

## **Facility and Campus Improvements**

2018-19 Projects Continue to Improve Efficiency, Safety and Quality of Campus Life

**Solar:** As many of you are aware, we are proceeding with a solar project with ForeFront Power that will result in immediate and long term operational cost savings by reducing power purchases from PG&E. The solar arrays will be installed in the main parking lot over the summer. Portions of the parking lot may be inaccessible throughout the course of this project.

<u>Deferred Maintenance</u>: Through our 2018-19 Deferred Maintenance funding, we were able to finish upgrading the door hardware in the G Buildings to electronic keycard access. This project has been complete and the electronic access is functional.

Prop 39 Energy Efficiency Upgrade: Through the use of Prop 39 funding we completed energy efficient lighting retrofits to the Library, Administration, Science, Tech Arts, and G-Buildings. These projects were the final projects allowed under the Prop 39 five year funding plan.

<u>S-4</u>: Despite how it looks from the outside, we have <u>not</u> installed missiles on the roof of the Science Building. Those pillars are the exhaust ducting for the new fume hoods installed in S-4 for the laboratory conversion project.

Baseball and Softball Scoreboards: The project for installation of new scoreboards for the baseball and softball fields is complete. Both signs are up and functional and are a great improvement to our athletic program. GO COUGARS!!!

Gym Doors and Electronic Card Access: We are beginning a project to replace the main doors to the Taft College gymnasium and install electronic keycard access. This project should improve the looks and security of the gym. We expect completion of this project before the end of the fiscal year.

**Gym Storage Building:** This was a project to replace the old rundown athletic storage building. This project is near complete.
