TC Childcare Completes CDE In-Depth Review



California Department of Education, Child Development Division conducted state review on the Taft College Children's Center. The Summary of Findings Fiscal Year 2016-2017, 6 Key Dimension for a total of 20 sub- dimensions resulted in the center meeting and exceeding 16 components and 4 needing enhancement. As an agency the Error Rate Percentage was 5%, and 95% Non-Error for total state operational accountability.

*The Teacher's Lesson plans, student assessments and student educational profiles exceeded state requirements.

*The educational classrooms environment in which over 1,700 items were evaluated resulted in the center meeting state requirements.

* Component, "Parents, staff, students and community members participates in developing, implementing and evaluating core and categorical programs," were commended due to Taft College Children's Center ability to provide valuable community services to a rural and remote geographical area that reflects a high need.

As you all can see, the Student Center Project is progressing. We are currently finishing up the overexcavation of the site in preparation to lay underground utilities and import structurally adequate soils. The next steps will be the laying of underground utilities, final grading, and concrete foundations.

The Gym Reroofing project is on its second phase. This project consists of work to reroof the existing upper gym roof and portions of the lower roof. Work commenced on February 27 and is near completion. This project is funded by the California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office Scheduled Maintenance Funds.
