Dr. David Cothrun Taft College Superintendent/President 1980-2001

With profound sadness, Taft College announces the passing of Dr. David Cothrun, Taft College Superintendent/ President from 1980-2001. Dr. Cothrun's important contributions can still be felt widely on the Taft College campus. He expanded the Taft College Child Development Center, was instrumental in creating the Westside Energy Services and Training Education Center (WESTEC) in 1983, established the Taft College Dental Hygiene Program in 1993, and created the nationally-recognized Transition to Independent Living Program (TIL) in 1995. As a 35-year Rotarian, he always offered a helping hand to anyone in need. He will surely be missed.

Korea's Next Academy Attends Exploratory Meeting

On December 4, TIL Director Aaron Markovits met with visitors from Korea's Next Academy and toured them around the Taft College campus. They also visited briefly with Superintendent/ President Dr. Deb Daniels. 10 years ago, 10 Next Academy staff were trained by the TIL Program to work with college students with disabilities. Next Academy may again transact with Taft College to provide training to current Korean staff who work with students with disabilities. They also want training for staff who work with traditional students who may seek work visas in high demand fields.

TAFT COLLEGE FINANCIALS MEET THE HIGHEST STANDARDS

At their regularly scheduled meeting on December 11, the Taft College Board of Trustees approved the District's 2018-19 Annual Financial Audit and Proposition 39 Measure A Audit reports. The audits were performed by independent auditors from CWDL Certified Public Accountants, who issued the highest opinion of the District's financials with an "Unmodified" report with no findings or questioned costs. CWDL Certified Public Accountants further issued an "Unmodified" Measure A audit report with no findings, confirming that the expenditures were consistent with the requirements of the bond as approved by the voters.

Taft College Superintendent/President Dr.
Debra S. Daniels said "As West Kern Community
College District, we are charged with exercising
good stewardship of public funds entrusted
to us by ensuring that our tax dollars are spent
appropriately and effectively towards the
mission of the college. These unmodified audit
reports show that Taft College's financials meet
the highest standards, and it is our honor to
hold the public's trust by remaining fiscally
responsible while meeting the educational
needs of our community."
