The Taft College Athletic Department is dedicated to helping our student athletes achieve success both academically and athletically. Taft College is a member of the Central Valley Conference and participates in the





Spotlight

Since its launch as a grant -funded summer program in 2014, the Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics (STEM) summer program has developed as a pipeline among local elementary to



high school students for preparation toward highwage careers. Faculty and staff work collaboratively to coordinate these summer camps for the purpose of igniting that spark of curiosity in young minds for STEM education at Taft College.

These summer camps epitomize Taft College's longstanding commitment to local students and the community. As such, Taft College faculty and staff deliver educationally-enriching activities – helping young students learn the wonders of botany, the intricacies of building solar cars

and 3-D printers, and the satisfaction of seeing their efforts pay off in the solar car race while admiring their 3-D designs.

Beginning in 2019, the STEM camps underwent a name change, STEM-CiTE ("Stem-city") to represent the range of careers in STEM fields and Careers in Technical Education (CiTE). 2019 saw not only a change in the name of the camps but also an upsurge in students. While 191 students in total have completed the program since 2014, 83 of them participated this



summer. Taft College continues to innovate its summer camps by adding more opportunities for young STEM-CiTE participants each year. STEM-CiTE camps benefit from the support of local schools, community, industry partners, and the Taft College Foundation.
