"Your circumstances don't define you. Make a change and stand up."

Desirae Salas characterizes her childhood as one of survival. Raised by a single mother since Desirae was a year old, she recalls only eating peanut butter often. When her mother's employment stabilized, and their lives had improved, Desirae's 16-year-old sister died in a car crash. The trauma of this loss caused Desirae and her mother to spiral backwards. Pregnant at 24, Desirae became a single mother to her son. Now married with two children, she and her husband provide a stable life for their family. At Taft College, Desirae serves as 2021-22 ASO Student Trustee and is grateful to have the right mentors guiding her to where she needs to be.

Faith Angeles is lucky to be alive. Faith did not plan to attend college, but after recovering from a bad accident and being denied entry into the U.S. Navy due to physical concerns, she enrolled at Taft College. In her first year, the pandemic hit and forced all classes online. But, she stuck with her studies. In her second year, her outlook improved when instruction shifted to a hybrid model of in person and online. She decided to run for ASO President and was surprised by her win! She credits ASO for providing her with a family and home away from home. Energized by a purpose, she and the other ASO Board Officers work together to make transparent decisions that directly impact fellow students. She tells others to find people who feel like family for support. Faith has proudly earned her confidence and found her voice.

Waleed is certain that Taft College has changed his life for the better. At Taft College in 2018, Madalyn Hutchison established the Stanley and Madalyn Hutchison Engineering Promise in memory of Stanley Hutchison, her husband of 38 years. Created to honor Stanley's dedicated work ethic, the scholarship is meant to help students, especially veterans, in the Taft College Engineering Program, designed to be equivalent to the first two years of a baccalaureate degree in engineering. Each scholarship is a renewable award, created to fill students' funding gaps. These funds allow students to transfer out debt-free into an Engineering Discipline in the CSU, UC, or other system where they can fulfill all requirements to earn their desired B.S. degree.

Distinguished Alumnus: Don Zumbro

Inducted into the first Taft College Hall of Fame Class in 2015, Don Zumbro had served as Taft College Dean of Student Services for 20 years, been a member of the Rotary Club of Taft for 35 years, and joined the Taft College Foundation Board where he became its Vice President. Don excelled in both academics and athletics at Taft College, graduating in 1954. After graduation, he transferred to the University of the Pacific. He began his teaching career in Taft at Roosevelt School in 1956. He moved to Lincoln Junior High School where he ultimately held the position of Principal for 10 years. Don made an indelible mark as Taft College Dean of Student Services, leading with fairness, compassion, toughness, and integrity. He always expected best efforts from students, faculty, and staff. He still does!



West Kern Community College District operates under a conservative budgeting model that supports fiscal responsibility while providing a strong financial commitment to the college's teaching and learning foci. For fiscal year 2021, the college again received an unmodified audit opinion from its external auditing firm. This confirms the accuracy, professional competence, and transparency exhibited by the college's financial reporting. The college's financial position continues to remain strong. The charts on this page reflect the actual results of the college for the general operating funds, which consist of the **Unrestricted General** Fund and the Restricted General Fund.
