 9. TERMINATION

Commission may at its election, at any time and without cause ("Termination without Cause"), terminate this Agreement by written notice to Contractor. Said termination shall be deemed effective ten (10) days after personal delivery or fifteen (15) days after mailing by regular U.S. mail, postage prepaid. In the event of Termination with Cause where Grant Recipient failed to substantially perform, the Commission shall, in addition to terminating the Contract, have the right to pursue all remedies in law or equity.

Any provision of this Agreement which is in conflict with current or future applicable federal or state laws is hereby amended to conform to the provisions of those laws. Such amendment of this Agreement shall be effective on the effective date of the laws necessitating it and shall be binding on the parties even though such agreement may not have been reduced to writing and formally agreed upon and executed by the parties.

#### 10. NON-APPROPRIATION

In addition to termination with cause under Section 9, Commission reserves the right to terminate this Agreement in the event insufficient funds are appropriated or budgeted to the Commission from its funding source under the Act (or any other source of funding for the Commission) for this Agreement in any fiscal year. Notwithstanding any other notice provision in this Agreement, Commission shall give Grant Recipient thirty (30) days written notice of the termination. Said termination shall be deemed given ten (10) days after personal delivery or fifteen (15) days after mailing by regular U.S. mail, postage prepaid.

# 11. ASSIGNMENT

Grant Recipient shall not assign or transfer this Agreement or its obligations hereunder or any part thereof. Grant Recipient shall not assign any monies due or which become due to Grant Recipient under this Agreement without the prior written approval of Commission.

#### 12. NEGATION OF PARTNERSHIP

In the performance of the services under this Agreement, Grant Recipient shall be, and acknowledges that Grant Recipient is, in fact and law, an independent Grant Recipient and not an agent or employee of the Commission. Grant Recipient has and retains the right to exercise full supervision and control over the manner and methods of providing services to Commission under this Agreement. Grant Recipient retains full supervision

and control over the employment, direction, compensation, and discharge of all persons assisting Grant Recipient in the provision of services under this Agreement.

### 13. INDEMNIFICATION

Grant Recipient agrees to indemnify, defend and hold harmless Commission and Commission's agents, Commission members, elected and appointed officials and officers, employees, volunteers and authorized representatives from any and all losses, liabilities, charges, damages, claims, liens, causes of action, awards, judgments, costs, and expenses (including, but not limited to, reasonable attorneys' fees of Commission Counsel and counsel retained by Commission, expert fees, costs of staff time, and investigation costs) of whatever kind or nature, which arise out of or are in any way connected with any act or omission of Grant Recipient or Grant Recipient's officers, agents, employees, independent contractors, subcontractors of any tier, or authorized representatives except to the extent caused by the active sole negligence of the Commission, its agents, Commission members, officers, employees, volunteers or authorized representatives. Without limiting the generality of the foregoing, the same shall include injury or death to any person or persons; damage to any property, regardless of where located, including the property of Commission; and any workers' compensation claim, or suit arising from or connected with any services performed pursuant to this Agreement on behalf of Grant Recipient by any person or entity.

In the performance of the services under this Agreement, Grant Recipient shall be, and acknowledges that Grant Recipient is in fact and law, an independent Grant Recipient and not an agent or employee of Commission. Grant Recipient has and retains the right to exercise full supervision and control over the manner and methods of providing services to Commission under this Agreement. Grant Recipient retains full supervision and control over the employment, direction, compensation, and discharge of all persons assisting Grant Recipient in the provision of services under this Agreement. With respect to the Grant Recipient's employees, if any, the Grant Recipient shall be solely responsible for payment of wages, benefits, and other compensation, compliance with all occupational safety, welfare, and civil rights laws, tax withholding, and payment of employment taxes whether federal, state or local, and compliance with any and all other laws regulating employment.

Controversies between the parties with respect to this Agreement, or the rights of either party, or with respect to any transaction contemplated by this Agreement shall be resolved, to the extent possible, by informal meetings and discussions among appropriate representatives of the parties.

# 14. INSURANCE

Contractor, in order to protect Commission and its members, officials, agents, officers, and employees against all claims and liability for death, injury, loss and damage as a result of Grant Recipient's actions in connection with the performance of Grant Recipient's obligations, as required in this Agreement, shall secure and maintain insurance as described below. Grant Recipient shall not perform any work under this Agreement until Grant Recipient has obtained all insurance required under this section and the required certificates of insurance and completed endorsements have been filed with and approved by Commission. Grant Recipient shall pay any deductibles and self-insured retentions under all required insurance policies.

