New State Funding Formula Announced

Since the release of the Governor's Proposed Budget in January, discussions have been ongoing at the State and Local levels regarding the proposed new funding formula. The proposed new funding formula includes student success indicators, student need indicators, and enrollment. As to the Taft College budget, preliminary revenue assumptions have been determined and the District is beginning to work on the 2018-2019 budget development. Per the approved budget development calendar, a preliminary WKCCD will be brought to the Board of Trustees in June 2018.