#### Liability Insurance Requirements.

eme	Recipient is obligated to ensure that the specified (marked below) insurance nts remain in full force and effect throughout the entire duration of this it:
a)	Commercial General Liability. Insurance shall have minimum limits for Bodily Injury and Property Damage liability equal to the policy limits, but not less than Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000) each occurrence and One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000) aggregate.
	Insurance required in this subparagraph shall include an endorsement naming the Commission and Commission members, officials, officers, agents and employees as additional insureds for liability arising out of this Agreement and any operations related thereto.
b)	<b>Automobile Liability Insurance.</b> against claims of Personal Injury (including bodily injury and death) with limits for Bodily Injury and Property Damage liability equal to the policy limits, but not less than Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000) each occurrence and One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000) aggregate.
c)	<b>Professional Liability Insurance.</b> (Errors and Omissions), for liability arising out of, or in connection with, the performance of all required services under this Agreement, with limits equal to the policy limits, but not less than Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000) per claimant and One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000) aggregate.
e)	Workers' Compensation Insurance. Grant Recipient shall submit written proof that Grant Recipient is insured against liability for workers' compensation in accordance with the provisions of Section 3700 of the Labor Code.

Prior to Grant Recipient commencing any of its obligations under this Agreement, evidence of insurance in compliance with the requirements above shall be furnished to the Commission by Certificate of Insurance and a copy of the completed endorsement. Receipt of evidence of insurance that does not comply with the above requirements shall not constitute a waiver of the insurance requirements set forth above.

<u>Company Rating.</u> All insurance shall be issued by a company or companies listed in the current "Best's Key Rating Guide" publication with a minimum of an "A- VII" rating or, in special circumstances, be pre-approved by Commission.

<u>Self-Insurance.</u> If Grant Recipient is or becomes, during the term of this Agreement, self-insured or a member of a self-insurance pool, Grant Recipient shall provide coverage equivalent to the insurance coverage and endorsements required above. Commission will not accept such coverage unless the Commission determines in its sole discretion and by written acceptance that the coverage proposed to be provided is equivalent to the above-required coverage.

<u>Relief from Liability.</u> Insurance coverage in the minimum amounts set forth herein shall not be construed to relieve Grant Recipient for any liability, whether within, outside, or in excess of such coverage, and regardless of solvency or insolvency of the insurer that issues the coverage; nor shall it preclude Commission from taking such other actions as are available to it under any other provision of this Agreement or otherwise in law.

### 15. NOTICES

Notices to be given by one Party to the other shall be given in writing by personal delivery, by certified mail, return receipt requested, or express delivery service at the addresses specified below. Notices delivered personally shall be deemed received upon receipt; mailed or expressed notices shall be deemed received four (4) days after deposit. A Party may change the address to which notice is to be given by giving notice as provided above.

Nothing in this Agreement shall be construed to prevent or render ineffective delivery of notices required or permitted under this Agreement by personal service.

#### 16. SPONSORSHIP AND FUNDING ATTRIBUTION

Grant Recipient shall provide public recognition to First 5 Kern in all materials produced for the purpose of public education and outreach regarding the program. Materials shall include, but not be limited to brochures; flyers; television, radio and print ads; online media, public service announcements; presentations; telephone hold messages; and outdoor ads.

#### 17. CONFLICT OF INTEREST

The Parties to this Agreement have read and understand the provisions of Section 1090, et seq. and Section 87100, et seq. of the Government Code relating to the conflict of interest of public officers and employees. Grant Recipient agrees that they are unaware of any financial or economic interest of any public officer or employee of Commission relating to this Agreement. It is further understood and agreed that if such a financial interest does exist at the inception of this Agreement, Commission may immediately terminate this Agreement by giving written notice thereof. Grant Recipient shall comply with the requirements of Government Code Section 87100, et seq. during the term of this Agreement.

To the fullest extent allowed by law, the provisions of this Agreement shall be construed and given effect in a manner that avoids any violation of statute, ordinance, regulation, or law. The parties covenant and agree that in the event that any provision of this Agreement is held by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, void, or unenforceable, the remainder of the provisions hereof shall remain in full force and effect and shall in no way be affected, impaired, or invalidated thereby. Grant Recipient and Commission acknowledge that they have each contributed to the making of this Agreement and that, in the event of a dispute over the interpretation of this Agreement, the language of the Agreement will not be construed against one party in favor of the other. Grant Recipient and Commission acknowledge that they have each had an adequate opportunity to consult with counsel in the negotiation and preparation of this Agreement.

### 18. MODIFICATIONS OF AGREEMENT

This Agreement may be modified in writing only, signed by the Parties in interest at the time of the modification.

#### 19. CHOICE OF LAW AND VENUE

The Parties hereto agree that the provisions of this Agreement will be construed pursuant to the laws of the State of California. This Agreement has been entered into and is to be performed in the County of Kern. Accordingly, the Parties agree that the venue of any action relating to this Agreement shall be in the County of Kern.

# 20. <u>SEVERABILITY</u>

Should any part, term, portion or provision of this Agreement be decided finally to be in conflict with any law of the United States or the State of California, or otherwise be unenforceable or ineffectual, the validity of the remaining parts, terms, portions, or provisions shall be deemed severable and shall not be affected thereby, provided such remaining portions or provisions can be construed in substance to constitute the agreement which the Parties intended to enter into in the first instance.

#### 21. COMPLIANCE WITH LAW

Grant Recipient shall observe and comply with all applicable county, state and federal laws, ordinances, rules, and regulations now in effect or hereafter enacted, each of which are hereby made a part hereof and incorporated herein by this reference as if set forth in full.

# 22. CONFIDENTIALITY

No Party to this Agreement shall, without the written consent of the other Party, communicate confidential information, designated in writing or identified in this Agreement as such to any third Party and shall protect such information from inadvertent disclosure to any third Party in the same manner that they protect their own confidential information, unless such disclosure is required in response to a validly issued subpoena or other process of law. Upon completion of this Agreement, the provisions of this paragraph shall continue to survive.

Both Grant Recipient and Commission shall use safeguards that reasonably and appropriately protect the confidentiality, integrity, and availability of PHI and other confidential data and comply, where applicable, with respect to ePHI, to prevent use or disclosure of the information other than as provided for by this Addendum and the Agreement. Grant Recipient shall maintain a comprehensive written information privacy and security program that includes administrative, technical, and physical safeguards appropriate to the size and complexity of Grant Recipient's operations and the nature and scope of its activities.

### 23. NON-EMPLOYMENT OF CERTAIN PERSONS

During the term of this Agreement, Grant Recipient shall not have in its employ or service any official, officer, employee, volunteer or other authorized or prospective authorized representative (including all persons as described in Health and Safety Code section 1596.871(b)(1)), whose duties are or will be directly connected to the proposed program or activity if that person has been convicted of any sex crime, drug crime, or crime of violence, including all offenses listed in Welfare and Institutions Code section 15660(a), and any other crime against a minor child or any felony theft, fraud or embezzlement.

#### 24. NONDISCRIMINATION

Neither Grant Recipient, nor any officer, agent, employee, servant, or subcontractor of Grant Recipient shall discriminate in the treatment or employment of any individual or groups of individuals on the grounds of race, color, religion, national origin, age or sex, either directly, indirectly or through contractual or other arrangements.

### 25. AUDIT, INSPECTION AND RETENTION OF RECORDS

- a. Grant Recipient agrees to maintain and make available to Commission accurate books and records relative to all its activities under this Agreement. Grant Recipient shall permit Commission to audit, examine and make excerpts and transcripts from such records, and to conduct audits or reviews of all Claims for Payment, materials, records, or personnel or other data related to all other matters covered by this Agreement. Grant Recipient shall maintain such data and records in an accessible location and condition for a period of not less than three (3) years from the date of final payment under this Agreement or until after the conclusion of any audit, whichever occurs last. The State of California and/or any federal agency having an interest in the subject of this Agreement shall have the same rights conferred upon the Commission herein.
- b. Grant Recipient shall keep records that are sufficient to permit the tracing of funds to a level of expenditure adequate to ensure that the funds have not been spent unlawfully. The Grant Recipient's records shall describe and support the use of funds for the agreed-upon program.
- c. The method used by the Grant Recipient to determine costs must conform to Generally Accepted Government Accounting Standards (G.A.G.A.S).

# 26. NON-COLLUSION COVENANT

Grant Recipient represents and agrees that it has in no way entered into any contingent fee arrangement with any firm or person concerning the obtaining of this Agreement with Commission. Grant Recipient has received from Commission no incentive, special payments, or considerations not related to the provision of services under this Agreement.

# 27. NO POLITICAL OR RELIGIOUS ACTIVITY

Commission funds shall be used only for the purposes specified in this agreement and in any attachments hereto. No Commission funds shall be used for any political activity or to further the election or defeat of any candidate for political office. No Commission funds shall be used for purposes of religious worship, instruction, or proselytizing.

# 28. EXECUTION

Bryan Walters, County Counsel

This Agreement is effective upon the date indicated herein above. It is the product of negotiation, and all Parties are equally responsible for authorship of this Agreement. Section 1654 of the California Civil Code shall not apply to the interpretation of this Agreement.

Request for Approval of Agreement with The Chancellor's Office Tax Offset Program (COTOP)

# **Background:**

WKCCD has participated in COTOP for many years as an effective means for recovering outstanding student debts owed to the college, such as enrollment fees, uncollected nonresident tuition, library fines, personal checks written with non-sufficient funds, student loans, financial aid overpayments, and other approved debts.

Under the COTOP program, the Chancellor's Office requests the Franchise Tax Board to offset (deduct) the amount owed to a district from the student/debtor's personal state income tax refund, lottery winnings, or other state refund. The Franchise Tax Board remits any amounts offset to the Chancellor's Office, which then authorizes the State Controller to disburse the offset amount, minus a 25 percent (25%) administrative fee, to the participating local districts.

It is my recommendation that the Board approve the agreement with the Chancellor's Office for continued participation in COTOP.

#### TERMS AND CONDITIONS

#### A. SCOPE OF WORK AND PAYMENT PROVISIONS

#### 1. Scope of Work

The California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office ("Chancellor's Office") agrees to provide Contractor **West Kern Community College District** services to implement and administer the Contractor's participation in the California Franchise Tax Board's (FTB) Interagency Intercept Collection (IIC) Program authorized by Government Code sections 12419.2 *et seq*.

The services to be provided by the Chancellor's Office as well as the Contractor's obligations under this Agreement are more fully described in the Chancellor's Office Tax Offset Program (COTOP), Program Description and Scope of Work, attached to and fully incorporated into this Agreement by reference as Exhibit A-1.

The Parties agree that they will abide by the obligations set forth in this Agreement, including, but not limited to, Exhibit A-1 and any attachments or appendices referenced therein

#### 3. Contractor's Project Director

Contractor's Project Director is responsible for representing Contractor during the term of the Agreement. Contractor shall notify the Chancellor's Office of any change in the Project Director.

# 4. Chancellor's Office Project Monitor

The Project Monitor is responsible for overseeing the project as a whole. All questions or problems relating to the project, including the terms or conditions of this Agreement, should be directed to the Project Monitor. The Chancellor's Office shall notify the Contractor of any change in the Project Monitor.

#### 5. Payments and Invoicing

- a. For services satisfactorily rendered Contractor agrees to compensate the Chancellor's Office in an amount equal to 25% of the amount the Chancellor's Office collects on behalf of Contractor from the FTB through the IIC program, in accordance with Section II.C. of the Chancellor's Office Tax Offset Program (COTOP), Program Description and Scope of Work, attached hereto as Exhibit A-1.
- b. Contractor acknowledges and agrees that the Chancellor's Office may take the payment due under this section in any manner most convenient to the Chancellor's Office, including, but not limited to, direct withholding of the amount due from any offsets collected on the Contractor's behalf.
- c. The parties to this interagency agreement may agree to the advancing of funds as provided in Government Code Sections 11257 through 11263.

#### 6. Travel and Per Diem - Reserved

#### 7. Budget Contingency Clause

- a. In order to avoid program and fiscal delays, it is mutually understood that for the mutual benefit of both parties this Agreement may have been written before ascertaining the availability of state or federal funds.
- b. If a state or federal budget for the current fiscal year and/or any subsequent fiscal years covered by this Agreement does not appropriate sufficient funds for the program, this Agreement shall have no force or effect. In this event, the Chancellor's Office shall have no liability or responsibility to pay any funds whatsoever to Contractor or to furnish any other considerations under this Agreement, and Contractor shall not be obligated to perform any provisions of this Agreement.
- c. If funding for any fiscal year is reduced or deleted by the state or federal budget for purposes of this program, the Chancellor's Office shall have the option to either cancel this Agreement with no liability occurring to the Chancellor's Office, or offer an Agreement Amendment to Contractor to reflect the reduced amount.
- d. Contractor shall inform any subcontractors that any work performed prior to approval of the state or federal budget, as applicable, will be rendered on a voluntary basis, and shall not be compensated unless and until funding is authorized.
- e. This Agreement is subject to any additional restrictions, limitations or conditions enacted in the state or federal budget and/or laws and Executive Orders that may affect the provisions, term, or funding of this Agreement in any manner.

#### **B. GENERAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS**

#### 1. Amendment

No amendment or variation of the terms of this Agreement shall be valid unless made in writing, signed by the parties and approved as required. No oral understanding or agreement not incorporated in this Agreement is binding on any of the parties.

#### 2. Audit

Contractor agrees that the Chancellor's Office, the California State Auditor, or their designated representative shall have the right to review and to copy any records and supporting documentation pertaining to the performance of this Agreement. Contractor agrees to maintain such records for possible audit for a minimum of three (3) years after final payment, unless a longer period of record retention is stipulated.

#### 3. Indemnification

Contractor agrees to indemnify, defend and save harmless the State, the Board of Governors of the California Community Colleges, the Chancellor's Office, its officers, agents and employees from any and all claims and losses accruing or resulting to any and all employees, subcontractors, suppliers, laborers and any other person, firm or corporation furnishing or supplying work, services, materials or supplies in connection with performance of this Agreement, and from any and all claims and losses accruing or resulting to any person, firm or corporation who may be injured or damaged by Contractor in the performance of this Agreement.

The Chancellor's Office will notify Contractor of any such claim in writing and tender the defense thereof within a reasonable time. Contractor will have sole control of the defense of any action on such claim and all negotiations for its settlement or compromise; provided that:

#### TERMS AND CONDITIONS

- a. When substantial principles of government or public law are involved, when litigation might create precedent affecting future Chancellor's Office operations or liability, or when involvement of the Chancellor's Office is otherwise mandated by law, the Chancellor's Office may participate in such action at its own expense with respect to attorneys' fees and costs (but not liability);
- b. The Chancellor's Office will have the right to approve or disapprove any settlement or compromise, which approval will not unreasonably be withheld or delayed; and
- c. The Chancellor's Office will reasonably cooperate in the defense and in any related settlement negotiations.

#### 4. Disputes

In the event of a dispute that cannot be informally resolved, Contractor shall deliver to the Project Monitor a "Notice of Dispute" within ten (10) days of the discovery of the problem. Within ten (10) days of receiving the Notice, the Chancellor, or his or her designee, shall meet with Contractor and the Project Monitor for purposes of resolving the dispute. The decision of the Chancellor, or his or her designee, shall be final. Contractor shall continue with the responsibilities under this Agreement during any dispute.

# 5. Termination

The Chancellor's Office may, at its option, terminate this Agreement at any time upon giving thirty (30) days' advance notice in writing to Contractor in the manner herein specified. In such event, both parties agree to use all reasonable efforts to mitigate their expenses and obligations under this Agreement. In such event, the Chancellor's Office shall pay Contractor for all satisfactory services rendered and expenses incurred prior to such termination which could not by reasonable efforts of Contractor have been avoided, but not in excess of the maximum payable under this Agreement.

#### 6. Executive Order N-6-22 - Russia Sanctions

On March 4, 2022, Governor Gavin Newsom issued Executive Order N-6-22 (the EO) regarding Economic Sanctions against Russia and Russian entities and individuals. "Economic Sanctions" refers to sanctions imposed by the U.S. government in response to Russia's actions in Ukraine, as well as any sanctions imposed under state law. The EO directs state agencies to terminate contracts with, and to refrain from entering any new contracts with, individuals or entities that are determined to be a target of Economic Sanctions. Accordingly, should the State determine Contractor is a target of Economic Sanctions or is conducting prohibited transactions with sanctioned individuals or entities, that shall be grounds for termination of this agreement. The State shall provide Contractor advance written notice of such termination, allowing Contractor at least 30 calendar days to provide a written response. Termination shall be at the sole discretion of the State.

#### 7. Timeliness

Time is of the essence in this Agreement.

# 8. Unenforceable Provision

In the event any provision of this Agreement is unenforceable or held to be unenforceable, then the parties agree that all other provisions of this Agreement have force and effect and shall not be affected thereby.

#### 9. Effective Date

The effective date of this agreement is when it is fully executed by all parties.

# CHANCELLOR'S OFFICE TAX OFFSET PROGRAM PROGRAM DESCRIPTION AND SCOPE OF WORK

#### I. Background

The California Franchise Tax Board (FTB) administers the Interagency Intercept Collection Program (IIC) as authorized by Government Code sections 12419.2 *et seq*. The purpose of the IIC program is to collect funds owed by individuals to government agencies by intercepting amounts owed from state payments such as personal income tax refunds, unclaimed property, or California State Lottery winnings that would otherwise be made to the individuals.

Education Code section 71094 authorizes the Chancellor of the California Community Colleges (hereinafter "the Chancellor") to enter into contracts with community college districts to perform administrative services on their behalf to facilitate their participation in the IIC program, authorized by Government Code section 12419.7, in exchange for a fee.

Pursuant to its authority under Education Code section 71094, the Chancellor has established the Chancellor's Office Tax Offset Program (COTOP) for the purpose of facilitating and administering the IIC on behalf of contracting community college districts (individually referred to herein as "Contractor" or "District").

#### II. General Provisions

- A. The Chancellor agrees to act on behalf of the District by participating in the IIC Program for the purpose of collecting outstanding student financial aid and proper non-financial aid obligations owed to the District.
- B. The Parties' obligations pursuant to this Agreement shall conform with and be undertaken pursuant to Government Code Sections 12419.2, 12419.5, 12419.7, 12419.9, and 12419.10 and related rules, regulations, and/or guidance from the FTB applicable to its IIC Program.
- C. The District agrees to pay to the Chancellor an amount equal to 25 percent (25%) of the amount which the Chancellor collects on behalf of the District from the FTB through the IIC program.
- D. The District acknowledges and agrees that, if a debtor owes an obligation to more than one college or district that participates in COTOP, the Chancellor is authorized to eliminate the name of that debtor from the college(s) or district(s) to which the debtor owes the smaller obligation(s).

#### III. District's Obligations

- A. The District agrees to provide the Chancellor with all information necessary to administer the District's participation in COTOP in the manner the Chancellor, through its designated agent, shall require.
- B. The District agrees to enter its *initial* COTOP debtor data to the Chancellor's Office Tax Offset Program web-based system no later than November 19, 2023. The District may make modifications to accounts (adds/changes/deletes) until November 19, 2023. The District may not make modifications to accounts between November 19 and January 3, 2024. Thereafter, the District may resume making additional modifications (add/changes/deletes) to accounts beginning on January 3, 2024.
- C. The Chancellor will perform only those administrative services necessary to submit and collect student financial aid and proper non-financial aid obligations owed to the District and recoverable through the FTB's IIC program. It is the responsibility of the District to verify that all information submitted to the Chancellor is accurate and up to date.
- D. The District may submit requests for deletions or revisions to its unpaid account balances to the Chancellor at any time and as often as needed, within the parameters of paragraph III.B. above.
- E. The District acknowledges that there may be a delay between its submission of revisions to its unpaid account balances and the entering of such revisions in the FTB's IIC system. The District

agrees that if an offset occurs prior to the entry of the revised information by the FTB, it will be the responsibility of the District to make restitution directly to the debtor as required by paragraph IV.F, below.

F. The District acknowledges and agrees that the Chancellor or the Franchise Tax Board will delete from the current year's COTOP/IIC system all names which cannot be processed by the Chancellor's Office or the Franchise Tax Board in that year.

# IV. District's Specific COTOP Obligations

The District agrees that it shall:

- A. Submit a single record for each debtor as specified in paragraph IV.C, below, in accordance with the format and specifications set forth in Appendices A and B, which are attached hereto and incorporated in their entirety into this Agreement.
- B. Notify those debtors whose names will be submitted for collection through the COTOP program of the District's intent to submit their debt for collection through COTOP no later than 30 days prior to the District's submission of those names to the Chancellor's Office. Such notification shall be sent at a minimum to the debtor's last known address and include notice that the debtor may lodge an objection and request a review of the decision to collect the debt by the offset procedure within 30 days from the date of the notification letter. The District may fulfill its obligation under this paragraph by sending a notice substantially in the form of the sample notification attached as Appendix C.
  - 1. If the debtor requests such a review within the 30-day period, the District may not submit the debt for collection through the COTOP program until it has completed such review, notified the debtor of its determination, and made any adjustments to the debtors account warranted by the review, if any.
  - 2. The District's review of any objections lodged by a debtor shall be afforded a level of due process appropriate under the circumstances and shall, at minimum, comply with the review process described in the sample notification letter attached as Appendix C.
  - 3. The District shall promptly submit to the Chancellor's Office any modifications to the amount or deletions of any record found to be submitted in error, as necessary, as a result of the review. The written notice must be sent at least 30 days prior to Franchise Tax Board receiving the offset request. The District must retain copies of the notifications in the district/college file.
- C. Submit for collection through the COTOP program only the following types of debtor obligations:
  - Defaulted Perkins, Nursing, Emergency and Extended Opportunity Programs and Services (EOPS) loans;
  - 2. Campus financial aid funds; EOPS Grants and Board of Governors Enrollment Fee Waivers for which the student was ineligible;
  - 3. Other financial aid obligations.
  - 4. Proper student non-financial aid obligations, which are limited to: non-resident tuition; enrollment fees; library fines; library replacement material charges; parking fees; parking fines (incurred within 3 years of date submitted for collection only); residence hall rent contracts; cafeteria meal contracts; telephone bills; drop fees (incurred prior to January 1992); personal checks returned for non-sufficient funds (limited to bookstore and other charges listed in this section only); returned check service charges; child care charges; instructional equipment breakage/replacement charges; health fees; transcript fees; foreign student insurance charges;

dental health center charges; community services fees; lost key charges; transportation charges/fees; audit fees; contract class charges; instructional material fees; damage to campus facilities/equipment charges; personal checks written to "Cash" returned for non-sufficient funds (including returned check service fee); auto repair costs (including parts, lab fee, sales tax on parts); student representation fee; student center fee.

- D. Comply with the collections procedure set forth in State Administrative Manual (SAM) section 8776.6 (attached as Appendix D) for debts totaling more than \$25.00. These procedures require the sending of three (3) collection letters to debtors at a minimum of 30-day intervals and providing notification of the District's intent to charge for costs of collection in addition to the amount of the debt owed if payment is not made prior to the initiation of collection procedures through COTOP. For amounts owed less than or equal to \$25.00, the District must send only one collection letter as authorized by SAM section 8776.6. These letters must at minimum be sent to the debtor's last known address and contain the contact information of the responsible District employee.
- E. Refrain from submitting names of any debtors whom the District knows or should know are:
  - 1. Not in default; or
  - 2. In litigation regarding the debt(s) in question; or
  - 3. In bankruptcy proceedings.
- F. Refund to debtors any overpayments or amounts collected in error resulting from collection through COTOP within 30 days from notification of offset by the Chancellor.
- G. Submit for collection only amounts which it is legally entitled to collect through the COTOP program.
- H. Respond to all debtor complaints received by the Chancellor related to the District's participation in this program.
- I. Provide the Chancellor with accurate information to facilitate its participation in the COTOP program, including, but not limited to, the names and/or other identifying information of debtors, information regarding the District's compliance with notification requirements, and amounts owed by debtors. The District further acknowledges and agrees that in administering the COTOP program, the Chancellor is acting in reliance on the accuracy of information supplied by the District.

#### V. Independent Action

The Parties acknowledge and agree that the District and its officers, agents, and employees, while in the performance of this Agreement, shall act in an independent capacity and not as officers, employees or agents of the Chancellor or of the State of California.

#### VI. Term

The term of this contract shall be from October 1, 2023, through December 31, 2024, which as defined by the Franchise Tax Board, is the end of the 2024 interagency program processing year.

## SAM MISCELLANEOUS ACCOUNTING PROCEDURES NONEMPLOYEE ACCOUNTS RECEIVABLE 8776.6 (REV. 434)

(Revised 06/2016)

Each department will develop collection procedures that will assure prompt follow-up on receivables. Departments will use the following procedures and guidelines for the collection of amounts owed to the state from nonemployees. These procedures are in accordance with the Accounts Receivable Management Act as provided in Government Code (GC) sections 16580-16586.

## **Locating Debtor**

When the address of the debtor is unknown, departments will attempt to obtain a current address. Departments may use Internet search engines and/or a data research service. Departments should perform a cost benefit analysis to determine if procuring services to locate debtors would be cost beneficial. Another alternative is to request the debtor's address from the Department of Motor Vehicles by completing a Gov't Agency Request for Driver License/Identification Record Information form, INF 254. For this alternative, the debtor's date of birth or driver's license/identification number is required.

#### **Collection Letters**

Departments are advised to use collection practices that are cost effective and consistent with their program goals and legal authority. Three documented letters should be made to collect on nonemployee delinquent accounts. However, departments have the option of making one documented letter before proceeding to the discharge of accountability process for nonemployee accounts receivable of \$25 and under. This threshold applies to the total amount owed by the debtor, not to each invoice. The Discharge of Accountability section below provides more information regarding this process.

For the collection letter process, the department will send a sequence of three collection letters at a minimum of 30 day intervals. If a reply or payment is not received within 30 days after sending the first letter, the department will send a second letter. This follow-up letter will reference the original request for payment letter and will be stated in a stronger tone. If a response is still not received from the debtor, a third letter will be sent 30 days later. This last letter will include references to prior letters and will state what further actions, including collection fees, may be taken in the collection process.

### **Collection Fee**

GC section <u>16583.1</u> allows departments to charge a reasonable fee, not to exceed the actual costs incurred by the department, to recover the department's collection costs on past due ARs.

If a department plans to recover costs pursuant to this section, departments should consider actual costs incurred, including, but not limited to, staff time to send out collection letters, postage, equipment costs, and contingency fees for private collectors.

Departments will record this fee as revenue, Source Code 162100, Delinquent Receivables – Cost Recoveries.

#### Collection Actions Review

If the three collection letters are unsuccessful, departments will prepare a cost benefit analysis to determine the most efficient and effective collection method by initiating one or more of the following actions:

- 1. Offset Procedures-An offset, is the interception and collection from amounts owed by other state departments to the debtor. For more offset information, see SAM section 8790.
- Court Settlements—There may be instances where it would be cost effective for departments to seek court judgments against debtors. Departments should consider the possibility of filing action in small claims courts. For larger sums, department counsel should be consulted for advice.
- 3. Collection Agencies—Departments may consider contracting with another department that has a collection unit or with an outside collection agency.

The <u>State Contracting Manual</u>, the Public Contract Code section applicable to contracts for services, and GC section <u>19130</u> should be reviewed when a department is considering contracting with a collection agency. Any contract made with a collection agency must specify that all funds collected on behalf of a department will be remitted to that department. The collection agency can then be paid in one of several ways for its services - by a set fee per collection, on an hourly basis, or on a percentage basis, in arrears, based on services rendered.

Prior to assigning the debt to a collection agency, departments are required by law to notify the debtor in writing at the address of record that the alleged AR debt will be turned over for private collection unless the debt is paid or appealed within a specified time period.

Sale of ARs—Departments are authorized to sell ARs to private persons or entities. Departments will record the net income from the sale in their accounting records. Specific accounting entries for the sale of ARs are detailed in SAM section 10536, Standard Entry No. 36.

Prior to selling the debt, departments are required by law to notify the debtor in writing, at the address of record, that the alleged AR debt will be turned over for private collection unless the debt is paid or appealed within a specified time period.

Departments will select the collection actions that are likely to generate the highest net income and do not compromise future state income collections. In addition, departments should consult with the Franchise Tax Board or any other state department that has successfully established an effective AR collection system to develop methods for improving their collection rate.

#### Discharge from Accountability

If all reasonable collection procedures do not result in payment, departments may request discharge from accountability of uncollectable amounts due from private entities. Departments will review their AR, no less than quarterly, to identify receivables for discharge. If departments have identified receivables for discharge, departments will file an Application for Discharge from Accountability form, STD. 27, with the SCO, Division of Accounting and Reporting. Applications for Discharge from Accountability of uncollectable amounts of more than \$10,000 will be filed separately from applications for amounts of \$10,000 or less. The \$10,000 amount applies to the total of all amounts owed by the debtor, not to each invoice. The application for discharge shall include:

- If the discharge from accountability is due to bankruptcy, the supporting documentation must include a copy of the court's final discharge of the debtor and evidence that the specific department is included in the petition for bankruptcy.
- 6. Signature, phone number, printed name, and title of person completing the STD. 27
- 7. Signature, printed name, and title of manager authorizing the STD. 27

The individual authorizing the Application for Discharge from Accountability should be at a level at least equivalent to that of manager of the account office.

For AR amounts of \$500 or less, GC section <u>12438</u> authorizes state departments to refrain from collecting the AR provided that:

- 1. Attempts to collect these ARs are in accordance with SAM section 8776.6
- 2. Departments will discharge only those debts that have been determined uncollectible or it is not cost beneficial to continue pursuing collection
- 3. Departments understand the discharge from accountability does not release the debtor from the debt owed to the state

The \$500 limitation applies to the total of all amounts owed by the debtor, not to each invoice.

The California State Universities must refer to Education Code section <u>89750.5</u> for application limitations.
